### Report on Concealed Pistol License Revenue

**December 1, 2021**

The Michigan Department of State Police (MSP), Criminal Justice Information Center, has compiled a report on concealed pistol license revenue as required under 2020 PA 166. Sec. 402(8) states: **The department shall provide to the legislature a report on concealed pistol licensing not later than December 1, 2021 that includes all of the following:**

**(a) The department's actual revenue received from fees paid for concealed pistol license (CPL) applications for fiscal year 2020-2021 and the uses of that revenue.**

Actual FY2021 revenue received from fees paid for CPL applications	\$ 13,416,353.75*
Five year CPL revenue average	\$ 9,960,982.00

\*CPL revenue, less fingerprint processing fees authorized under MCL 28.273. CPL revenue is cyclical; it fluctuates due to socioeconomic factors, elections, and renewal cycles.

**(b) The department's fiscal year 2020-2021 costs for administering its concealed pistol licensing responsibilities under 1927 PA 372, MCL 28.421 to 28.435, but not including costs related to the administration of other state statutes, or requirements of federal law.**

Support systems utilized by the CPL Unit	\$ 9,061,205.32

Concealed pistol license revenue is used to support the business operation of maintaining the concealed pistol license database, the program used by the county clerks and the MSP CPL Unit to enter applicant information and conduct background checks, and the CPL renewal website. It is also used for compiling the concealed pistol license annual report to the legislature; developing, printing, and distributing required forms; providing training and support; fingerprint fees authorized under 28 CFR Part 20.31; and legislative and legal resources. In addition, CPL revenue, along with fingerprinting and Internet Criminal History Access Tool fees, is used to support several criminal justice information systems used by law enforcement and criminal justice agencies, including the MSP CPL Unit.
