b. A projected result of the NEP funded projects is decreased stress and anxiety surrounding home repairs/improvements for West Willow homeowners.	The indicators of this result involve feedback and input from participating homeowners.	These indicators were measured through Habitat's Pre and Post program meetings with homeowner participants of the Roof Replacement and Exterior Improvement Program.	In our findings, homeowners who participated in the roof replacement and exterior improvement program indicated an increased sense of safety in their homes.  Additionally, each homeowner articulated a decrease in concern or anxiety about their ability to afford necessary repairs on their home. In post-project meetings, homeowners also noted that they were more confident and assured in the quality of the work completed. This speaks directly to the trusted partnership that has been built between Habitat and the West Willow community. A final theme throughout homeowner feedback is an increased sense pride in the appearance of their respective homes following exterior improvements and roof replacements.	The results of this project also provided some important information about the limiting factors for homeowners to make home repairs even with critical safety needs. For example, for more than one of our participating homeowners had safety concerns (i.e. overgrown backyard, leaking roof near kitchen light, large hole in backyard) that were resolved through the roof replacement and exterior improvements. It is anticipated that the assessed property value of each of the homes in this program will increase, also potentially affording the homeowner more financial stability.

c. A longer term result of this funding will be the improved housing value and stability in the West Willow neighborhood as a result of roof replacements and exterior home improvements.

An indicator of this result is the visible investment from both Habitat for Humanity of Huron Valley and MSHDA in the West Willow neighborhood.

Indicators of this result were measured through a number of strategies including:

- windshield surveys
- feedback from neighborhood residents (both program participants and other residents)
- number of additional residents showing interest in applying for similar program in response to program visibility including new roofs, lawn signs, exterior improvement volunteer days, etc.

the curb appeal for each of the participating homes, and in some cases portions of the same block, were noticeable and observed following roof replacement and exterior improvements. The visibility of this program's results has also prompted further interest in improving public spaces in the neighborhood. For example, after repairing a portion of a fence alongside a neighborhood biking/walking path as part of a home's exterior improvement day, potential opportunities for funding projects that will improve

The investments made through this program will allow for an increased tax base for the West Willow community. Additionally, participating residents are expected to see an increase in their assessed property value.

There was an overwhelming response from residents expressing interest in participating in this program. This serves as a reminder of the significant need beyond what we were able to serve with this funding. Similarly, with an increased interest in Habitat programs through the visibility of this program will allow for further programming and investment through different programs going forward.

Finally, this program allowed for a better understanding of the consistent needs throughout the neighborhood requiring additional funding and different program design.
