

**COURT-APPROVED NOTICE OF FINAL JUDGMENT
IN LAWSUIT CHALLENGING MICHIGAN'S PRE-2021
SEX OFFENDERS REGISTRATION ACT (SORA)**

Does #1-6 v. Snyder, Case No. 1:16-cv-13137 (class action)

The Court ordered the Michigan State Police (MSP) to distribute this notice to the head of each law enforcement agency in the State of Michigan designated to receive or enter sex offender registration information for distribution to all law enforcement personnel who handle SORA enforcement matters. This notice does not constitute legal advice. The MSP cannot provide law enforcement agencies with legal advice about this notice.

To: All Law Enforcement Agencies in the State of Michigan Tasked with Enforcing SORA

On August 26, 2021, the federal district court entered an amended final judgment in the case of *Does II v. Snyder*. This case was a class action lawsuit challenging the constitutionality and enforcement of provisions of the old version of SORA (the old SORA) as it existed before the recent amendments to SORA that became effective on March 24, 2021. See 2020 PA 295. This correspondence is being sent to all law enforcement agencies in the State of Michigan tasked with enforcement of SORA as required by the judgment.

Pursuant to the Court's orders, we ask that you prominently display the attached *Does II* Agency Notice (Exhibit 1), separately in English and Spanish, in a location where it can be seen by SORA registrants for no less than one year.

In addition, please find attached a court-approved one-page summary of limitations on enforcement of the old SORA (Exhibit 2), as well as a court-ordered letter sent to all county prosecutors in the State of Michigan that summarizes the Court's decision (Exhibit 3).
