

Revised Definition

CLIMBING HIGHER

Affordability – consider whether and how to include the following:

- 1. Consent or agreement to price or cost
- 2. "Reasonable" pricing
- 3. Payment predictability
- 4. Ability to pay bills today or over time, month after month
- 5. Ability to pay bills without use of savings or credit
- 6. Ability to pay on time

ARE WE THERE YET?

Household - How do we define or narrow the concept of household - lowincome households? Vulnerable households? Elderly, disable, small children in the home? What households are we referring to, targeting, or including in our Clean energy—How scope? do concepts of clean

definition?



Reliance - How do we define reliance as it relates to public assistance? - Is one time assistance included in the concept of reliance? At what point is a household considered reliant? The first time they require assistance due to a crisis? Once they have received assistance twice in one year, in two years? Our working definition refers to minimizing reliance on public assistance.

MEETING 6

REACHING OUR DESTINATION

Public Assistance – What constitutes public assistance for this purpose? Do we include or exclude things like social security disability, food benefits, child-care assistance, etc. Are we only referring to energy assistance programs? If so, do we include low-income rates? LIHEAP, MEAP, other sources of assistance such as EFSP? What about private sources like United Way or church contributions?
