- I. **Welcome** – Col. Joseph M. Gasper
 - a. Roll Call
 - b. Approval of the December 2021 minutes. Mr. Mark Reene moved to approve the minutes. Mr. Richard Fenton supported the motion. Motion approved.

- II. **MIOC Status** – D/F/Lt. David Eddy
 - a. Staffing Update: 64 total. Added two new MTI analysts as well as a CDC funded analyst shared with DHHS and MIOC.
 - i. Strategic Unit-11 analysts plus one Manager (no vacancies)
 - ii. Tactical Unit Central-13 analysts plus Manager (no vacancies-added two new MTI analysts)
 - iii. Tactical Unit NW Region-10 Analysts plus Manager with one vacancy
 - iv. Fusion Center-11 personnel (two analysts, six technicians, three enlisted) plus Commander (one OK2SAY vacancy)
 - v. DSEMIC-11 in total, six analysts, two data coders, three enlisted plus Commander (no MSP vacancies)
 - vi. Administrative Assistant
 - vii. IT Specialist filled since last meeting
 - viii. 105 Total with State, Local, Federal and National Guard partners/and or affiliates
 - ix. Introduction of DHS Intelligence Officer Dan Lorenz

- b. Activity Updates:
 - i. OK2SAY Program-36,003 tips submitted since inception. September 2014 thru May 2022
 - ii. OK2SAY 2021 total tips, 6, 255 66% increase over 2020 tips, the three top tip categories:
 - 1. Planned School Attack
 - 2. Bullying
 - 3. Suicide threats
 - iii. OK2SAY January through April 2022, total tips 3056 (compared same months in 2021 tips total was 836), the three top tip categories:
 - 1. Bullying
 - 2. Suicide Threats
 - 3. Drugs
 - iv. Missing Persons Coordination Unit (MPCU)-one MPCU analyst was appointed by the US Department of Interior as a Commissioner to serve on the Not Invisible Act Joint Commission on Reducing Violent Crime Against Indians. This Commission will advise the US Attorney General and US Secretary of the Interior with recommendations on actions the Federal Government can take to increase intergovernmental coordination to identify and combat violet crime on Indian lands and against Indians.
 - v. Aggregate data collected on all types of requests for service (RFS) by requesting agency type began January 2021. 37-40% MSP agency requests vs. 60-63% non-MSP agency requests
- c. MIOC Initiatives:
 - i. Plan to have two analysts per district has gone unfulfilled as the MIOC was not granted any positions for FY23. Working on other funding sources to help with this.
 - ii. Grant FLO and BTAM update. Hired one part time position getting ready to post BTAM Specialist this week, still one part-time position open
 - iii. Exit interviews and climate surveys continue
 - iv. New intelligence data base is still working well, continue to develop and leverage capabilities to improve user experience.
 - v. Maintain multiple distribution lists for info/intel sharing

III. DSEMIIC Report – D/Lt. Calvin Hart

- a. Updates:
 - i. Eight MSP
 - ii. Five UASI Analysts
 - iii. Hired Wayne County analyst starting in June 2022
 - iv. Losing one UASI analyst
 - v. One analyst will be working at the FBI three days a week
- b. Training Activity:
 - i. Fusion Center Conference
 - ii. Cobweb technology virtual demo forthcoming
 - iii. Blue Fusion trained with the office last year, looking at having them come out and do a training with all staff.
 - iv. Analyst went to Flint to attend a debrief of the Las Vegas shooting from 2017
- c. Significant Events:
 - i. Supreme Court leak-received information from Captain Smiley about a group organizing to attack Catholic Services.
 - ii. Trucker convoy

- iii. Past two weeks, commencement of University of Michigan, two analysts supporting, things went off well, Oakland University had commencement as well.
- iv. 2022 Detroit Grand Prix-race is moving back into the streets, will set up a HISN room. June 3 through June 5, 2022.
- v. 2022 Detroit Fireworks-HSIN room will be set up to connect with partners, June 27 and 28. Two analysts supporting this
- vi. 2022 Rocket Mortgage Classic, July 28, 2022. Support on-site
- vii. Working to imbed a DSEMIIC analyst into the Counter Terrorism Squad, working on the MOU
- viii. Analysts have been busy with events
- ix. Lastly, MIOC, FBI, and DSEMIIC collaboration, to advice local partners about facts of home-grown violent extremists that justify reasonable suspicion
