## "Hear Her" Campaign Resources



The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) *Hear Her* campaign has made additional resources available. The *Hear Her* campaign seeks to raise awareness of potentially life-threatening warning signs during and after pregnancy and improve communication between patients and their healthcare providers.

A [one-page poster](#) that visually represents the 15 urgent maternal warning signs, developed by the [Council on Patient Safety in Women's Health Care](#), is now available in multiple languages. This 8.5" x 11" poster of signs or symptoms that could indicate a potentially life-threatening situation is intended for pregnant people or people who were pregnant within the last year.

### *Conversation Guide Palm Cards*

Two 5" x 7" [palm cards](#) have been translated into the same languages as the poster. These can be used as conversation guides for pregnant and postpartum people, their families and friends, and healthcare providers.
