Ladies and Gentlemen:

The Department of State (Department) received formal complaints filed by Christian Kindsvatter against each of you, alleging that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign material. Copies of the complaints are provided as an enclosure with this letter.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), Mich. Admin. R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

In support of his complaints, Mr. Kindsvatter provided two copies of a flyer which states, "Please vote on August 2nd! Keep your existing elected officials [.]" There does not appear to be a paid-for-by statement on the flyer.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to

understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true.

If you wish to file a written response to the complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. You may each submit an answer, or you may submit one answer signed by each of you. Please include any evidence that reflects any corrective measures you have taken to bring your campaign material into compliance with the MCFA. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your reply will be provided to Mr. Kindsvatter, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 47(6) of the Act.

Attached are 4 complaints filings for those candidates asking to be reelection to Burt Township Board and offices as well as an additional complaint for a new candidate running for a board position in Burt Township, Cheboygan County, Michigan. The 5 complaints are supported with documentation.

I and another person did meet with candidate's Koviak and Hodulik on July 11, 2016 to ask that their yard signage and printed material as well as the other candidates running with them as a group had lacked the required identifier on them. We were assured that the signs would be corrected and were 7 days later with stickers applied but although still a violation. As for the June 29, 2016 mass mailing sent to township residents, we asked that a notice be sent to let all that received that mass mailing be informed of the missing identifier of the mailing and who paid for the mailings. We were told that the 5 committees paid for the mailing and that they did not know that was the requirement in a campaign to identify. They felt it was out and over and nothing could be done.

I see that the same mailing is now being used as a door to door distribution on July 25th and still not a identifier on it. It becomes concerning that presently elected township officials do not know the requirements to be reelected but nor do they care and hence the filed complaint enclosed.

As a side note, my wife is running for Burt Township Clerk and what is good for one is also good for the others.



Re: Complaint Regarding Non-Compliance with Michigan Campaign Finance Act

Dear Ms. Bourbonais:

We are writing in response to your letter dated August 3, 2016. In that letter there is an allegation made by Mr. Christian Kindsvatter that there was a violation of section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign material. The campaign material referenced was a letter which was mailed to some, but not all, of the registered voters of Burt Township on June 29 and 30, 2016. This letter had also been given to campaign volunteers who were doing some door to door canvassing for the undersigned candidates.

Mr. Kindsvatter requested a meeting with Supervisor Koviak and Trustee Hodulik and this meeting took place on July 11, 2016. At that meeting Mr. Kindsvatter, whose wife was running for Clerk, kindly informed Supervisor Koviak and Trustee Hodulik that he felt there had been a violation of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act because of the mailing on June 29 and 30, 2016. He indicated to Supervisor Koviak and Trustee Hodulik that the mailing had to contain a complete and correct identification statement. Supervisor Koviak and Trustee Hodulik both informed Mr. Kindsvatter at that time that they did not realize that this was a requirement of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act and that every effort would be made to insure compliance in the future. Supervisor Koviak and Trustee Hodulik immediately contacted the other candidates to inform them of the potential problem.

There was no way to recall the letter mailed on June 29 and 30, 2016. However, the candidates contacted the volunteers for their various campaigns and informed them not to use the letter as a handout. A second mailing was done by the candidate committees on Monday, July 25, 2016. A copy of that mailing is enclosed as Exhibit 1. The second mailing had the section 47(1) disclosures printed on it.

This was the first contested election in Burt Township in several election cycles and candidates Koviak, McDougall, Reimann and Hodulik, who were running for reelection, were unaware of the section 47(1) requirements for written campaign materials. Candidate Parker is a first time candidate for elective office and was also unaware of the section 47(1) requirements.

All of the undersigned candidates assert that they did not knowingly and intentionally violate section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act. All of the undersigned state that upon being informed by Mr. Kindsvatter that there had been a potential violation, they took immediate corrective action. The undersigned also assert that they have each now studied the section 47(1) requirements for printed campaign materials. The undersigned candidates each apologize for the mistake in allowing the letter to be sent and/or used as a campaign handout without including thereon the identification statement required by section 47(1). The undersigned assert that they are now aware of the requirement to include a complete and correct identification statement on printed campaign materials and will see to it that no future violations occur.

The budget is on the web site for all to see and is audited by an independent CPA.

Open communication with all citizens/taxpayers

Web site, newsletters, surveys, public comment at all meetings. We answer all your phone calls.

Involvement of all citizen/taxpayers in policies, decisions & ordinances

You're all welcome to come to all meetings. Sure was lots of involvement regarding that park proposal. (As California has shown, referendums are overrated.)

The return of local government to the desires of the community

Not sure what this means. Did it move to Cheboygan, Lansing or Washington? Or are they talking about the desires of a few unhappy people with a negative, inaccurate campaign.

