Dear Ms. Roberts:

The Department of State (Department) received two formal complaints filed by Alex Garza and Jeff Lamarand against you, alleging that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign-related material. Copies of the complaints are provided as an enclosure with this letter.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(5).

In support of their complaints, Mr. Garza and Mr. Lamarand provided a picture of a sign which states "Linda ROBERTS City Council [,]" a copy of a picture of what appears to be the same sign, a copy of a picture of a sign which states LINDA ROBERTS For Taylor City Council [,]" and a copy of the Itemized Expenditures Schedule 1B from one of your candidate committee filings. It appears that there is no paid-for-by statement on either sign.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true.

If you wish to file a written response to these complaints, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Please send one single answer to both complaints, and include any evidence that reflects any corrective measures you have taken to bring your campaign material into compliance with the MCFA. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainants.

A copy of your reply will be provided to Messrs. Garza and Lamarand, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the

statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 47(5) of the Act.

To Whom It May Concern,

In reply to your letter of October 29, 2013 concerning the signs I had posted that were missing my contact information and the sign placed at the Little League ball field. I wish to inform you that the majority of the signs have been removed and destroyed. Some of them seem to have disappeared from the location I placed them. There were signs being stolen on a regular basis during the campaign. I have picked up all the signs I could locate and have advised supporters through social media that if I missed any of the signs to please inform me or destroy them. All the signs that were not stolen were pick up by myself by November 3, 2013.

Those signs were purchased by an older lady supporter, who knew I couldn't afford to order them until I had money in the CTE Linda Roberts account ,also to surprise me she order them on line from out of state and had them delivered to my house. She was going to pay for them but I could not allow that since I knew she was on a limited income. Since this was my first campaign I simply overlooked the fact that the information required on the signs were missing. I'll never make that mistake again.


As to the large vinyl sign place at the ball park, I donated money from my personal account to support the Little League. The league director ordered the signs and placed them at the ball field and I only saw them from a distance since they were placed on the outfield fence. Since he had been placing signs there for several years and had numerous signs placed for a great number of candidates I didn't even think to check on them. I drove by the field and saw the signs from a distance. That sign has now been removed and destroyed. Another mistake I'll never make again.

Please accept my apologies for making some mistakes on my first but hopefully not my last campaign. Had I been informed of my mistake by Mayor Jeff Lamarand or by candidate Alex Garza I would have corrected the situation immediately.

Dear Ms. Roberts:

The Department of State (Department) has completed its investigation of complaints filed against you by Alex Garza and Jeff Lamarand, which alleged that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign-related material. This letter concerns the disposition of Mr. Garza and Mr. Lamarand's complaints.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(5).

The Act also requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" Id.

The complaints were filed by Mr. Garza and Mr. Lamarand on October 18, 2013, and you filed a written response on November 13, 2013. Neither Mr. Garza nor Mr. Lamarand filed a rebuttal statement.

Mr. Garza and Mr. Lamarand alleged that your campaign signs did not contain complete and correct paid-for-by statements. In support of their complaints, Mr. Garza and Mr. Lamarand provided a picture of a sign which states "Linda ROBERTS City Council [,]" a copy of a picture of what appears to be the same sign, a copy of a picture of a sign which states 'LINDA ROBERTS for Taylor City Council [,]" and a copy of the Itemized Expenditures Schedule 1B from one of your candidate committee filings. It appears that there is no paid-for-by statement on either sign.

In response, you filed a letter which stated that since this was your first campaign you had "simply overlooked the fact that the information required on the signs [was] missing." You further stated that "the majority of the signs have been removed and destroyed," and that you reached out to supporters though social media to contact you or remove them. You also provided pictures of your collected signs. Finally, you stated that the error was inadvertent.

While the Department believes that the evidence tends to show that your campaign material failed to contain a complete paid-for-by statement, section 15(10) of the MCFA requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods such as a conference, conciliation, or persuasion [.]" The Department is satisfied that you took appropriate corrective measures once the potential violation was brought to your attention.

Additionally, the Department is advising you that section 47(1) and R 169.36(2) require you to print a complete and accurate identification statement on all campaign materials, consisting of the phrase "paid for by" followed by the full name and address of your committee. Note that all printed materials that refer to an election or your candidacy produced in the future must include this identification statement.

Please be advised that this notice has served to remind you of your obligation under the Act to identify your printed matter, and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act. A knowing violation is a misdemeanor offense and may merit referral to the Attorney General for enforcement action. MCL 169.247(5), 215(10).

The Department now considers this matter closed and will take no further action against you at this time.
