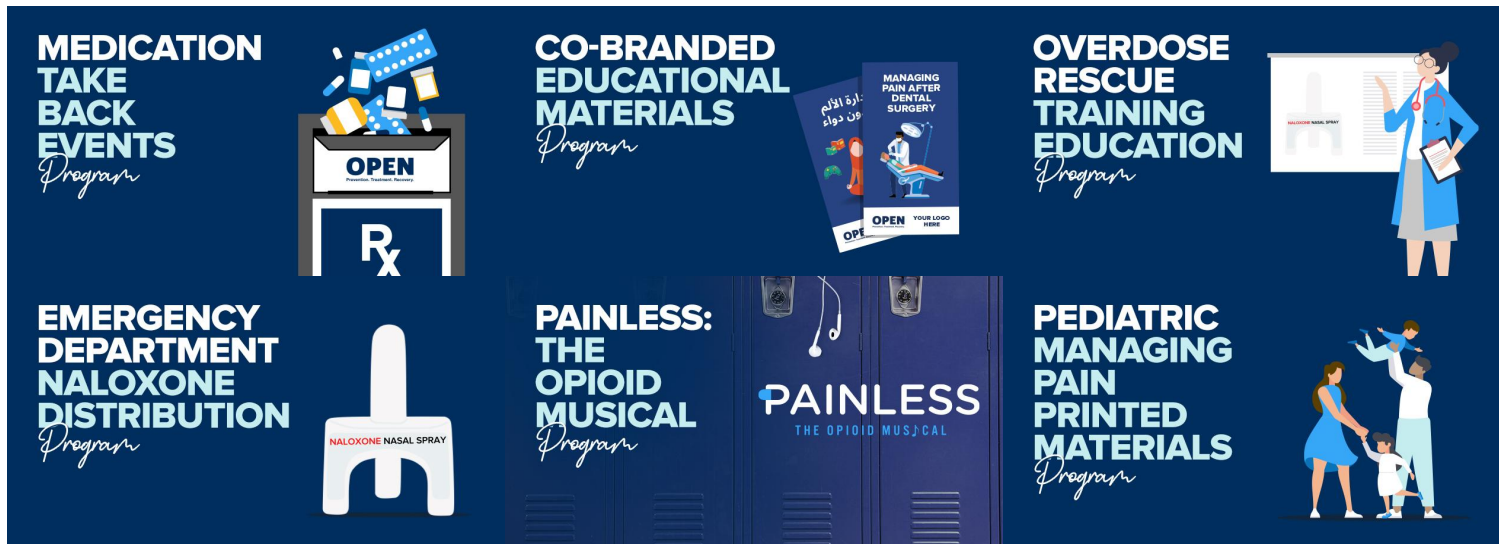

Strategy: We aim to expand the application of evidence-based opioid prescribing recommendations to all clinical domains for broad sharing and implementation by collecting and analyzing data using:

- Patient Reported Outcomes (PROs) Data
- Extensive literature reviews
- Expert consensus

Data-Driven Opioid Prescribing Recommendations



Among opioid-naïve patients undergoing common surgical procedures, **6-10% continue filling opioid prescriptions** 3-6 months after surgery.



Further, **72% of opioids** prescribed by surgeons **go unused** by patients, leaving the available for diversion into communities and risky prescription drug use.



Since the launch of our recommendations, prescription size has **reduced by 76% for Michigan** patients, with **no change** in patient reported pain or satisfaction scores.

