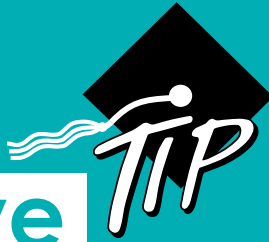


Tuition Incentive PROGRAM



How does TIP make college affordable?

The Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) encourages students to graduate high school by providing significant grant funding for college tuition and a portion of mandatory fees. Participating colleges are listed on the back of this flyer. Full program details can be found at michigan.gov/mistudentaid.

Have you ever enrolled in Medicaid?

You may be eligible for TIP if you enrolled in Medicaid for at least 24 months within a 36 month period between ages nine and high school graduation.

How do I check my eligibility?

There are two ways to check eligibility:

1. Online with the MiSSG Student Portal at michigan.gov/missg.
2. Over the phone with our Customer Care Center at 1-888-447-2687.

How do I maximize my TIP award?

Enroll in either a 1-year certificate or a 2-year associate degree program. Total Phase I benefits cannot exceed 80 semester or 120 term credit hours.

Are there any additional program requirements?

Yes, students must also:

- Earn a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent prior to age 20.
- Submit a FAFSA.
- Be a Michigan resident.
- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or approved refugee.
- Enroll at least half-time at a participating Michigan institution.
- Begin using TIP at a participating institution within four years of high school completion.

Current and future awards are subject to available and approved funding.

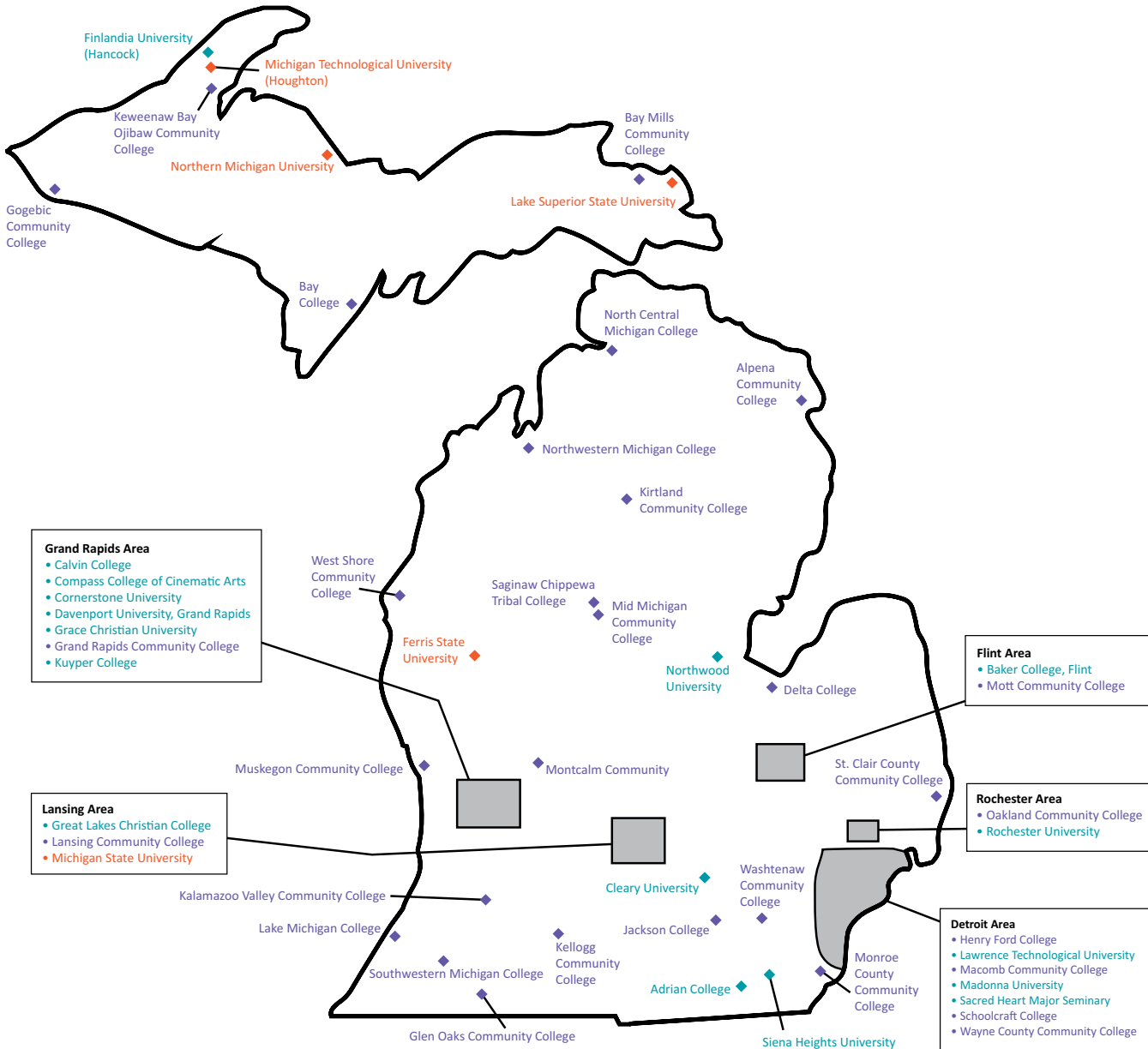
TIP Phase I College Options Map

Institutions are eligible for TIP Phase I funding; however, they may have limited associate and certificate degree programs. Be sure to work with the institutions to ensure your program of interest is offered and will accept Phase I benefits.

Public Community Colleges: TIP Phase I covers the cost of tuition at the standard in-district rate. For eligible students not residing in a community college district, the out-of-district rate may be authorized.

Public Universities: TIP Phase I covers the cost of tuition at the lower-level resident rate.

Private Colleges and Universities: TIP Phase I covers the average community college tuition rate (determined annually) at participating degree-granting, non-profit private, independent colleges and federal tribally-controlled colleges. Subject to change annually.



If you plan to continue on with a 4-year bachelor's degree program, there is additional Tuition Incentive Program (TIP) assistance up to \$500 per semester in the junior and senior year; maximum \$2,000.

To be eligible, a student must:

- Be enrolled in a bachelor's degree program at a participating Michigan institution.
- Have a certificate, associate degree, or 56 transferable semester credits
