



### DEFINITION

Criminal Sexual Conduct (CSC) 1st Degree (MCL 750.520b) is the sexual intercourse of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or, not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity. Michigan collects the crime data for this offense based on the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS).

**Note: CSC 1st and 3rd are differentiated by the weapon involved and the degree of the victim injury.**

### ANALYSIS

#### VOLUME

The number of victims reported for CSC - 1st Degree, Sexual Penetration - Penis/Vagina was 3,024. This is a reported increase of less than one percent from 2014 and an eight percent decrease from 2011.

More victims were reported in the month of August than any other month. The fewest number of victims were reported in December.

#### RATE

The crime rate for this offense in 2015 was 31 for every 100,000 persons. In 2014, the crime rate was 30 for every 100,000 persons, a decrease of three percent.

#### CLEARANCES

Law enforcement agencies cleared 796 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance. This is a reported 28 percent clearance rate which is the same clearance rate as 2014.

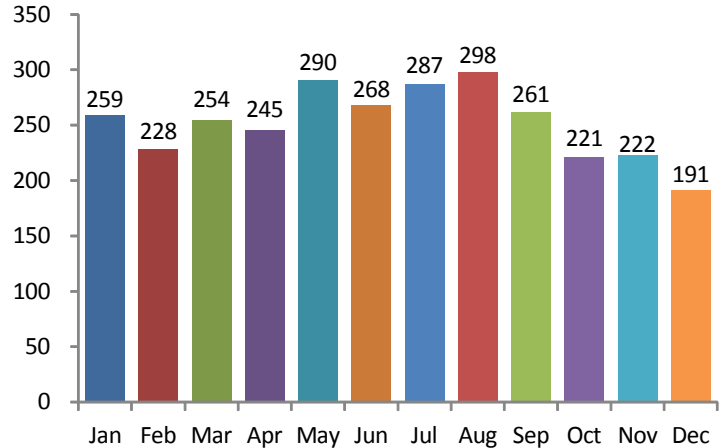
#### VICTIM INFORMATION

Most of the victims (75 percent) did not receive any injury. There were 17 percent of victims who received Apparent Minor injuries and six percent received Possible Internal injuries.

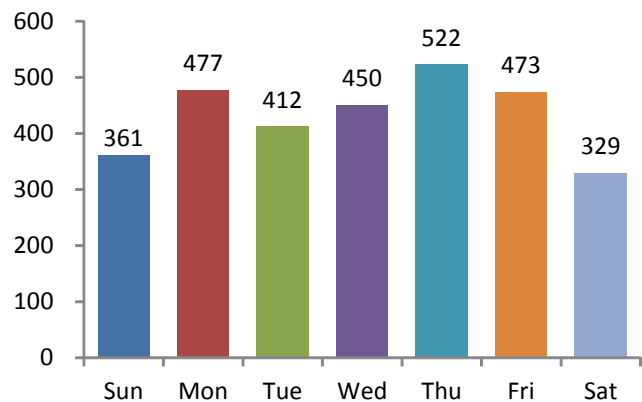
Thirty-seven (37) percent of the victims had a Personal Weapon such as hands, fists, feet, etc., used against them. Fifty-two (52) percent of the victims did not have a weapon used against them.

When reviewing the Victim to Offender relationships, 23 percent of the time the victim was an Acquaintance of the offender. With 13 percent of the victims, the Victim to Offender relationship was not known to law enforcement, 10 percent were Otherwise Known, and another 10 percent were reported as a Friend.

