Advanced Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement	ARIDE	Training designed to help officers become more proficient at detecting, apprehending, testing, and prosecuting impaired drivers.

Annual Report	AR	The report each state submits to NHTSA annually containing a performance assessment, financial accounting, and other evaluation measures.

Click It or Ticket	CIOT	An annual national campaign to increase safety belt usage that includes high visibility enforcement and paid media at specific times, with a national mobilization around Memorial Day.
Code of Federal Regulations	CFR	The codification of the general and permanent rules published in the Federal Register by the departments and agencies of the Federal Government.
Commercial Motor Vehicle Enforcement Division	CVED	Division within the Michigan State Police with a focus on trucks and commercial vehicles for hire.

Drug Evaluation and Classification Program	DECP	The Drug Evaluation and Classification Program= Standardized Field Sobriety Testing (SFST), Roadside Impaired Driving Enforcement (ARIDE), and Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) courses
Drug Recognition Expert	DRE	A police officer trained to recognize impairment in drivers under the influence of drugs other than, or in addition to, alcohol.
Emergency Medical Services	EMS or EM	A traffic safety program area
Fatalities and suspected serious injuries	KA	Part of the KABCO injury scale
Fatality Analysis Reporting System	FARS	The nationwide census providing yearly public data regarding fatal injuries suffered in motor vehicle traffic crashes, as published by NHTSA.
Federal Highway Safety Administration	FHWA	An agency within the U.S. Department of Transportation (U.S. DOT) responsible for the administration of the nation's Federal-Aid highway funds.
Fiscal Year	FY	The Federal fiscal year, consisting of the 12 months beginning each October 1 and ending the following September 30.
Governor's Traffic Safety Advisory Commission	GTSAC	Created by Executive Order and comprised of representatives from the departments of Community Health, Education, State Police, State, and Transportation to provide leadership in the identification of state and local traffic safety issues and promote recommended strategies to address them.
Governors Highway Safety Administration	GHSA	Created by Executive Order and comprised of representatives from the departments of Community Health, Education, State Police, State, and Transportation to provide leadership in the identification of state and local traffic safety issues and promote recommended strategies to address them.