DENTAL PAIN MANAGEMENT



Dentists are the Top Prescriber of Opioids to Kids 13-30



Many adolescents and young adults are exposed to opioids for the **first time after dental surgery**, such as wisdom tooth removal

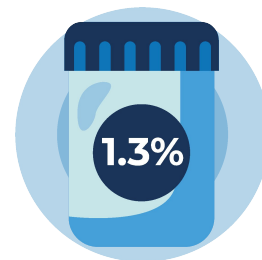


Dentists accounted for 1.5 million opioid prescriptions to adolescents and young adults aged 12-21 years, representing **40% of all opioid prescriptions** to this age group

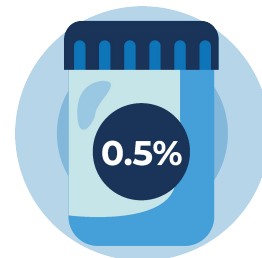
Dental Pain Management

- Those who filled the initial opioid prescription were nearly **3 times as likely to become a new persistent opioid** user compared to those who did not fill an initial opioid prescription
- Filling 2 or more opioid prescriptions weeks and months later

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Safe Storage + Disposal

Strategy: We aim to normalize and increase use of everyday disposal options and reduce opioid diversion into communities by:

- Promoting awareness and advocacy within communities and healthcare networks to improve appropriate disposal
- Support at home disposal options through the dissemination of mail back disposal envelopes and Detera bags.
- Increase permanent disposal options and awareness in communities

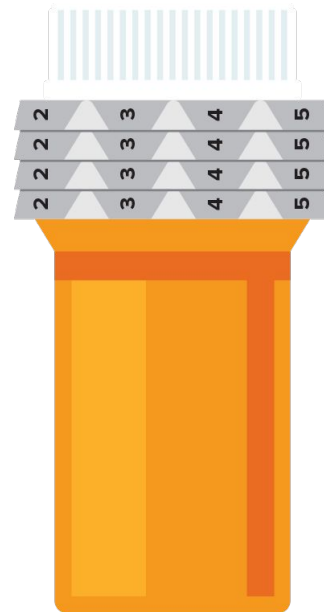

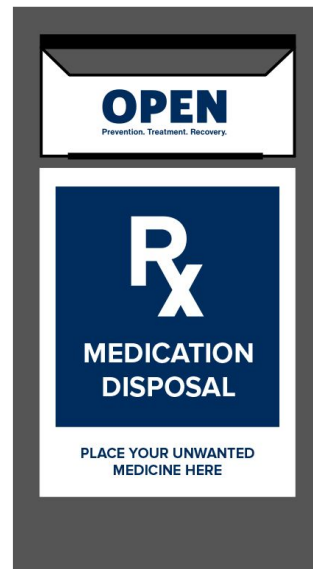
Safe Storage: Locking Pill Bottles

- Easy and safe medication storage
- Request **up to 250 free** Safe Rx locking prescription vials in small or large size
- Priority to clinics, pharmacies, and treatment programs that directly dispense medications or provide bottles to patients



Permanent Disposal Boxes

- Promote safe disposal of unused medications
- Apply for a fully-funded box for your organization
- Initial funding for one year of box services



Disposal Products: Detera Pouches + Envelopes

- Direct dispose of unwanted medications with Detera deactivation pouches
 - Apply for cases of 200
- Mail unwanted medications in for destruction
 - Apply for cases of 250



SUD CARE COORDINATION



SUD Care Coordination



Improve care and connections to treatment for patients with Substance Use Disorder (SUD).

Strategy: Collaborate with partners to develop and implement standardized, non-stigmatizing care pathways for patients with SUD.

- Create and share data-driven evidence supporting standardized screening
- Develop and disseminate resources and education to support the implementation of appropriate OUD/SUD care coordination
- Promote prescribing Medication for Opioid Use Disorder (MOUD) and warm-hand off transitions to OUD/SUD care

Addressing Common Barriers to Prescribing

Barrier to MAT Access

Cost of physician training

Lack of physician prescribing, even after training

No link to counseling services

Lack of support staff knowledge

Mismatch of setting and patient

Lack of community resources

Program Feature

Organize in-person trainings and pay cost of online trainings

Peer consultation by an addiction physician

Program staff will connect to resources

Provide training and materials to nurses and MAs

Staff provide bidirectional referrals

Staff can address barriers, e.g., outreach to pharmacies

Evaluation of SUD Care Coordination Services

With data from 2017-2020, the predicted increases after starting services in a county are:

