

Michigan Tuition Grant

Fact Sheet for Academic Year 2022-23



Description

Provides need-based renewable scholarships for undergraduate students attending eligible private or independent degree-granting, non-profit institutions.

Application

To apply for MTG, a student must file a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To check the status of an application, the student can log into the MiSSG Student Portal at www.michigan.gov/missg.

MTG Application Deadline

The deadline for Academic Year 2022-23 is March 1, 2022.

Eligibility

To be eligible for an award, a student must:

- File a FAFSA prior to the MTG application deadline.
- Demonstrate financial need.
- Be enrolled in at least six credit hours at a participating institution.
 - ◆ All participating institutions are listed on the last page of this Fact Sheet.
 - ◆ Cannot be enrolled in a course of study leading to a degree in theology, divinity, or religious education.
- Possess a high school diploma or its recognized equivalent.
- Be a Michigan resident since July 1 of the previous calendar year.
 - ◆ If a dependent student, parent must also be a Michigan resident since July 1 of the previous calendar year.
- Be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or approved refugee.
- Not be incarcerated.
- Be an undergraduate student.
- Not be in default on a Federal student loan.
- For renewal, meet institution's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) policy.

Program Limits

Awards are restricted to tuition and mandatory fees and pay up to a maximum of \$3,000 for the academic year at participating institutions. It is the responsibility of the college financial aid office to coordinate all sources of aid for which a student may be eligible. Other gift aid may reduce or cancel this award.

Institutions are limited to receiving \$5.0 million of MTG payments per academic year and are responsible for identifying which of their eligible students may be awarded MTG.

Program eligibility ends when a student has exhausted their check counts.*

Current and future awards are subject to available and approved funding.

*Check count is the method used to monitor MTG usage. Each student will have a starting pool of 60 check count and may not receive another MTG award once this pool is exhausted.