### Victims by Month

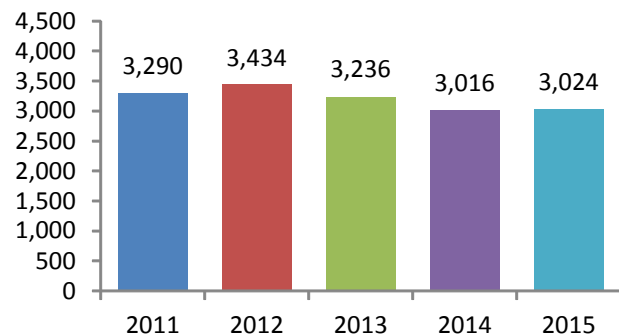

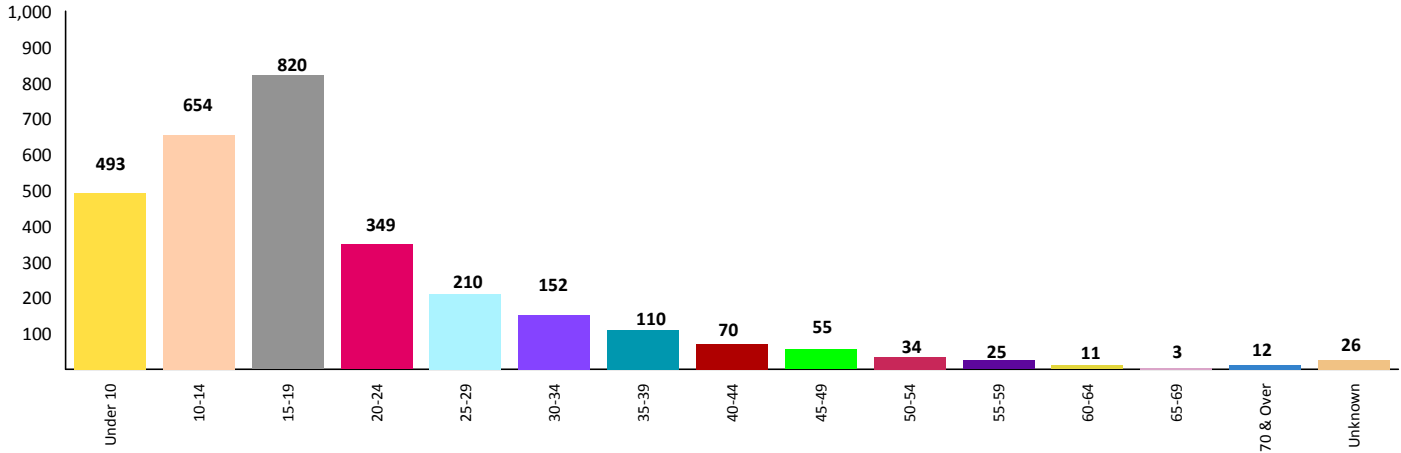

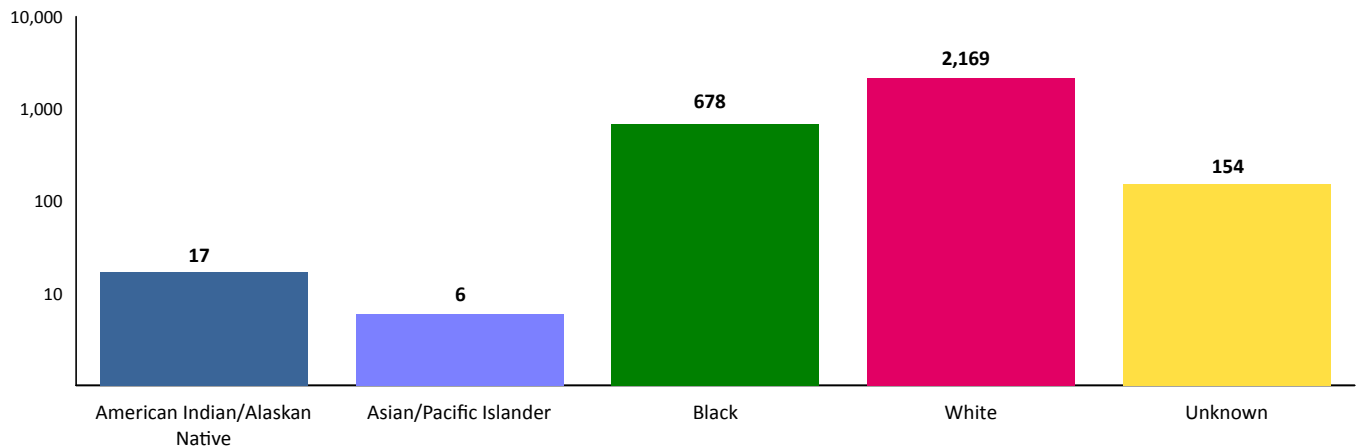

**VOLUME**

The number of victims reported for CSC - 3rd Degree, Sexual Penetration - Penis/Vagina was 1,132. This is a reported increase of 12 percent from 2014.

More victims were reported in the month of May than any other month. The fewest number of victims was reported in December. The most victims were reported on Thursdays.

**RATE**

The crime rate for this offense in 2015 was 11 for every 100,000 persons, which is a reported increase of 10 percent from 2014.

**CLEARANCES**

Law enforcement agencies cleared 349 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance out of the 1,104 incidents that were reported. This is a reported 32 percent clearance rate.

