

The Future of MVH: Seeking Qualified Servant Leaders for Board Service

The Board of Directors of the Michigan Veterans' Facility Authority (MVFA) is the governing body for Michigan Veteran Homes, providing strategic direction and focus, with the vision of being one of the nation's leading providers of long-term skilled nursing care and services to veterans.

Members of the MVFA Board of Directors are appointed by the Governor and have professional knowledge, skill or experience in long-term care, health care licensure, finance, or medicine, and often have strong ties to the veteran community - if they're not veterans themselves. There are currently two vacancies on the Board: one to be appointed by the Governor from nominations provided by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and one to be appointed by the Governor from nominations provided by the Majority Leader of the Senate.

Indeed, the future of quality care for MVH members relies upon dedicated, selfless,