Improved Quality of life

They have offered no positions, plans or projects to improve this. Actually, our quality of life in Burt Township is very good. Please re-elect us.

Preservation of water quality in our lake

The most important thing is keeping our stringent, lake friendly setback and greenbelt zoning and continue pushing for tougher septic system rules on property transfers.

Improvements in our road system

The current board has given money to the county (Which is responsible for the roads) to make several improvements. Township millage has paid for paving Eaglesnest, Numbers, Service and both Transfer Station Roads and Tar/chip of Feather Lane. A \$47,000 upgrade of Indian Point (dirt road) is scheduled for this summer.

The Truth About the Trail

Unfortunately, the Burt Lake Trail has become a major campaign issue based on serious misrepresentation of reality. Burt Township taxpayers need not worry they'll be saddled forever with "Millions of dollars in maintenance costs" as some candidates and their sponsors have threatened. Here are the facts, from the executives at the responsible organizations:

Maintenance cost of paved shoulders

2. Phailing 7-25-16. has "paid for by" Brent Shank, P.E., Engineer/Manager, Cheboygan County Road Commission says "...The Road Commission will be responsible for the maintenance of paved shoulders. Paved shoulders will be maintained as part of normal road maintenance. The paved shoulders in the existing trail will be maintained by the Road Commission."

Maintenance cost of non-motorized paths

Jon Mayes, Manager of the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund confirms that our agreement is to just maintain the improvements "For their useful life" which the MNRTF defines as 20 years, maybe less on written request. "Forever" only refers to the corridor, or land easement, which must remain open and available for public recreation in perpetuity. So our financial obligation is limited and manageable, not open ended and immeasurable.

Future obligations

Maintenance costs for Phase I (Maple Bay to Hogsback) are budgeted at \$5,000 (\$1,000 per mile), in 2016 based on our experience and that of accepted authorities on the subject. Future plans to connect all the way to Topinabee will be funded by MDOT or MNRTF grants or the Cheboygan County Road commission's plan to include paved shoulders in upcoming road improvements. Part of the easement through U of M property is in Munro Township, which has agreed to cover their maintenance costs. As with many major projects, there were some needs for improvement. Do to erosion, \$34,000 was spent in 2015 and 2016 to pave three hills. The engineering firm did not charge us for their additional work devoted to these improvements.

The non-motorized trail is the township's major public recreation expense and is very well used. The Parks and Recreation budget accounts for about 5% of the total budget, a small price to allow people to walk, run and ride safely. We're very fortunate to receive capital improvement funds in the millions of dollars while committing to a modest operating and maintenance cost to support healthy recreation.

Please vote on August 2 based on facts and performance, not political misinformation and vague promises.

Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

The Department of State (Department) has completed its investigation of the complaints filed against each of you by Christian Kindsvatter, which alleged that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign-related material. This letter concerns the disposition of Mr. Kindsvatter's complaint.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

The Act also requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" Id.

Mr. Kindsvatter filed his complaint on July 27, 2016, and you filed one written response signed by each of you on August 22, 2016. Mr. Kindsvatter did not file a rebuttal statement with the Department.

Mr. Kindsvatter alleged that you failed to include a paid-for-by statement on your campaign flyer. In support of his complaint, Mr. Kindsvatter provided a copy of the flyer which was titled, "Your Burt Township Board – Serving You With Experience and Dedication [.]" It appeared that you omitted the paid-for-by statement from the flyer.

In your response you stated that your original flyer did not include an identification statement. However, once Mr. Kindsvatter brought the omission to Mr. Koviak's and Mr. Hodulik's attention, Mr. Koviak and Mr. Hodulik contacted the other candidates immediately, and you contacted all of your volunteers and informed them to no longer hand out the flyer. You indicated that prior to the omission being brought to your attention, the flyer had been mailed to some registered voters in your township.

You also stated in your letter that your candidate committees sent a second mailing which included a flyer with a complete and proper paid-for-by statement.

While the Department believes that the evidence tends to show that your original campaign material failed to contain a paid-for-by statement and a technical violation did occur, the Department is satisfied that you took appropriate corrective measures prior to this complaint being filed.

The Department is advising you that section 47(1) and R 169.36(2) require you to print a complete and accurate identification statement on all campaign materials, consisting of the phrase "paid for by" followed by the full name and address of your committee. Note that all printed materials that refer to an election or your candidacy produced in the future must include this identification statement.

Please be advised that this notice has served to remind you of your obligation under the Act to identify your printed matter, and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act. A knowing violation is a misdemeanor offense and may merit referral to the Attorney General for enforcement action. MCL 169.247(6), 215(10).