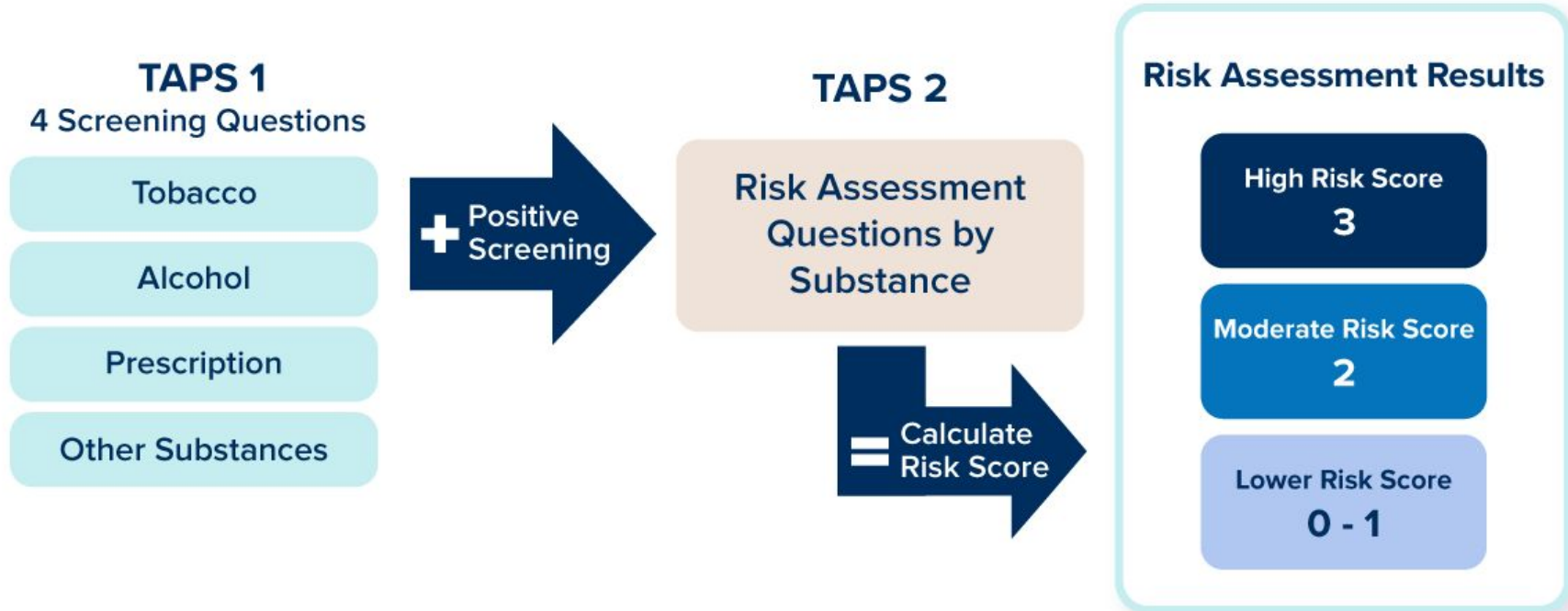

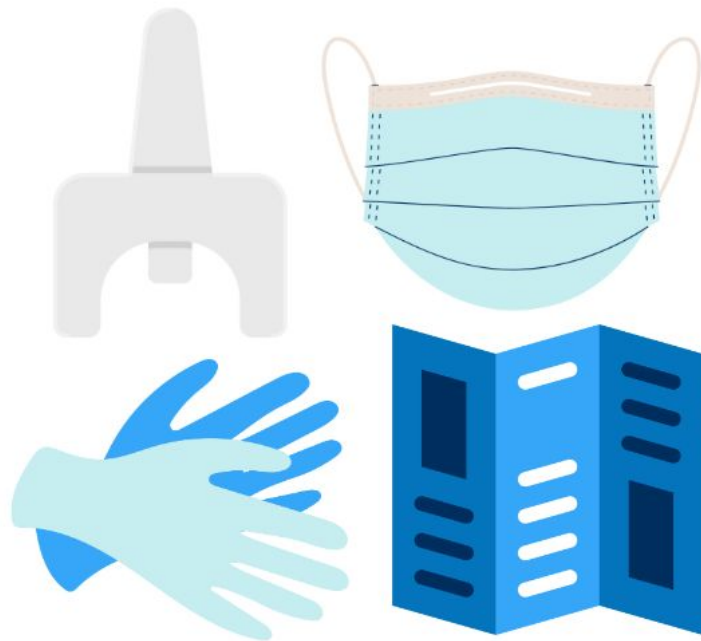

Virtual, Live or In-person Naloxone Training

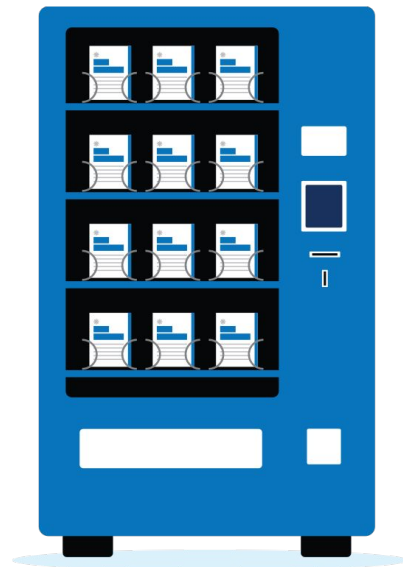
- Train the Trainer

Explore this program and learn how to apply to receive a naloxone vending machine