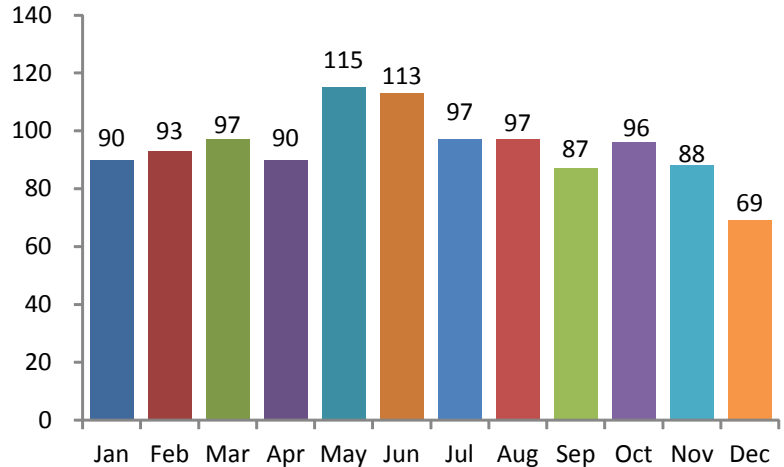
Most of the victims (84 percent) did not receive any injury. There were 11 percent of victims who received Apparent Minor injuries and three percent received Possible Internal injuries.

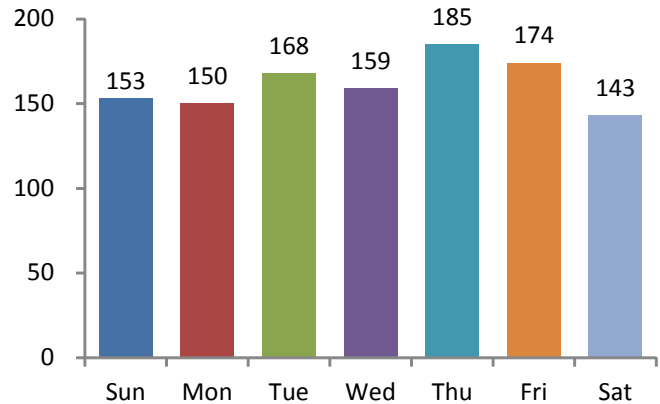

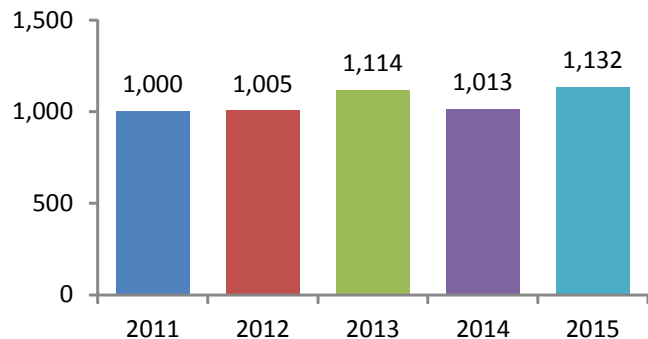

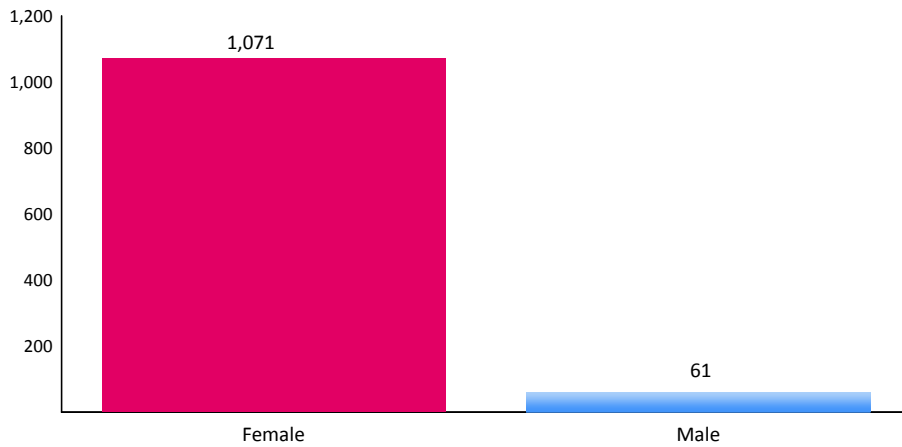




**Age of Victims**

The crime rate for this offense in 2015 was 11 for every 100,000 persons, which is a reported increase of 10 percent from 2014.

**CLEARANCES**

Law enforcement agencies cleared 264 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance out of the 997 incidents that were reported. This is a reported 26 percent clearance rate.

