- Purpose and Activities
 - Reaching out to unsheltered households
 - Connecting unsheltered households to critical services
 - Providing urgent, non-facility-based care to unsheltered households
- Considerations for Street Outreach
 - Partner efforts with health services
 - Support documentation needs for chronic homelessness, PSH
 - Close collaboration with Coordinated Entry System

Section V: Street Outreach

- Eligible Costs
 - Engagement
 - Locate, identify, and build relationships
 - Provide immediate support, intervention, and connection
 - Case Management
 - Assess housing and service needs
 - Arrange, coordinate, and monitor the delivery of services
 - Transportation
 - Travel for provision of services, both staff and participants
 - Services for Special Populations
 - Provision of specific, additional services for homeless youth, victim services, HIV/AIDS services

Section VI: Emergency Shelter

Purpose and Activities

- Providing essential services to homeless families and individuals in emergency shelters

Considerations for Emergency Shelter

- Braid funding to cover services
- Review policy (“house rules”) for Equal Access and low barrier
- Partner efforts with health services
- Close collaboration with Coordinated Entry System

Section VI: Emergency Shelter

Eligible Costs: Essential Services

- Case Management
 - Assess, arrange, coordinate, and monitor delivery of services
- Child Care
 - Provision of child care if not already available through the emergency shelter
- Education Services
 - Consumer & health education, substance use prevention, literacy, ESL, & GED
- Employment Assistance and Job Training
- Transportation
 - Travel for provision of services, both staff and participants
- Services for Special Populations
 - Provision of specific, additional services for homeless youth, victim services, HIV/AIDS services

Section VI: Emergency Shelter

Eligible Costs: Operations

- Maintenance
- Rent
- Security
- Fuel
- Food for shelter guests
- Furnishings
- Equipment
- Insurance
- Utilities
- Supplies
