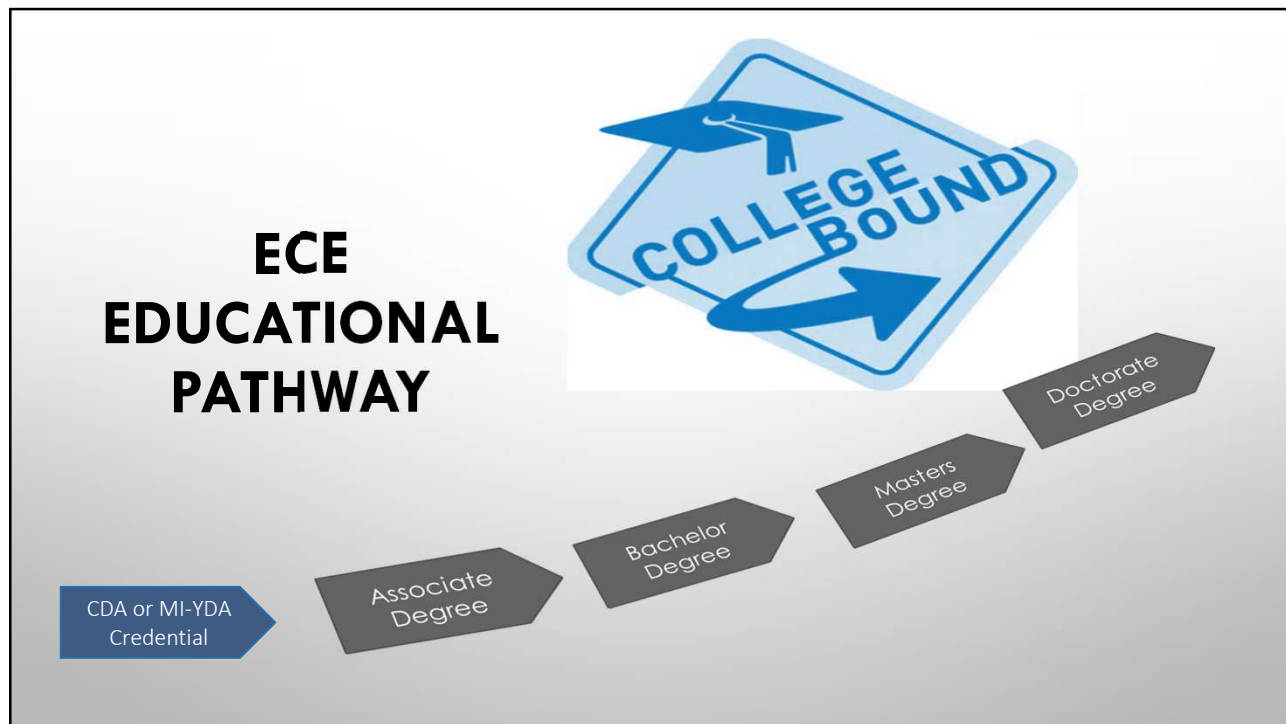

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**Scholarship
Types**

- There are two basic types of scholarships offered by the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood Scholarship.
 - Sponsored scholarships: A partnership between the employer, the scholarship recipient and T.E.A.C.H.
 - Stipend scholarships: A partnership between T.E.A.C.H. and the scholarship recipient.

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- T.E.A.C.H. responsible for 80% of the costs of tuition and fees, plus books for a maximum of 6 credits each semester on scholarship, recipient and employer each responsible for 10% each semester.
 - T.E.A.C.H. provides a \$100 student access stipend to recipient and a quality level stipend to the recipient and employer if the employer is participating in the Great State to Quality (GSQ) levels at Reflecting on Quality or higher (AA=\$200, BA=\$300) each semester
 - Recipient agrees to stay at sponsoring center for 1-year after annual contract completion.
 - Bonus to recipient from T.E.A.C.H. after annual contract completion (\$300 for Associates and \$400 for Bachelor's)
 - Bonus or raise to recipient from employer after annual contract completion (\$375 bonus or 2% raise)
 - Employer provides release time to employees working over 30 hours/week
 - 3 hours/week maximum, maximum of 16 weeks available per semester
 - Employer gets paid/credited when paperwork is processed
 - \$11/hour reimbursement rate
 - 3 hours per week x \$11/hr \$33 X 16 weeks = \$528

Sponsored Scholarship- T.E.A.C.H.

