HANDLING SPECIAL WEATHER HAZARDS



FLOODING - Tell your teen never to drive through a flooded area. Even shallow water can cause a vehicle to stall or lose control, and more deeply flooded roadways can develop a dangerous current. Remember: Turn around, don't drown.



SNOWPLOWS - Teach your teen driver never to pass a snowplow unless absolutely necessary. If they must pass, they should always pass on the left. Learn more about snowplow safety on our <u>DRIVE SAFELY NEAR SNOWPLOWS</u> page.



BLACK ICE – In wintry conditions, teens should drive slowly and watch for dark areas on the road that may indicate hard-to-see "black ice."



BRIDGES - Because cold air circulates beneath them, bridges ice up before regular roads. Teach your teen to take extra care in these areas.
