



## Lay of the Land – June 24, 2024

#### MEAP Bill Package

- · SB 353 (Klinefelt)
  - Expands MEAP eligibility
  - Eliminates crisis season expenditure restriction
- · SBs 879 (Singh), 880 (Singh), 881 (Outman)
  - Step up LIEAF surcharge to \$2.00 over 4 years
  - LIEAF rollover
  - Expanded reporting and emphasis on statewide fund access
  - Eliminates opt out

# Case No. U-21637: Exploring opportunities to improve the Rate Case Process

- On May 23, the Commission issued an order, <u>Case No. U-21637</u> initiating this investigation to examine how the experiences of litigating and deciding rate cases can be improved, streamlined, or simplified. The order seeks comment on a variety of process issues.
- Initial comments are due by 5:00 PM on July 23, 2024. Reply comments are due by 5:00 PM on August 23, 2024.





### Case No. U-21638: **Exploring opportunities to improve Commission Accessibility**

- On May 23, 2024, the Commission issued an order in Case No. U-21638 seeking comment on opportunities to expand public engagement in its decision-making processes.
  - Improvements it may make for communicating with the public
  - Explaining Commission activities,
  - Expanding accessibility and participation,
  - Enhancing the transparency of its proceedings.
  - Improving participation of:
    - Low-income residential customers,
    - Residential customers that experience high energy burdens,
    - Individuals and communities impacted by commission decisions.

- The Commission encourages commentors to consider issues raised in the MI Power Grid Customer Education and Participation Staff Report (pages 38 – 48) surrounding the challenges of public engagement at utility regulatory commissions.
- A public hearing will be held later this summer to take public comment regarding the issues raised in this docket.
- Comments must be received by 5:00 PM on September 27, 2024
- Reply comments must be received by 5:00 PM October 25, 2024.



# Case No. U-21567: Energy Waste Reduction Standards and Plans

- On February 8, 2024, the Commission initiated <u>Case</u>
  No. U-21567 to begin implementation work related to the new Energy Waste Reduction law.
- Comments due July 17, 2024.
- Reply comments due August 9, 2024

# U-21547: Renewable Energy and Energy Storage Facility Siting

- PA 233 of 2023 provides siting authority to the Commission for utility-scale wind, solar, and energy storage facilities under specified conditions. The MPSC has engagement sessions scheduled that are open to the public to gather input on the implementation of PA 233.
- On February 8, 2024, the Commission issued an Order in Case No. U-21547.
- The Order directs Staff to file recommendations on application filing instructions, guidance relating to compatible renewable energy ordinances, and other recommendations by June 21, 2024.
- Comment period until July 17, 2024.
- Reply comments until August 9, 2024.

## U-21571: Statewide Storage Target


- On February 8, 2024, the Commission initiated <u>Case No. U-21571</u> to undertake the work required to develop the storage targets and provide guidance on the required annual storage reports.
- Staff filed its straw proposal methodology for determining a utility or alternative electric supplier's proportional share of the statewide minimum energy storage target in the docket for Case No. U-21571 on May 31, 2024.
- Interested persons may provide feedback on the straw proposal by filing comments on the docket for Case No. U-21571 by 5:00 p.m. on August 1, 2024.
