








Client Application Process

Visit www.michiqan.gov/miBridges to complete and submit an electronic application. You may also visit www.michiqan.gov/childcare to download or print the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) Assistance Application [MDHHS-1171]. Paper applications may be mailed or faxed to MDHHS or dropped off at your local MDHHS office.





After submitting your application for CDC, MDHHS will either call you to complete the interview or send an appointment notice to your mailing address. The interview may be completed by phone or in person.

Step 3: Choose a Provider




While you're waiting for an interview, you can begin your search for a quality child care provider at www.GreatStartToQuality.org. Complete and sign the CDC Provider
Verification
[DHS-4025] form and have your selected provider sign the form as well, then return it to MDHHS. If your provider is license exempt, refer to the License Exempt Provider Registration Process.

Parents can apply for the child care assistance program two ways:

- 1. The Online Application: www.michigan.gov/mibridges.
- 2. MDHHS-1171, Assistance Application (paper).

Paper applications can be mailed, faxed to MDHHS, or physically dropped off to the local office.

Both applications include the CDC program, plus the option to apply for Cash, Food, and Medical Assistance, and Emergency Relief.

Valid CDC Need Reasons

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- Employment
 - Includes self-employment.
- High School Completion programs, and the following:
 - o GED-General Equivalency Diploma.
 - ABE-Adult Basic Education.
 - ESL-English as a Second Language.
- Family Preservation
 - Participation in an approved treatment program for a physical, mental, or emotional condition.
- Approved Activity Participation
 - Training activity.
 - Employment preparation.
 - Post-secondary education.

Verifications and Interview

Requested verifications may include:

- Proof of a valid child care need.
- Proof of income.
- Proof of residence/address.

Requested verifications must be returned within 10 calendar days of the date requested.

 Parents may request an extension if the initial deadline cannot be met.

An **interview** with the parent will be held by phone or in person before eligibility is determined.





Finding An Eligible Provider

Child care providers eligible to receive CDC subsidy payment:

- Licensed Providers.
- License Exempt Providers who are enrolled through the Michigan Department of Education (MDE).

The advantages of using an eligible provider:

- Criminal background checks
- Health and safety training
- Child development training
- Monitored

License Exempt Providers

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License Exempt Providers:

- License Exempt-Related (Related adult who provides care in their own home or the child's home).
- License Exempt-Unrelated (Unrelated adult who provides all care in the child's home).

Provider Enrollment: provider application, background checks, interview, initial and ongoing training, monitoring visits (unrelated only).