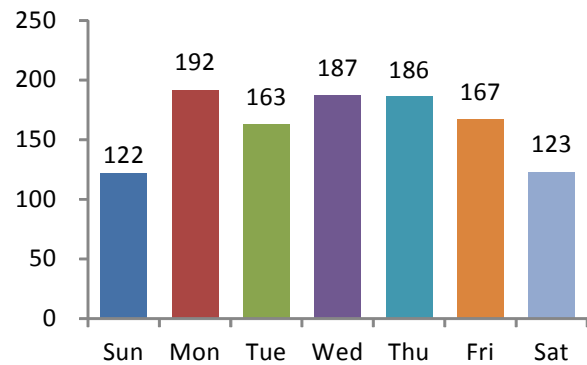

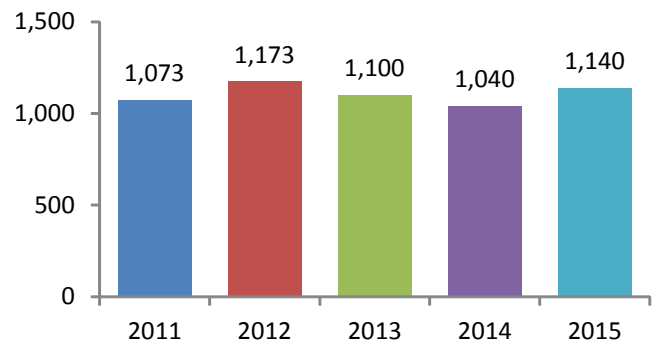

**VOLUME**

The number of victims reported for CSC - 3rd Degree, Sexual Penetration-Oral/Anal was 472. This is a reported increase of 12 percent from 2014.

More victims were reported in the month of March than any other month. The fewest number of victims were reported in April. These crimes occurred most often on Mondays.

**RATE**

The crime rate for this offense in 2015 was five for every 100,000 persons, which is a reported increase of 25 percent from 2014.

**CLEARANCES**

Law enforcement agencies cleared 133 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance out of the 437 incidents that were reported. This is a reported 30 percent clearance rate.

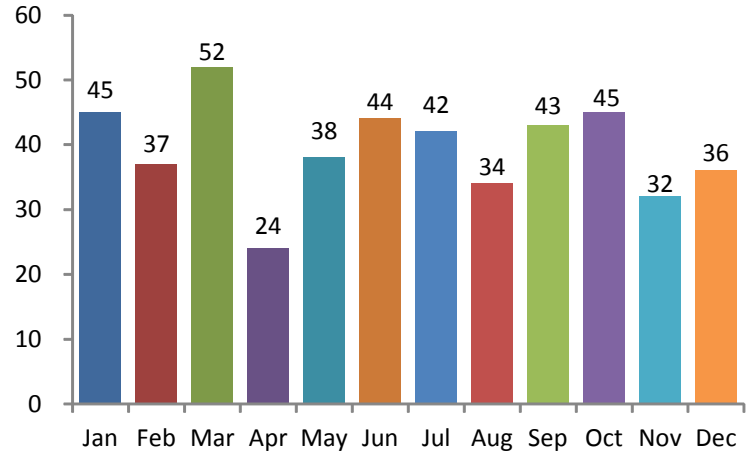

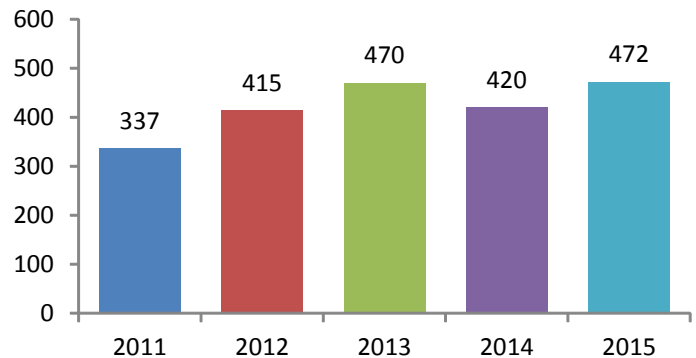

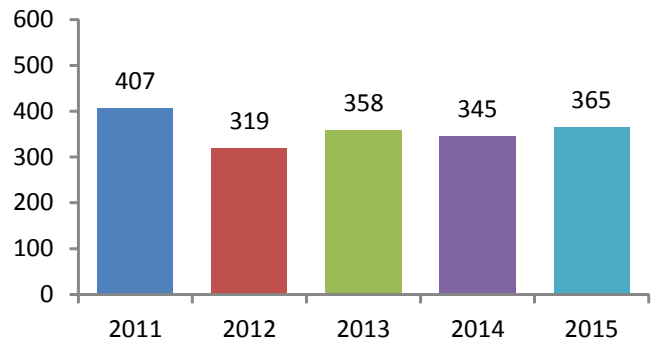

Criminal Sexual Conduct (CSC) 3rd Degree (MCL 750.520d) is the sexual intercourse of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or, not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity. Michigan collects the crime data for this offense based on the Federal Bureau of Investigation's National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS).

