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Internet Browser Information

There are many browsers available to use when accessing the internet. It is important to use a compatible browser when entering or retrieving information from the MIHP application in MILogin.

Currently:

- Microsoft Edge is the preferred browser.
- Google Chrome is also supported.
- Apple Safari absolutely **will not** work.
- Microsoft Internet Explorer and Mozilla Firefox are unreliable.
- Open-source browsers (Chromium, Basilisk, Brave, etc.) are not compatible with the application.

For best performance, MIHP recommends using Microsoft Edge or Google Chrome.

Bereavement Training Course Now Available

The *Bereavement Training for Maternal and Child Health Professionals* is designed to support healthcare professionals and support workers who have experienced a patient death. Individuals who complete the course will learn how to better identify the types of grief, factors affecting the grief response, self-care strategies, and where to find additional support.

How to Take the Course

1. Go to [My Courses - \(mihealth.org\)](https://mihealth.org).
2. At the login screen, enter your User ID and password and click Go.
 1. First time users will need to click the Create New User button. On the *Select an Organization* screen, select Public and leave the Access Code field blank. Click continue and complete the *Create New User*
3. Once logged in, locate the course you want to take (in either the Course Catalog or My Courses tab) and click the Launch Course icon to the left of the course name. To find the grief and bereavement course, search for the title: *Bereavement Training for Maternal and Child Health Professionals*.

The following continuing education is awarded for successful completion of this course: 1.0 Nursing contact hour, 1.0 Social Work clock hour, and 1.0 Health Educator contact hour.

DC:0-5 Training for Michigan Professionals

The Michigan Association for Infant Mental Health (MI-AIMH) is pleased to announce that we have partnered with the Michigan Department of Health & Human Services to provide DC:0-5 virtual trainings in Michigan again this year. Upcoming training dates, information and are below.

DC:0-5 Training Description

This virtual comprehensive training on DC:0- 5™ Diagnostic Classification of Mental Health and Developmental Disorders of Infancy and Early Childhood targets clinicians and leaders from fields of mental health, health and early intervention. This training provides history and background around the need and development of a specialized diagnostic classification system for infancy and early childhood, approaches in diagnosis from an Infant/Early Childhood Mental Health perspective which is developmentally informed, relationship based, contextual and culturally competent. Participants will learn about the multi-axial approach to diagnosis as well understanding the contents of each axis including Axis I clinical disorders.

Suggested Participants: ONLY Michigan clinicians from the fields of early childhood mental health, health and early intervention who are responsible for diagnosis or participate in diagnostic treatment teams. Mental health professionals in the public CMHP system including those in access/intake roles, as well as private practitioners are especially encouraged to attend. This training is only open to individuals working in Michigan. We are not able to train individuals outside of Michigan.
