Dear FDA and USDA:

As you are aware, Michigan has been challenged with per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) for over two years now. The Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) is currently dealing with a situation where PFAS is encroaching on an agricultural site and we are looking for some insight on how best to address.

In the past you have offered to assist MDARD with site-specific concerns related to PFAS contamination. By way of this letter, we are requesting coordinated assistance from both of your agencies in working with the farm owner to further investigate and advise on the proper path moving forward.

By way of background, the original contamination site is from a long-closed plating facility where heavy metal contamination was first discovered in 1972 and PFAS contamination was discovered in 2018.

The location is a beef cattle and row crop operation located in Richland Township that falls within the Michigan PFAS Action Response Team's (MPART) North 34<sup>th</sup> Street Kalamazoo County site investigation. The well water for the cattle is non-detect for PFAS. However, adjacent surface water used for irrigating fields to grow animal feed was recently found to contain PFOS at 152 and 316 ppt. The farm and the growing fields are not in the contamination plume, but the irrigation pond is on the edge of an area which has shown groundwater contamination. Pivot irrigation is used for row crops and water is pulled from said pond. Fields have been irrigated from this pond for many years.