**Note: CSC 1st and 3rd are differentiated by the weapon involved and the degree of the victim injury.**

**ANALYSIS**

**VOLUME**

The number of victims reported for CSC - 3rd Degree, Sexual Penetration - Object was 178. This is a reported increase of seven percent from 2014.

More victims were reported in the month of January than any other month. The fewest number of victims were reported in April. The most victims were reported on Wednesdays and Fridays equally.

**RATE**

The crime rate for this offense in 2015 was two for every 100,000 persons, which is the same rate that was reported in 2014.

**CLEARANCES**

Law enforcement agencies cleared 53 incidents by an arrest or exceptional clearance out of the 167 incidents that were reported. This is a reported 32 percent clearance rate.

**VICTIM INFORMATION**

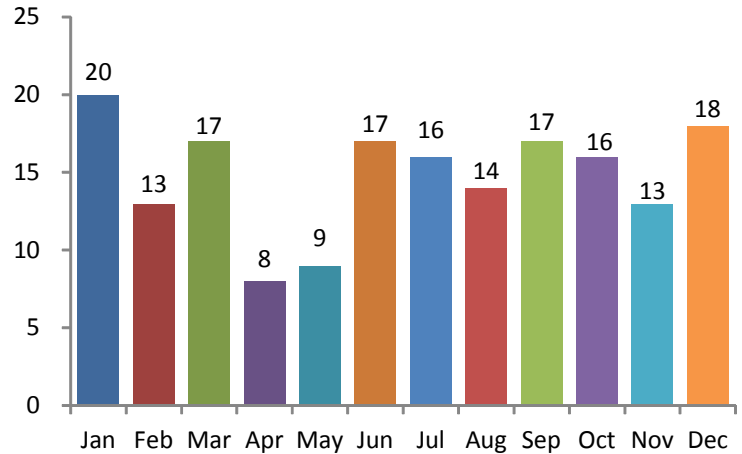
Most of the victims (86 percent) did not receive any injury. There were 12 percent of victims who received Apparent Minor injuries.

Fifty-seven (57) percent of the victims did not have a weapon used against them. The most used weapon occurring 35 percent of the time was a Personal Weapon meaning hands, fists, feet, etc.

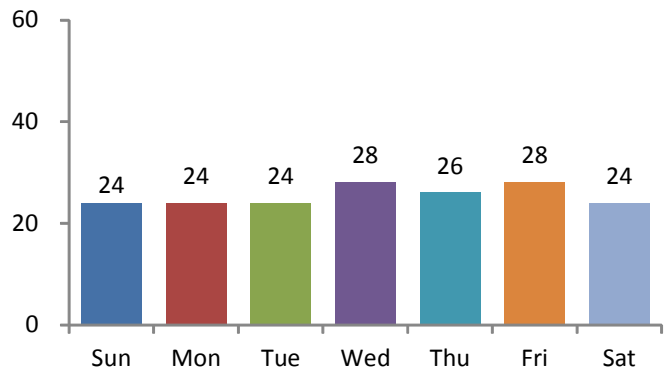
When reviewing the Victim to Offender relationships, 26 percent of the time, the victim was an Acquaintance of the offender. With 19 percent of the victims, the Victim to Offender relationship was a Friend.

The most reported location was a Residence/Home, which equates to 75 percent of the victims.

