




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ABOUT TRI-SHARE

The MI Tri-Share Child Care Program (<u>Tri-Share</u>) is an innovative public/private partnership that equally **shares** the cost of child care between employers, employees, and the state of Michigan.

IMPLEMENTATION

The Mi Tri-Share Program **continues to be on families' radar,** once again helping them decide the employer they want to work for.

Individuals who are seeking employment are **using Tri-Share to guide their employment search**; Hub facilitators have been contacted by individuals seeking employers who are participating in the program.

FACILITATOR HUBS

ENROLLMENT STATUS

- There are currently 57 employers enrolled across 13 Hubs.
- Enrolled **employers vary in size** from small to big business.
- Current enrolled employers represent various industries, including social assistance, agriculture, manufacturing, arts, and social and civil service orgs.
- Hubs are actively recruiting employees from participating employers. Currently there are 60 employees enrolled across three Hubs.
- Enrolled employees are receiving support for full and part-time child care as well as before and after school care for 57 children. Children range between the ages of 6 months to 11 years old.

UPDATES



- Everybody Ready has been onboarded as a new facilitator Hub in Detroit and is currently seeking employers!
- The Ballmer Group has funding available for a Tri-Share facilitator Hub in Oakland, Wayne (outside of Detroit), or Macomb County. Please contact Cheryl Bergman (bergmanc1@michigan.gov) for information on how to apply!
- New CDC guidelines state that employees eligible to participate in the Tri-Share pilot must have an income above 200% of the Federal Poverty Line (FPL) and below 325% effective June 24th.
