## **Instructions for Computing Weight Fees**

- 1. Determine the empty vehicle weight. Round the weight to the next lower hundred pounds when it ends in 50 pounds or less and to the next higher hundred pounds when it ends in 51 pounds or more. (5,150 lbs. is reduced to 5,100 lbs., while 5,151 lbs. becomes 5,200 lbs.)
- 2. Divide the rounded weight by 100. Then multiply the result by the fee per hundred pounds. Round this amount to the next lower whole dollar when it ends in 50¢ or less and round to the next higher whole dollar when it ends in 51¢ or more. **This amount is the 12-month fee.**
- 3. If the vehicle is eligible for a 6-month plate (the 12-month fee has to be at least \$50), multiply the 12-month fee by 50% (x .50).
- 4. As a final step, add \$8 to the 12-month or 6-month fee. There is a \$10 service fee with the purchase of a 6-month plate.