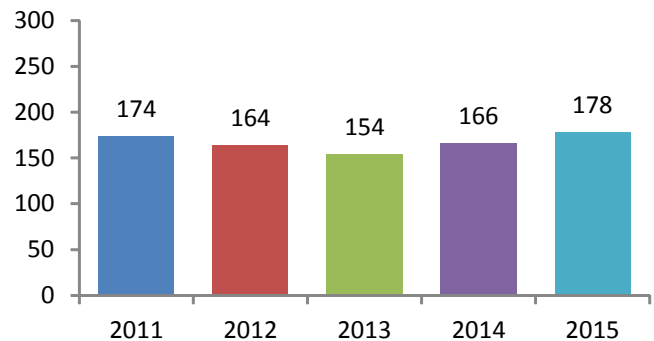
**Victims by Month**



**Victims by Day**

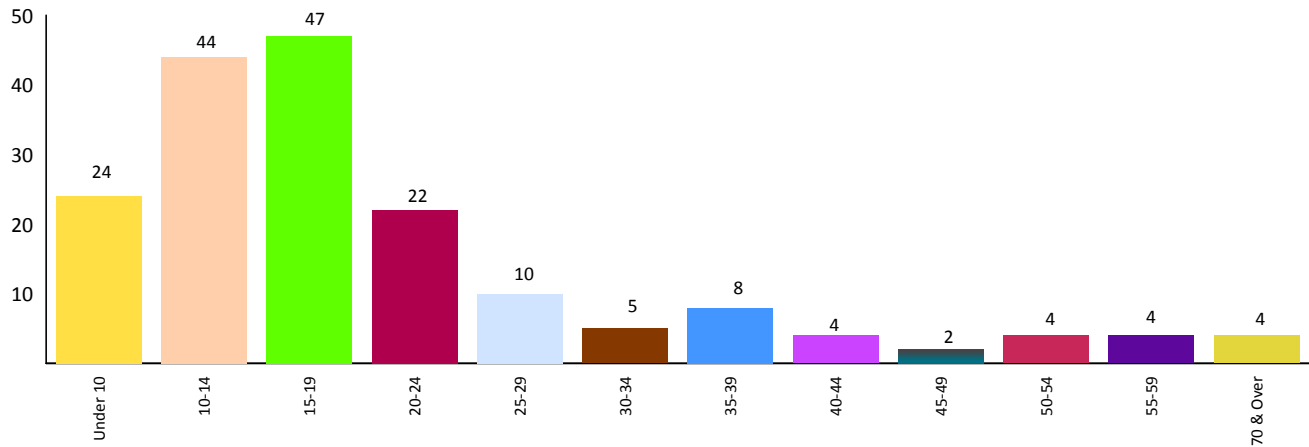


**5-Year Trend  
 Number of Victims**

