Dear Ms. Culverhouse:

The Department of State (Department) received a formal complaint filed by Wanda Green against you, alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 *et seq.* The investigation and resolution of these complaints is governed by section 15 of the Act and the corresponding administrative rules, R 169.51 *et seq.* Copies of the complaint and supporting documentation are enclosed with this letter.

Section 57 of the MCFA prohibits a public body or an individual acting on its behalf from using or authorizing the use of public resources, including equipment and supplies, to make a contribution or expenditure. MCL 169.257(1). A knowing violation of section 57 is a misdemeanor offense. MCL 169.257(3).

Ms. Green alleges that you "used or directed to be used Weesaw Township property (copier) for the creation of 2012 primary election campaign posters [.]"

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true.


**If you wish to file a written response to this complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of your receipt of this letter.** Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1<sup>st</sup> Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your reply will be provided to Ms. Green, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 57(3) of the Act.

The Department of State (Department) received a formal complaint filed by Jack Jones against you, alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 *et seq.* The investigation and resolution of these complaints is governed by section 15 of the Act and the corresponding administrative rules, R 169.51 *et seq.* Copies of the complaint and supporting documentation are enclosed with this letter.

In Michigan, it is unlawful for a public body or an individual acting on its behalf to "use or authorize the use of funds . . . office space . . . property . . . or other public resources to make a contribution or expenditure." MCL 169.257(1). A knowing violation of section 57 is a misdemeanor offense. MCL 169.257(3).

Mr. Jones alleges that you campaigned during business hours on township property. Mr. Jones provided a copy of a campaign flyer that he alleges was given to Jack Hojara by you while you were in your office in Township Hall.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true.



I represent Melodie Culverhouse in connection with two letters sent by you August 7, 2012 and received by Melodie Culverhouse on August 10, 2012.

Under the circumstances of both of the alleged violations, it is my client's position that she did not violate state law in that she did not campaign within the Weesaw Township Hall in that all she did was distribute a flyer for both herself and her opponent.

Further, although she did use the Township copier for a campaign poster experiment, she paid petty cash for this personal use and did not use the copier for the creation of 2012 primary election campaign posters; rather these were created for her by private firm.

Certainly it must be concluded that even if a technical violation exists, it is the fact that the violations as alleged by Wanda Green and Jack Jones are, at best, unknowing technical violations which have been presented to the Bureau of Elections in a deliberately out of context manner.


Three signs which were posted were made by me and included the American Flag in each corner and the balance of signs for use, display and posting were made for me by Signs Plus (copy of receipt attached).


I represent Melodie Culverhouse in connection with two letters sent by you August 7, 2012 and received by Melodie Culverhouse on August 10, 2012.

Under the circumstances of both of the alleged violations, it is my client's position that she did not violate state law in that she did not campaign within the Weesaw Township Hall in that all she did was distribute a flyer for both herself and her opponent.

Further, although she did use the Township copier for a campaign poster experiment, she paid petty cash for this personal use and did not use the copier for the creation of 2012 primary election campaign posters; rather these were created for her by private firm.

Certainly it must be concluded that even if a technical violation exists, it is the fact that the violations as alleged by Wanda Green and Jack Jones are, at best, unknowing technical violations which have been presented to the Bureau of Elections in a deliberately out of context manner.

Response to letter dated August 7, 2012 re: "Creation of 2012 Primary Election Campaign Posters (signs) that were later posted in Weesaw Township"

On July 9, 2012, I used the copier at Weesaw Township Hall for a personal use. It has been the policy that personal use may be made so long as paid for. I used the copier's "enlargement function" for five copies to determine whether or not it might be possible to enlarge a campaign sign by use of a copier.

This was unsuccessful. I paid \$2.50 into petty cash (petty cash receipt attached), and threw the five copies into the trash. No copies were made for display or any other purpose on the Township copier.

Three signs which were posted were made by me and included the American Flag in each corner and the balance of signs for use, display and posting were made for me by Signs Plus (copy of receipt attached).

This letter concerns the complaints that were recently filed against Melodie Culverhouse by Jack Jones and Wanda Green, which relate to purported violations of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 *et seq.* The Department of State has received a single rebuttal statement from the complainants, a copy of which is enclosed with this letter.

Section 15(10) of the MCFA, MCL 169.215(10), requires the Department to determine within 60 business days from the receipt of the rebuttal statement whether there is a reason to believe that a violation of the Act has occurred. Mr. Jones' and Ms. Green's complaints remain under investigation at this time. At the conclusion of the review, all parties will receive written notice of the outcome of the complaints.