or distribution box for your organization.

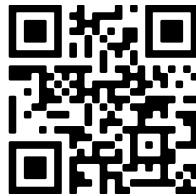
- Organizations can apply for a free naloxone vending machine or distribution box for their location

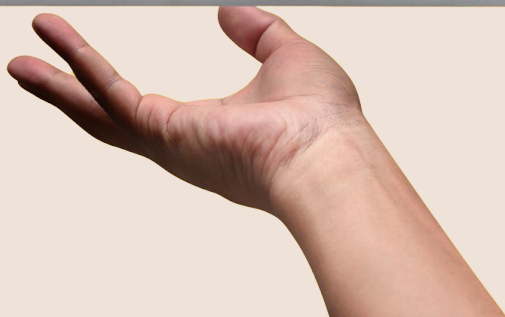
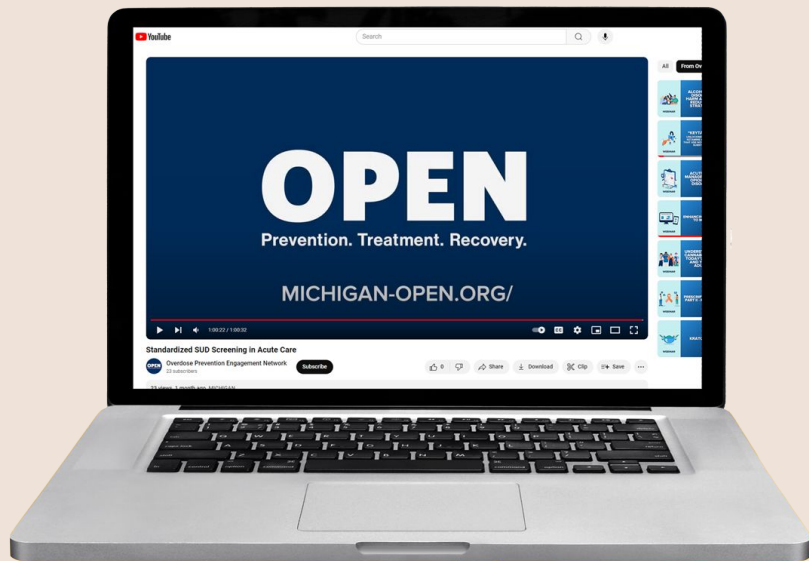