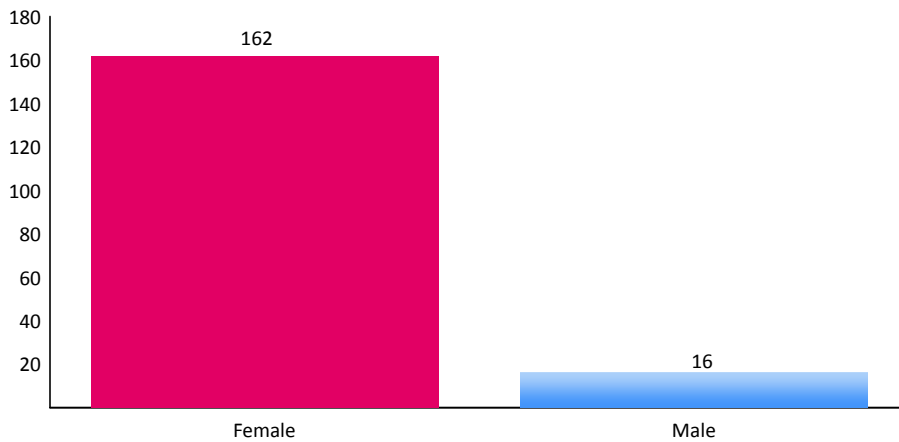




**Age of Victims**



**Gender of Victims**

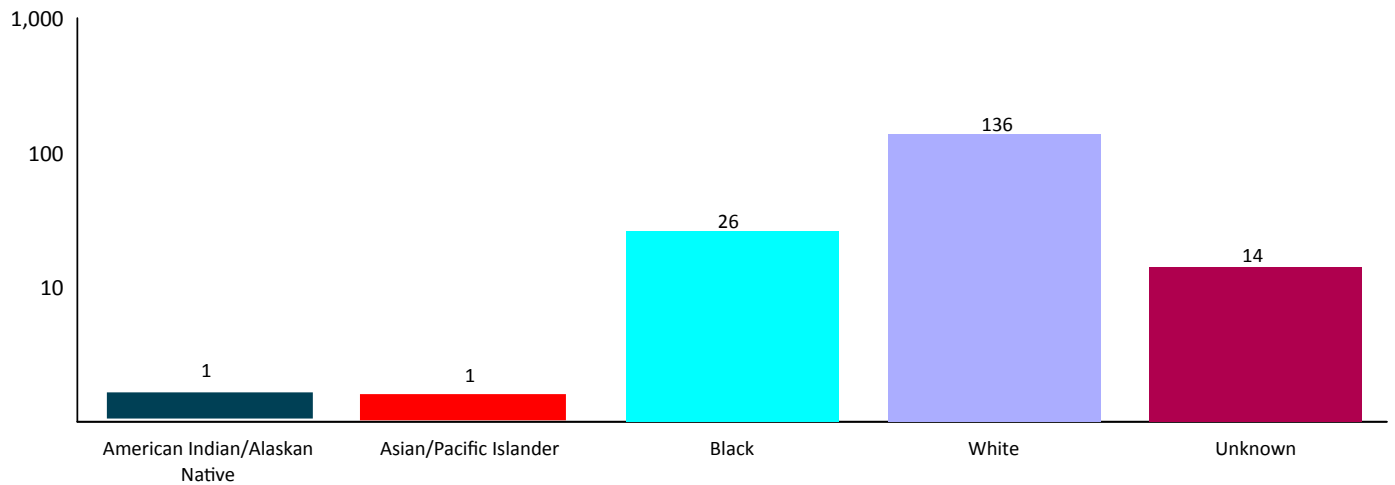

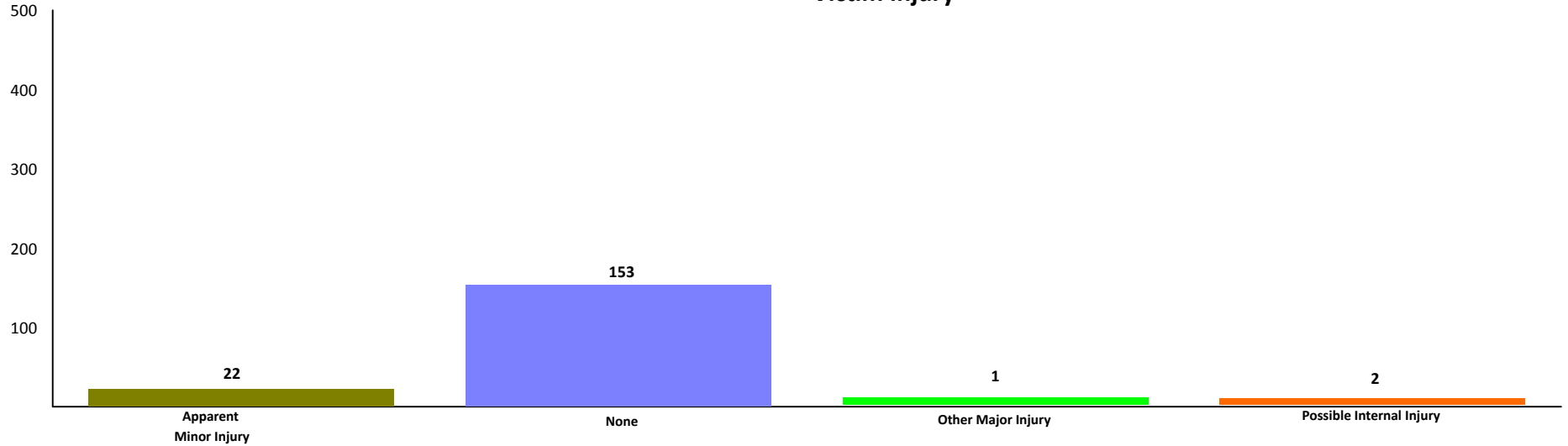

