Legislative Action

There continues to be no new movement within the Legislature, so the subcommittee has not met. During this down time, the subcommittee always encourages local leaders to reach out to their representatives, inviting them in for tours and discussions of topics affecting you locally. Building these relationships, having them come in and see the center, and learning about the requirements that need to be met may help when we are requesting additional funding for 911. Education is key when it comes to the Legislature.

911 Training

For our directors and/or training coordinators, it is our hope you have started your 2023 911 Training Fund Application within MiSNAP. For the DTS 101W (employee worksheet), you may begin adding individuals who have left your agency during the year, including their separation date.

The DTS 510 can be started and kept up to date throughout the year. Starting early will help with the process of verifying all training records and expenditures are entered at the end of the year. This in turn assists with some of the application process burden. As a reminder, to qualify for 2023 training funds you will need to spend down all 2020 and prior distribution year funds. If you have any funds from 2018 and prior, those will need to be returned by **December 31, 2022**; you must send an email to <u>SNCdispatchertraining@michigan.gov</u> to request an invoice.

As a reminder for any agency that has a grandfathered employee, their continuing education requirement was due **December 13, 2022**. If you have any questions or concerns regarding the training standards, please email <u>SNCdispatchertraining@michigan.gov</u> for assistance.

Certification

Members of the Certification Subcommittee created an annual report workgroup to work on improving the online annual reporting process for 2023. We took feedback received from the users to see how we can improve the form, collect the most data to produce in other reports, and have the least amount of burden on the local agencies supplying the data.

As part of this improvement to the report, we want to inform you there will be an additional question on the annual report form next year in connection with the FCC 911 diversion issues previously discussed.

If yes, are all the public safety radios, networks, equipment, or related infrastructure on which funds were obligated or expended used to deliver 911 originated information to emergency responders? If yes, please itemize the amounts that were obligated or expended and include descriptions of the public safety radios, networks, equipment, or related infrastructure.

Thin Gold Line Foundation

The Thin Gold Line Foundation is a 501c3 non-profit organization. They started in 2019 in Maryland with Kathy Lott, in honor of her husband, Jason. The Thin Gold Line Foundation aims to raise awareness of mental health in the emergency telecommunications field. They provide "baskets" to emergency communications centers, books on mental health and coping skills, and dispatcher swag as a thank you. Initially, they supplied many counties in southern Maryland and since moving to Michigan in 2020, they have been able to supply these baskets to losco, Alcona, and Arenac Counties central dispatch centers, as well as Rochester, NY and Uvalde, TX.

Kathy started this organization in honor of Jason who was a police dispatcher for over 18 years in a very busy county just outside of Washington, DC. Over these years, he took every call imaginable – from good, to the worst, including the death of a police officer in the line of duty, on his channel. Jason began to get sick in 2015. After years of misdiagnosis, he was finally accurately diagnosed – with PTSD, anxiety, and depression. Treatments ensued... and they struggled with the wrong courses of treatment before finally getting the right help from the right people. During these years of illness, misdiagnosis, and improper treatment, he was unable to work and was eventually fired, almost losing their home. After Jason received the proper care and was getting back on track, Kathy vowed to try and raise awareness to the public, emergency dispatchers, and employers so this would not happen to another family.

The Thin Gold Line Foundation's goal is to bring awareness to the struggles and reality of mental health issues 911 call takers and emergency dispatchers may encounter during their careers. And to provide resources and coping skills to those who need it most – our first, first responders...one communication center and one community at a time. They will often reach out to centers on their own, so if you hear from them, please welcome them to show their support for your centers!

988 Information

As all of you should be aware, 988 is the new 3-digit number for the suicide hotline. This went live across the nation in July 2022; however, there was a request to do a soft launch with no advertising. Beginning January 2023, we will be able to promote the use of the 3-digit number. The <u>Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration</u> (SAMHSA) has put together a 911 Partner Toolkit on their website that includes some social media shareables. As the 988/911 workgroup continue our collaboration, and more material is available, it will be distributed to the local agencies.

We are working on a 10-digit number for the call centers and back up call centers in the state of Michigan in case there is a problem with the 988 hotline. Once this information is available, we will add it to the resources section within MiSNAP so each PSAP has access to
