History and Overview

WHAT IS THE AUTOMOBILE THEFT PREVENTION AUTHORITY?

In the mid-1980s, Michigan had the highest motor vehicle theft rate in the nation. Members of the Michigan Anti-Car Theft (ACT) Campaign Committee developed a concept that would combine the efforts of law enforcement, communities, and businesses against motor vehicle theft.

In 1986, Michigan's Governor and the Legislature decided to try the ACT committee's idea. So began one of Michigan's most effective weapons against the crime of motor vehicle theft, the Automobile Theft Prevention Authority (ATPA).

The ATPA was established with a sunset provision that automatically abolished the program unless it was renewed by the Legislature. The purpose of the sunset provision was to ensure that the program, created as an experiment in law enforcement, was doing its job as intended.

In 1992, the Governor and Legislature agreed the ATPA should become a permanent state authority, housed under the auspices of the Michigan State Police (MSP). The legislation was overwhelmingly passed in both the House and Senate.

HOW IT WORKS:

The ATPA is funded by an annual \$1 assessment on each insured motor vehicle, plus interest earned by investing those funds. Prior to 2017, assessments were collected only on private passenger vehicles; commercial motor vehicle assessments were added in 2017.


It is overseen by a seven-member board of directors appointed by the Governor, which includes representatives of law enforcement, automobile insurers, and consumers of motor vehicle insurance.

Each fiscal year, the board reviews grant applications that have been submitted by law enforcement entities, prosecutor's offices, and non-profit organizations. The board approves grant funding for one or more of the following purposes, all of which are associated with combating auto theft: investigating, apprehending, prosecuting, and deterring.

Finally, the ATPA board members and staff are involved in long-range planning. Regular meetings provide updated goals and objectives for fighting motor vehicle theft.

IMPACT ON MOTORISTS:

The return on investment (ROI) of ATPA funds for FY 2021 was \$9.02 for every \$1 spent. In FY 2020 the ROI was \$6.43 and in FY 2019 it was \$7.13.





ATPA Teams Motor Vehicle Theft Data


Motor vehicle thefts have declined nationwide as newer vehicles utilize high-tech anti-theft devices making vehicles more difficult to steal. Anti-theft devices include smart keys containing computer chips required to start the vehicle, kill switches, and devices that disable starters. Due to these trends, carjacking, stolen wheels and tires, and fraud cases have been on the rise. Simultaneously, motor vehicle theft arrest rates have also declined, while the recovery value of stolen vehicles has increased.



ATPA Success Stories

SCAR

Southwest Michigan

Two Michigan officers honored with the American Rental Association and National Equipment Register

D/Tpr. Nicholas Peters and D/Sgt. James Dietz began an investigation after recovering a mini excavator in April 2020. A two-month long investigation led to the recovery of more than 20 pieces of rental equipment totaling over \$700,000 in value. The equipment had been stolen from rental companies across the Midwest. The main suspect was arrested and charged with Operating a Chop Shop and several counts of Receiving and Concealing stolen equipment. D/Sergeant Dietz and D/Trooper Peters received information of a subject attempting to fraudulently rent heavy equipment from an American Rental Association (ARA) member in April 2020. A National Equipment Register Alert was sent out and detectives were contacted by other ARA members who had contact with the same subject. D/Trooper Peters and D/Sergeant Dietz were able to set up a sting operation at one of the ARA businesses and were able to catch the individual red handed. This investigation also led to the recovery of stolen rental equipment from Kentucky. The individual was later charged with conducting a Criminal Enterprise. D/Trooper Peters and D/Sergeant Dietz received a tip in January 2021 regarding a company building seawalls on the lake Michigan shoreline. They discovered the company had rented several large vibratory hammers and excavators and defaulted on the monthly rental fees. The

suspect was actively moving the equipment to different job sites in order to continue to use the equipment. D/Sergeant Dietz and D/Trooper Peters recovered two vibratory hammers and a bulldozer with a combined value over \$300,000. The machines were returned to the rental company in St. Louis, Missouri. In 2020 and 2021, D/Trooper Peters and D/Sergeant Dietz conducted several additional rental theft investigations involving ARA member companies. These investigations resulted in several felony arrests and D/Trooper Peters and D/Sergeant additional recoveries. Dietz have also been proactive in assisting ARA member companies by providing information and strategies to help prevent the theft of their assets. In December 2020, D/Sergeant Dietz and D/Trooper Peters were invited to speak at the winter conference for the ARA of Michigan to "Fight Rental Theft." The detectives covered topics related to preventing fraudulent rentals.



SEATT

Southeast Michigan

SEATT received information that a 2020 Dodge Charger had been stolen from an Ann Arbor dealership. The vehicle was reported as being equipped with LOJACK, so SEATT detectives began working with LOJACK via the dealership and tracked the vehicle to a garage in Inkster. A search warrant was executed which resulted in the recovery of the Charger from the garage. A search of the premises also resulted in the recovery of a stolen 2021 Dodge Charger Hellcat hidden behind a privacy fence which had been stolen from a manufacturer's holding lot. The homeowner was arrested and lodged on charges of Operating a Chop Shop and Receiving and Concealing stolen vehicles. The total value recovered was \$140,000.

Note 1: a. Reporting Entity

The Michigan Comprehensive Annual Financial Report provides general disclosures regarding: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies Budgeting and Budgetary Control, State Treasurer's Common Cash, Pension Benefits, Compensated Absences, General Long-Term Obligations, Contingencies, and Other Commitments.

b. Basis of Accounting

The above financial schedule is prepared on the modified accrual basis of accounting, as explained in more detail in the Michigan Comprehensive Annual Financial Report.

The above financial schedule includes only the sources and disposition of authorizations and the changes in balances for the ATPA's general fund accounts. Accordingly, the financial schedule is not intended to constitute a complete financial presentation of either the ATPA or the general fund, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.

Note 2: Matching Percent

The ATPA Board of Directors matching fund requirement is 40 percent. There is no matching fund requirement for non-profit grantees, as they are funded at 100 percent.