This is written in response to your August 23, 2012, letter which pertained to two (2) complaints filed by Jack Jones and Wanda Green regarding violations of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act. Following is our rebuttal of Melodie Culverhouse's response to these violations. We are supplying the information in one statement, as you stated we might do.

**Violation 1:** Violation of MCL 169-257 (Using Township Property for Creation of 2012 Primary Election Campaign Posters)

1. Exhibit 1: This photo shows three (3) posters, 2 of which were found in the trash in Weesaw Township Hall, and the third (middle one) was posted on the corner of California Rd. and Pine St., downtown New Troy (Weesaw Township) for a number of days, at which time it was replaced by a professionally prepared sign that appeared to have been purchased from a sign company. The middle poster in this photo was the same poster as the copies found in the trash, except Mrs. Culverhouse had applied flag stickers in the corners, and covered it with a clear covering to protect it from the elements.
2. Exhibit 2: The five (5) signs are a composite photo of all posters that were pulled out of the trash receptacle next to the copy machine in the Township Hall.
3. Exhibit 3: This photo is an enlarged copy of the bottom portions from both the posted sign and one of the trash signs, pointing out the inaccurate verbiage (the campaign clause reads "... committee to *election* ..." and should have read "... committee to *elect* ..." [my italics]) on both the sign posted in the Township and the one pulled out of the trash.

We believe that this evidence presented to the State is sufficient to prove the violation. The photocopy sign posted in Weesaw Township (see Exhibit 1) stood for several days before it was replaced on July 13, 2012, by a professionally made sign, the same day the dated Exhibit 1 photograph was taken. This photocopy sign clearly violates the prohibition against the use of Weesaw Township property and equipment for personal gain. As the Township Clerk for a 4-year term of office, and having attended many training sessions and workshops on election procedures, paid for by the Township, she should have been well aware of this fact. You might also note that the \$2.50 paid receipt for five copies was inaccurate, as there were at least seven (7) copies of posters printed, not five (5) as indicated, and also that the receipt was both issued and signed by Melodie Culverhouse. In addition to Exhibit 1 posted at the corner of California and Vine and the five (5) trashed posters, another sign was posted on California Road near the Sawyer crossroad for at least one day, as it was seen by Wanda on two occasions that day, but was removed by the following day.

**Violation 2:** Violation of MCL 169-257 (Distributing Campaign Materials while in the Township Hall)

The following information was orally conveyed by Jack Hojara (Weesaw Township Fire Chief) to both Jack Jones and Wanda Green: Jack Hojara was given campaign literature by Clerk Melodie Culverhouse while

she was in her office in the Township Hall. He was asked by Mrs. Culverhouse if he had seen her group's campaign literature, and he stated that he had not. She proceeded to take the literature from her file cabinet drawer and gave it to him. He reported that, after a moment, it appeared that she thought better of what she had done. She then said to him that here's the other candidates' literature also, and handed that packet to him as well. The other candidates, of whom we were two, had neither given her any literature nor had we requested that she supply it to others – certainly not while on Township property. Note that she was a candidate on an opposing slate. In any event, campaign materials should not have been in her Township file cabinet, regardless of whether or not she supplied both sets of campaign literature to Mr. Hojara.


Regarding the discrepancy between Hojara's account of this incident to us and his signed statement: He may not have carefully read the statement he signed, which was a statement prepared by Mrs. Culverhouse for his signature and presented to him in the Notary Public's office. He has related to us that she had prepared an earlier statement, and that its content was inaccurate. He refused to sign it because she had written that she had given the literature to him in the Weesaw Township Fire Station. He reminded her of the actual circumstances of the literature exchange, and she consequently rewrote the letter and came back with this version at a later date. Just speculation, but perhaps, since he had told her the circumstances that had transpired, he felt the verbiage would be accurate and did not thoroughly read this version. We affirm that Hojara told both of us (Jack Jones and Wanda Green) about his being given the campaign literature by Mrs. Culverhouse in the Township Hall in the manner described above. He also stated that he would testify to this if asked about it, and was later told that Jack Jones was going to file a violation complaint. He affirmed that he would tell the truth about the whole event.

We might add that, in our opinion, Attorney Craig Rochau's final paragraph is both inflammatory and inaccurate, and we wholeheartedly disagree with this egregious statement.



