**Welcome**

(Judge Tabbey) called the meeting to order. Board members and public attendees introduced themselves.

**Last Meeting Minutes Approval**

**Legislative Update: Sgt. Travis Fletcher**

HB 6475 – VECHS:

- Allows MSP/CJIC the authority, through SOM, to continue providing criminal history background checks for vulnerable populations including students, elderly, etc.
- Rep. Graham Filler will reintroduce in the next session.

Sgt. Fletcher reported there has been no movement on any CJIS-related bill since the July meeting.

**Bipartisan Safer Communities Act: Mr. Kevin Collins**

Mr. Collins presented to the Board on the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (BSCA). Public Law 117-159 was signed into law June 25, 2022. Funding was provided to states for various programs related to school safety and mental health services and to implement Extreme Risk Protection Orders. The BSCA allows federally licensed firearms dealers (FFLs) to conduct NICS checks on employees and employment applicants, allows FFLs access to the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) stolen gun file, and adds protections for victims of domestic violence by adding “dating relationship” as a qualified relationship.

CJIC has advised all the Mi-Pistol users of the new dating relationship, effective immediately. For purchasers under 21, there will be an enhanced review process:

- Automatic three business-day delay.
- NICS will conduct outreach to law enforcement and family/juvenile/probate courts to establish “cause.”
- If NICS is able establish “cause,” will delay purchase up to ten business days in total to research and make an eligibility determination.
- Law enforcement method of contact is through the administrative message in LEIN.

Open discussions were held. Board had several questions about the process that were not able to be answered due to the limited information obtained from NICS.

The Board will continue to monitor these efforts.