**Race of Victims**

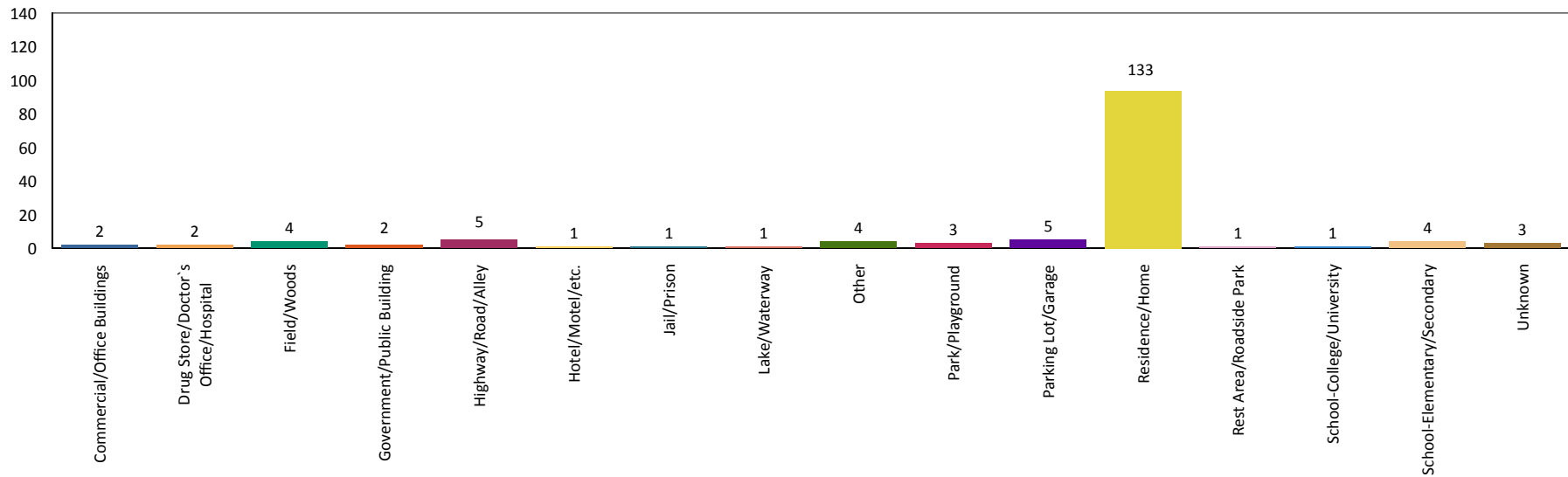


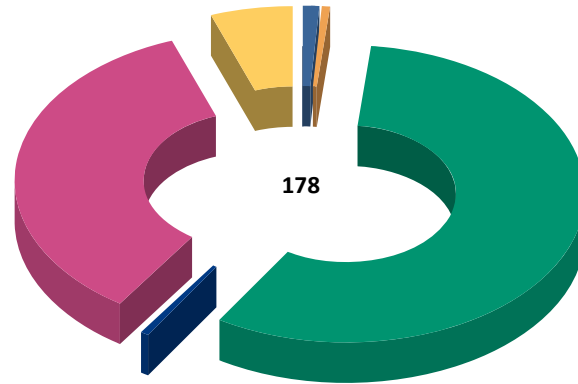


**Victim Injury**



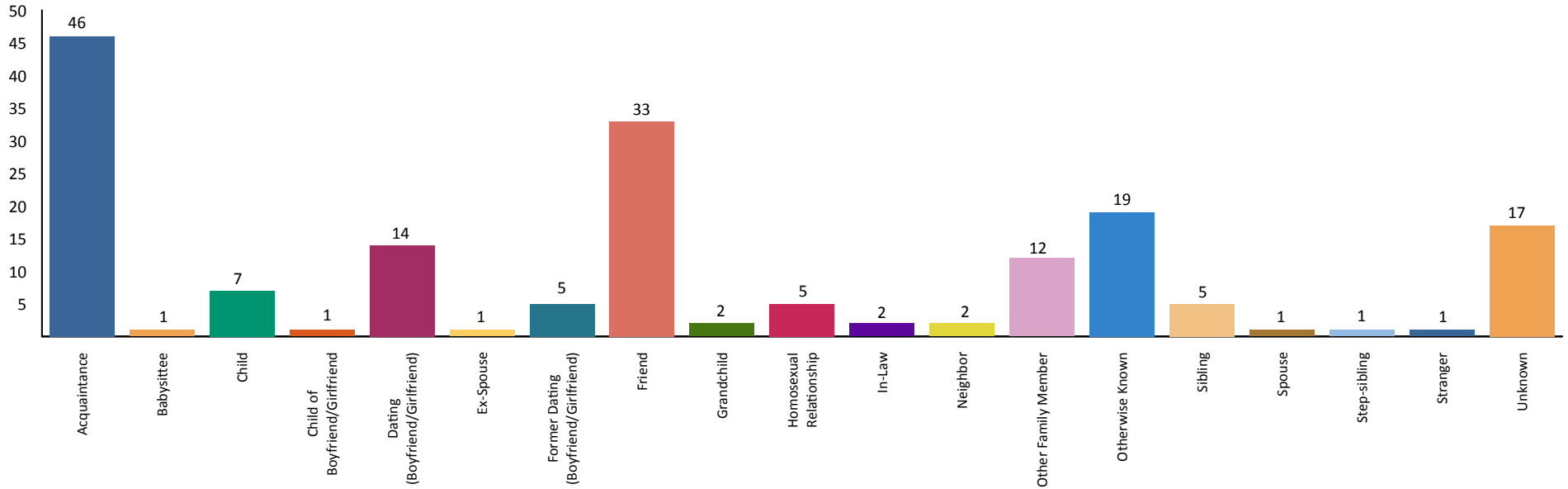
