Steps in the Rulemaking Process

Stakeholder input

The Commission Staff drafts the rules

Submission of the Request for Rulemaking to the Office of Regulatory Reinvention and the Legislative Service Bureau (ORR/LSB) Request for Rulemaking (RFR) approved

Submission of the draft rules to ORR/LSB

Rules informally approved

Submission of the Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) and Cost/Benefit Analysis (CBA) to ORR/LSB

► RIS/CBA approved

Issuance of first MPSC order inviting comment and setting public hearing – published in 3 newspapers of general circulation (Grand Rapids, Marquette, and Detroit) and in the Michigan Register Public hearing and receipt of written comments

Analysis of comments and possible revisions

Issuance of second MPSC order addressing the comments and finalizing the rules

Submission of the Report to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR Report) and final rules to ORR/LSB

► Final rule approval received

- Countdown of 15 session days (or other possibilities)
- Issuance of third MPSC order formally adopting the rules and forwarding them to the Secretary of State, and they are published on the MPSC website

Rules are filed with the Office of the Great Seal (OGS)

Final rules effective immediately (7 days after filing) unless otherwise noted in the rules.
