


Campaign Overview

Event 4: Road Signs






- Anchor Bay HOSA created road signs and put them up around our community.


Event 5: Informational Posters



Event 7: Elementary School Seatbelt Presentations





More than 3 out of 4 people in fatal crashes were ejected due to not wearing a seatbelt.





Pre/Post Test Results-Questions





- 501 Anchor Bay High School students took the pre-test, scoring overall a 67%.
- 560 Anchor Bay High School students took the post-test, scoring overall 73%.
- Due to our extensive, school-wide education, we had a 6% increase from pre-test to post-test.
- To insure as many students as possible took the pre/post tests, we handed out the QR codes to all 4th hour teachers and had students take the test in their 4th hour class.
