

About Us

The Fostering Futures Scholarship Trust Fund, is a Sec. 170 (c) nonprofit organization housed in the Michigan Department of Treasury under the Michigan Education Trust (MET), Charitable Tuition Program. This program was created to serve as a resource to aid young adults who have experienced foster care as they pursue their dream of a college education. In partnership with Michigan Associations of United Ways, 501-(c) (3) donations can also be made.

Roughly 10,000 children are in the Michigan foster care system at any given time. Youth who transition from foster care need resources to pursue higher education and benefit from accessing financial resources and supportive adults when they attend college.

Nationally, 70 percent of the teens who exit foster care indicate that they want to attend college and fewer than 10 percent who graduate from high school enroll in college.

Since 2012, MET and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS), have partnered fundraising efforts to award over \$1.3 million through the Fostering Futures Scholarship Trust Fund.
