



You can save a life during the 100 Deadliest Days for Michigan drivers ages 16-18.

Talk to your teen about the risks of the road.

The risk of fatal crashes involving teen drivers is highest from Memorial Day to Labor Day.

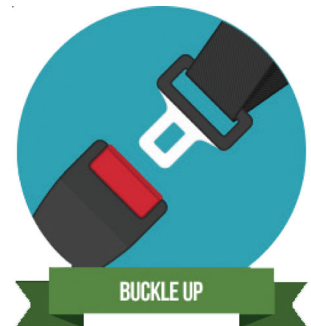
The summer months are the most dangerous time for teen drivers on the road.



LIMIT PASSENGERS

Limit teen passengers before you hit the road.

The more teen passengers in the vehicle the greater the crash risk.



BUCKLE UP

Buckle up and make sure others are too.

Require that everyone in the vehicle is buckled up - including front and back seat passengers — before the vehicle moves.



DON'T DRIVE WHILE IMPAIRED

Driving while impaired is deadly.

Driving under the influence of any impairing substance - like alcohol, illicit or prescription drugs, and even over-the-counter medication, increases the risk of a crash.



DON'T SPEED

No need to speed.

Remind teens to slow down. Speeding is the #1 cause of fatal crashes involving teen drivers.



AVOID DISTRACTIONS

Don't drive distracted.

Remind teens that using a handheld phone while driving is prohibited by law except in emergencies. Texting while driving is illegal.

Checkpoints

Information about teen driving risks and a personalized Parent-Teen Driving Agreement.

A driving agreement helps your teen understand the dangers of driving, encourages them to prioritize safety, and sets a clear understanding of driving expectations for the teen, and the rest of the family.



Technology Resources for Safe Driving

Resources that can be used to help monitor teens while they are driving such as receipt of notifications when driving at high speeds.

Other resources prevent drivers from using a phone and/or silencing alerts while driving.



Michigan Graduated Driver Licensing (GDL) & Driver Education Requirements

Licensing requirements, documentation needed at SOS offices, driving restrictions, and more.

GDL is a proven countermeasure for reducing teen traffic crash risk and is required of all Michigan drivers under age 18.



Teen-Led Traffic Safety Programs

Traffic safety programs designed to be led by teens in high school.