Dear Mr. Rochau:

The Department of State (Department) has completed its investigation of complaints filed against your client, Melodie Culverhouse, by Wanda Green and Jack Jones, which alleged that Ms. Culverhouse violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 *et seq.* The Department has carefully considered all of the written statements and documentary evidence provided by the parties in this matter and issues this warning letter in resolution of both complaints.

It is unlawful for a public body or an individual acting on its behalf to use or authorize the use of equipment, supplies, personnel, funds, or other public resources to make a contribution or expenditure. MCL 169.257(1). The words "contribution" and "expenditure" are terms of art that are generally defined to include a payment or transfer of anything of ascertainable monetary value made for the purpose of influencing or made in assistance of the nomination or election of a candidate. MCL 169.204(1), 169.206(1). A person who knowingly violates this provision may be charged with a misdemeanor offense. MCL 169.257(3).

The definition of expenditure includes "a payment, donation, loan, or promise of payment of money or anything of ascertainable monetary value for goods, materials, services, or facilities in assistance of, or in opposition to, the nomination or election of a candidate [.]" MCL 169.206(1).

The Act also requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [.]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" *Id.*

Mr. Jones's complaint was filed on August 3, 2012. Ms. Green's complaint was filed on August 6, 2012. You filed a single answer on behalf of Ms. Culverhouse to both complaints on August 27, 2012, and the complainants filed a single rebuttal statement on September 6, 2012.

Ms. Green alleged that your client "used or directed to be used Weesaw Township property (copier) for the creation of 2012 primary election campaign posters [.]" Mr. Jones alleged that your client campaigned during business hours on township property. Mr. Jones provided a copy

of a campaign flyer that he alleged was given to Jack Hojara by Ms. Culverhouse while she was in her office in the township hall.

In response, you filed a statement from Ms. Culverhouse in which she admits to using the township copier "to determine whether or not it might be possible to enlarge a campaign sign by use of copier." You also provided a receipt to show that Ms. Culverhouse reimbursed the township petty cash fund \$2.50, which was paid at the normal reimbursement rate for personal use of the township copier. Additionally, Ms. Culverhouse stated that she posted three homemade signs, none of which were produced on the township copier, and had 10 signs produced by SignsPlus. You provided a sales receipt from SignsPlus with Ms. Culverhouse's statement. Ms. Culverhouse's statement also provided that Ms. Culverhouse gave Mr. Hojara a flyer for "both the slate of candidates [she] was running with and a copy of the 'flyer' that [her] opponent Wanda Green was running with." Lastly, you provided a notarized signed statement from Jack Hojara attesting that Ms. Culverhouse's response regarding her conversation with Mr. Hojara was "true and factual" and that Ms. Culverhouse gave him literature for "both the Melodie Culverhouse and Wanda Green slate of candidates [.]"

In their joint rebuttal statement, Ms. Green and Mr. Jones provided a picture of one of the homemade signs used by Ms. Culverhouse and noted that the displayed sign contained the same "inaccurate verbiage" as the copies "pulled out of the trash" at the township hall. They also alleged that Mr. Hojara's oral account to them regarding what took place at the township hall with respect to the flyers was inconsistent with Ms. Culverhouse's statement and Mr. Hojara's own signed statement that you provided.


After reviewing all of the evidence submitted, the Department believes that the evidence tends to show that Ms. Culverhouse used the township property to further her candidacy by using the copier to attempt to enlarge her homemade campaign signs. Section 15(10) of the MCFA requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods such as a conference, conciliation, or persuasion [.]". The Department does not believe that Ms. Culverhouse displayed any signs that were made by the copier, but does believe that the evidence tends to show that her use of the copier to experiment with the size of the signs was a technical violation of the MCFA. The Department is, however, satisfied that Ms. Culverhouse's reimbursement to the township for the copies was an appropriate corrective measure. It is the same measure that would have been sought by the Department through a conciliation agreement.

However, please note that the Department is advising your client that it is unlawful for a public body or an individual acting on its behalf to use or authorize the use of equipment, supplies, personnel, funds, or other public resources to make a contribution or expenditure. MCL 169.257(1). Additionally, this notice has served to remind Ms. Culverhouse of this provision of the Act and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act. A knowing violation is a misdemeanor offense and may merit referral to the Attorney General for enforcement action. MCL 169.257(3).

Finally, the Department believes that Mr. Hojara's notarized written statement adequately answers the allegation contained in Mr. Jones's complaint.

The Department now considers this matter closed and will take no further action against your client at this time.
