



MI Tri Share Status Update June 2021

Tri Share is an innovative public/private partnership that shares the cost of child care equally between employers, employees, and the state of Michigan.

Guiding Priorities

The following priorities have guided early decision making for pilot implementation



Family choice of child care, ensuring families make all decisions around where their child attends.



Reduce the burden on employers and providers by involving facilitator Hubs to determine eligibility and administer the program.



Help Asset Limited Income Constrained **E**mployed (ALICE) population eliminate barriers to employment

Implementation took approximately three months, from the selection of the facilitator Hub awardees (March 2021), to the ability for Hubs to begin actively signing on participating employers.

Three initial facilitator Hubs, the organizations acting as intermediaries between employers, families, and child care providers, have been selected and onboarded. Hubs currently represent the **Great Lakes Bay region; North West** lower peninsula and Muskegon County.



Implementation Enrollment Status

Hubs are actively engaged in ongoing outreach and recruitment of employers to participate in the pilot.

Hubs meet on a monthly basis to collaborate around successful implementation strategies, and solution focused problem solving.

Seven employers are willing and ready to participate in the pilot, and between all three Hubs, the pilot expects to have approximately ten additional employers signed on by end of summer 2021.
