911 Training Subcommittee

- This year, there was an important change: If a telecommunicator failed to meet their training requirements for designation, their hours were excluded in the calculation for training funds on the PSAPs training fund application.
- The 2026 Training Application Review resulted in approval of 1,923 full time equivalent telecommunicators statewide.

- Currently collecting PSAP data for the annual legislative report compiled by the State 911 Office

Michigan's NG911 Update

What's happening?

- Michigan has been talking about NG911 which uses advanced mapping to route emergency calls more accurately since 2012. We are finally HERE.

When will this happen?

- The goal is to have in place by September 2026

Key Steps

- Phase I (by March 31, 2026) All 911 calls will be delivered over SIP (Session Initiated Protocol)
- Phase II (by Sept 2026) Caller location will come directly from the State GIS Repository

What needs to happen first?

- Every county must update their road centerlines and address points in the GIS Repository. If your data has not been refreshed in 6 months, please update it!
- Every county has to have their information uploaded into GIS repository for our state to move forward with NG911. Your information matters.

- Review Plan annually
- Report on goals and objectives
 - **Objective 5:**
 - Coordinate with Emergency Management and Interoperability groups
 - Include PSAPs in the planning, testing, training, exercises, and evaluations
 - Increase cross participation and collaboration within the SNC, subcommittees, and workgroups
 - **Objective 6:**
 - Partner with local, regional, state, federal, and tribal agencies
 - Ensure inclusion in initiatives impacting the 911 ecosystem
 - Contribute to a more effective and efficient emergency communications ecosystem