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- EMPLOYERS UNABLE TO SPONSOR RECIPIENT DUE TO EXISTING EMPLOYMENT POLICY THAT WOULD PROHIBIT THEM FROM FULFILLING ANY PORTION OF THE CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS (TUITION ASSISTANCE, BONUS/RAISE, RELEASE TIME)
- ASSOCIATE'S STIPEND = \$250/CREDIT (MAXIMUM \$1500/SEMESTER)
- BACHELOR'S STIPEND = \$500/CREDIT (MAXIMUM \$3000/SEMESTER)
- MASTER'S STIPEND=\$700/CREDIT (MAXIMUM \$4200/SEMESTER)
- GSQ STIPEND (IF APPLICABLE): AA=\$200/SEMESTER, BA & MA=\$300/SEMESTER
- NO STUDENT ACCESS STIPEND, RELEASE TIME, BONUS/RAISE, OR BOOK REIMBURSEMENT
- SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENT AGREES TO STAY IN THE FIELD OF EARLY CHILDHOOD FOR 1 YEAR FOLLOWING THE COMPLETION OF A SCHOLARSHIP CONTRACT

STIPEND SCHOLARSHIP OPTION

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- WORKING AT LEAST 20 HOURS PER WEEK IN A LICENSED PROGRAM MEET THE FOLLOWING INCOME ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- EARN NO MORE THAN \$19.60/HOUR IF PURSUING A CDA, MI-YDA, ASSOCIATE DEGREE, OR BACHELOR'S DEGREE COURSEWORK

T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Michigan scholarship support is available to staff of licensed child care programs on an approved License Variance for Lead Caregiver or Director Qualifications.

Scholarship Benefits:
Approved recipients of the License Variance Scholarship will receive a stipend-based scholarship of \$250/credit hour. Recipients of this scholarship must complete a minimum of 6 Early Childhood Education credit hours at an approved, T.E.A.C.H. participating community college in Michigan during the scholarship contract period. Employer verification is required, but no employer contribution is required to participate in this scholarship model.

Recipients of the License Variance Scholarship may elect to continue pursuing coursework leading to an early childhood credential or degree upon completion of the License Variance Scholarship requirements by utilizing a regular T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Michigan scholarship.

Eligibility:
Applicants must be working in a licensed program a minimum of 20 hours per week and earning no more than \$19.60/hour. Applicants must submit proof of an approved license variance by uploading a copy of the approved Child Care Variance Request Form from the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, Child Care Licensing Bureau.

Scholarships Available

Building Foundations: Take an approved 3-4 credit course in early childhood education. Can be used for Infant/Toddler as well as Administrator Course.

CDA Training: Complete CDA training requirements for college credit.

CDA Assessment: Receive financial assistance to complete the CDA Credential assessment process.

MI-YDA Assessment: Receive financial assistance to complete the Michigan Youth Development Associate Credential assessment process.

Associate Degree: Complete coursework toward an Associates degree in early childhood education or child development.

Bachelor's Degree: Complete coursework toward a Bachelor's degree in early childhood education, child development or a birth-kindergarten teaching endorsement.

Master's Degree: Complete coursework toward a Master's degree in early childhood education, child development, or a birth-kindergarten teaching endorsement.

Eligibility Requirements

Work a minimum of 20 hours/week in a licensed child care center, group home, or registered family home, or in an eligible workforce support position (Master's only).


Meet income eligibility requirements by earning \$19.60 or less per hour pursuing a CDA, MI-YDA, Associates or Bachelor's Degree. Earn \$65,000 or less annually pursuing a Master's Degree.

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


CDA Scholarship




- T.E.A.C.H. will help pay for the CDA Assessment or CDA Renewal by paying 85% of the fee to the Council for Professional Recognition.
- CDA Assessment fee = \$425
- CDA Renewal fee (every 3 years) = \$125
- Upon obtaining credential, T.E.A.C.H. will award a \$200 bonus to recipient, and a \$50 bonus upon renewal.
- Recipient has 6-month commitment to remain in ECE field upon completion.

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MI-YDA Scholarship

- T.E.A.C.H. will help pay for the MI-YDA Assessment by reimbursing the recipient 85% of the MI-YDA assessment fee. <https://www.mi-yda.org/?q=CredentialProgram>
- MI-YDA Assessment fee = \$299
- Upon obtaining credential, T.E.A.C.H. will award a \$200 bonus to recipient.
- Recipient has 6-month commitment to remain in the ECE or the OST field upon completion.
