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## Quality Corner: Changes in Cycle 8

*This is the fifth in a series of articles describing the changes that have been made to Cycle 8 Certification.*

Section 6 of Cycle 8 Certification measures compliance with communication, care management, and professional visit requirements. As with section 5, the main difference between Cycle 8 and previous certification cycles is the emphasis or focus on compliance with certain requirements.

### **6.4: Professional Visit Progress Note(PVPN):**

The requirements for indicator 6.4 focus on the accuracy of the following:

- At least one of the following is addressed at every visit:
  - *Plan of Care* risk domain interventions
  - Issues identified by the beneficiary
  - Issues identified through professional judgement of the provider
- Beneficiary/caregiver's response to the intervention(s) is documented
- Beneficiary/caregiver's feedback regarding the visit is documented
- Documentation illustrates that visits last a minimum of 30 minutes
- Reason for community visit is documented, when applicable

All of the requirements in this indicator were measured in Cycle 7 but located among different indicators. All other elements of the *PVPN* are reviewed but documented and measured in indicator 5.10.

The following six indicators were reviewed in previous cycles as components of an indicator. In Cycle 8, it is the only focus in each of the indicators. The exception is 6.8, the *Action Plan*. In Cycle 7 the *Action Plan* was required for each beneficiary but was included in the certification tool for information gathering only and was not cited.

**6.5:** All risk domains for each beneficiary are addressed prior to discharge, or there is documentation on the *Contact Log* as to why not.

**6.6:** High risk domains are addressed within the first three visits, or there is documentation on the *PVPN* or *Contact Log* as to why not.

**6.7:** Safety plan intervention is present under the required circumstances, or there is documentation on the *Contact Log* as to why not.

**6.8:** At least one *Action Plan* is developed during the course of care, or there is documentation on the *Contact Log* as to why not.

**6.11:** Home Visitor provides a referral for beneficiary whose *POC2* includes the Stress/Depression domain, or there is documentation on the *Contact Log* as to why not.

**6.12:** Home Visitor provides a referral or RD provides nutrition counseling for a beneficiary whose *POC 2* includes high risk on Food/Nutrition domain, or there is documentation on the *Contact Log* as to why not.

**6.13:** Portions of two indicators assessing required documentation in the chart of a substance exposed infant were combined into one indicator for Cycle 8. The documentation required for this indicator is:

- The substance exposed Plan of Care domain is added to the *POC2* as soon as the risk was identified.
- Substance Exposed Infant interventions are implemented at every visit after 18.

The substance exposed billing assessment included in previous certification cycles has been removed from the Cycle 8 compliance review.

**6.16 and 6.17:** The developmental screening, Bright Futures/ASQ-3 and ASQ: SE-2, are two separate indicators in Cycle 8. Both indicators are measuring that age-appropriate screenings were done, and follow-up conducted in accordance with the Operations Guide.

**NOTE--ASQ-2 Timeframe:**

Beneficiaries enrolled prior to June 1, 2020:

- ASQ-3 conducted at the first professional visit after the infant is two months of age.

Beneficiaries enrolled on or after June 1, 2020:

- ASQ-3 conducted at the first professional visit after the infant is one month of age.

Indicators 6.2, 6.3, and 6.5 are scored 90%-100% = Met; 0%-89% = Not Met

Indicator 6.10 is scored 100% = Met; 0%-99% = Not Met

All other indicators in section 6 are scored 90%-100% = Met; 70-89% = Partially Met; 0%-69% = Not Met
