- I. **Welcome** – Col. Joseph M. Gasper
 - a. Roll Call
 - b. Approval of the May 2021 minutes. Mr. Mark Reese moved to approve the minutes. Chief William T. Riley supported the motion. Motion approved.

- II. **MIOC Status** – D/F/Lt. David Eddy
 - a. Staffing Update: 62 (unchanged, except for diversion grant ending, creation of new Meth Analyst position).
 - i. Strategic Unit-11 analysts plus Manager (two vacancies).
 - ii. Tactical Unit Central-11 analysts plus Manager (two vacancies).
 - iii. Tactical Unit NW Region-ten analysts plus Manager (two vacancies).
 - iv. Fusion Center-11 personnel (two analysts, six technicians, three enlisted) plus Commander (two OK2SAY vacancies).
 - v. DSEMIC-11 (six analysts, two data coders, three enlisted) plus Commander (no vacancies).
 - vi. Admin.
 - vii. IT Specialist (vacant).
 - viii. 43 State, Local, Federal and National Guard Partners.

- b. Activity Updates:
 - i. OK2SAY School Safety Tip Line has been slammed due to the Oxford School shooting. As a direct result of the shooting, we have had 2,685 tips received between November 30, 2021, and December 7, 2021, at 8 a.m.
 - ii. Analysts and JTTF members continue to assist FBI. Follow up investigations resulting from the January 6, 2021, US Capitol riots. 53 Michigan citizens are subjects of investigations.
 - iii. Aggregate data collected on all types of requests for service (RFS) began January 2021. 37% MSP vs. 63% non-MSP agency requests.

- c. MIOC Initiatives:
 - i. Objective to have at least two analysts per district looks promising as a result of agency's push to add civilian positions in FY23.
 - ii. Implemented new intelligence data base.
 - iii. Grant awarded for FLO and BTAM Team-one full-time and 2 part-time limited term positions to be filled soon.
 - iv. Exit interviews conducted on departure and semi-annual climate surveys are used to obtain feedback for improvements within the section and division.
 - v. Maintain multiple distribution lists for info/intel sharing across the state.

III. DSEMIIC Report – D/Lt. Calvin Hart

- a. Updates:
 - i. The DSEMIIC has provided intelligence support and monitoring for several major events recently, including the Presidential visit, Detroit Christmas tree lighting, Thanksgiving Day parade and the U of M vs Ohio State football game to name a few.
 - ii. Two highly publicized court cases that the analysts will be monitoring social media for any planned protest or demonstration resulting from their verdicts are the Kyle Rittenhouse trial and Admaud Arbery killing in Georgia.
- b. Outreach Activity:
 - i. Supporting the FBI IA assigned to the DSEMIIC on a project to share information on How Global Supply Chain shortages directly impact SE Michigan and how this problem can potentially lead to the rise of violent crimes.
 - ii. Working to formulate a partnership that will involve members from the public and private sector to proactively work together in sustainable and productive manner for sharing information with an emphasis on public safety relative to the current construction of the Gowdie Howe International Bridge project.
- c. Significant Events:
 - i. Oxford shooting, urgent request from FBI Detroit to gather reports on the Crumbley parents.
 - ii. Request by OCSO for information on individual regarding the Oxford shooting.
 - iii. Sent out urgent FBI SIR for all the school threats in the Detroit metro area.
 - iv. OCSO requested searches on social media for any threats directed towards Oakland County Prosecutor Karen McDonald.

- a. Ms. Liz Johnson- Tim Waters is retiring, his last day is December 30, 2021. No word on replacement yet. Jeff Kirkpatrick supervises all analysts over FBI West Michigan.

- d. Training helped to be prepared for Oxford Schools shooting.
