Dear Mr. Robinson:

The Department of State (Department) received a formal complaint filed by Dawn Martin against you, alleging that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign materials. A copy of the complaint is provided as an enclosure with this letter.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), Mich. Admin. R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

In support of her complaint, Ms. Martin provided a copy of a business card which states, "ELECT DENNIS ROBINSON Lake County SHERIFF [.]" The paid-for-by statement on the business card appears to omit your committee's address. Ms. Martin also provided an ad appearing in the September 29, 2016 <u>The Bulletin Board News</u> which states, "ELECT SHERIFF DENNIS ROBINSON [.]" There does not appear to be a paid-for-by statement on the ad.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. <u>It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true.</u>

If you wish to file a written response to the complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Please include any evidence that reflects any corrective measures you have taken to bring your campaign material into compliance with the MCFA. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your reply will be provided to Ms. Martin, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the statements and materials

provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 47(6) of the Act.



Section 15(8) of the MCFA provides that a person who files a complaint with a false certification is responsible for a civil violation of the MCFA. The person may be required to pay a civil fine of up to \$1,000.00 and some or all of the expenses incurred by the Michigan Department of State and the alleged violator as a direct result of the filing of the complaint.

COMPLAINT PROCESS

<u>Section 15</u> of the MCFA governs the filing and processing of complaints. If you believe someone has violated the MCFA, you may file a written complaint. The complaint **must** include all of the following:

- Your name, address and telephone number.
- The alleged violator's name and address.
- A description in reasonable detail of the alleged violation, including the section or sections of the MCFA you believe were violated, an explanation of how you believe the MCFA was violated, and any other pertinent information.
- Evidence which supports your allegations.
- A certification that:

To the best of your knowledge, information, and belief, formed after a reasonable inquiry under the circumstances, each factual contention of the complaint is supported by evidence.

• If after a reasonable inquiry under the circumstances, you are unable to certify that certain specifically identified factual contentions of the complaint are supported by evidence, you may also certify that:

To the best of your knowledge, information, or belief, there are grounds to conclude that those specifically identified factual contentions are likely to be supported by evidence after a reasonable opportunity for further inquiry.

Your signature immediately after the certification or certifications.

WARNING: Section 15(8) of the MCFA (MCL 169.215) provides that a person who files a complaint with a false certification is responsible for a civil violation of the MCFA. Under section 15(16) of the MCFA (MCL 169.215), the Secretary of State may require a person who files a complaint with a false certification to:

- Pay the Department some or all of the expenses incurred by the Department as a direct result of the filing of the complaint.
- Pay the alleged violator some or all of the expenses, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorney fees, incurred by that person as a direct result of the filing of the complaint.
- Pay a civil fine of up to \$1,000.00.

A compliant may be dismissed if any required information is not included, or if the complaint is determined to be frivolous, illegible, or indefinite. All parties are notified of dismissed complaints.

When a complaint meets the above requirements, the Department notifies the alleged violator that a complaint has been filed and provides a copy of the complaint. The alleged violator will have an opportunity to file a response. The compliant filer will have an opportunity to file a rebuttal to any response. All parties receive periodic reports concerning the actions taken by the Department on a complaint.

If the Department finds no reason to believe that the allegations are true, the complaint will be dismissed.

If the Department finds that there may be reason to believe your allegations are true, the Department must attempt to correct the violation or prevent further violations by informal methods such as a conference, conciliation, or persuasion, and may enter into a conciliation agreement with the alleged violator.


If the Department is unable to correct the violation or prevent further violations informally, an administrative hearing may be held to determine whether a civil violation of the MCFA has occurred, or the matter may be referred to the Attorney General for the enforcement of criminal penalties. An administrative hearing could result in the assessment of a civil penalty. Such a hearing would be conducted in accordance with the Michigan Administrative Procedures Act. An order issued as a result of such a hearing may be appealed to the appropriate circuit court.

Accepted complaints and all supporting documentation including responses and rebuttal statements are made available on the Department's website as required by the MCFA at the conclusion of the process.



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

Ladies and Gentlemen:

With regard to your attached letter pertaining to a formal complaint filed by Dawn Martin, we respectfully submit the following explanation and associated remedies.

Complaint Item #1 – Committee address omitted from business card. When it was revealed to the candidate, shortly after receiving this 1st run of business cards in the Spring of 2016, that the "gmail address" was inadequate to satisfy the address requirement rule, he purchased a label maker and painstakingly added the committee mailing address to each card. He also made attempts to recover the small amount of cards that had been already been handed out, which did not contain the committee mailing address. After handing out several hundred of the corrected cards containing the address label, it was discovered that making the labels was just to costly, as well as labor intensive, and that the labels could be peeled off the cards much too easily. Shortly thereafter, Candidate Robinson made the decision to abandon distribution of those business cards, and he did personally destroy the remaining 4,000 business cards during the first week of July 2016. It is possible that a few of those cards still linger out in the public hands, but every attempt was made to resolve this oversight.

Complaint Item #2 — "Paid-for-by" statement not appearing in Bulletin Board News Ad. This was a publisher error. When the error was discovered, the publisher was contacted, and immediately took action to correct the Ad. In addition, the words "Lake County" were also added to the Ad, as was originally requested when the election date was updated to reflect the General Election date. A copy of the corrected Ad is attached.

Dear Mr. Robinson:

The Department of State (Department) has completed its investigation of the complaint filed against you by Dawn Martin, which alleged that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign-related material. This letter concerns the disposition of Ms. Martin's complaint.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

The Act also requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" Id.

Ms. Martin filed her complaint on October 3, 2016. You filed a written response on November 2, 2016. Ms. Martin did not file a rebuttal statement with the Department.

Ms. Martin alleged that you failed to include a paid-for-by statement on a campaign ad. In support of this allegation, Ms. Martin provided the ad in the September 29, 2016 *The Bulletin Board News*, which stated, "ELECT SHERIFF DENNIS ROBINSON [.]" The ad did not appear to contain a paid-for-by statement. Ms. Martin further alleged that the paid-for-by statement on your campaign business cards, which stated "ELECT DENNIS ROBINSON LAKE COUNTY SHERIFF [,]" failed to include your committee's address.

In your response to the complaint you stated that the omission of your paid-for-by statement from your campaign ad was a "publisher error" and that a corrected ad ran in the October 27, 2016 issue of *The Bulletin Board News*. You provided a copy of the corrected ad, which appeared to contain a complete and correct paid-for-by statement. You also stated that the omission of the committee's address from the paid-for-by statement on your campaign business cards was corrected prior to the complaint being filed. You explained that shortly after the campaign received the first run of business cards, it learned that the email address did not satisfy

the section 47 requirement to include the committee's address. You further explained that as soon as this was brought to you attention you first attempted to correct the remaining cards with a label and then destroyed the remaining cards during July of 2016.

While the Department believes that the evidence tends to show that your original campaign material failed to contain a complete and correct paid-for-by statement, section 15(10) of the MCFA requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods such as a conference, conciliation, or persuasion [.]" The Department is satisfied that you took appropriate corrective measures to bring your campaign material into compliance with the MCFA.

Additionally, the Department is advising you that section 47(1) and R 169.36(2) require you to print a complete and accurate identification statement on all campaign materials, consisting of the phrase "paid for by" followed by the full name and address of your committee. Note that all printed materials that refer to an election or your candidacy produced in the future must include this identification statement.

Please be advised that this notice has served to remind you of your obligation under the Act to identify your printed matter, and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act. A knowing violation is a misdemeanor offense and may merit referral to the Attorney General for enforcement action. MCL 169.247(6), 215(10).

The Department now considers this matter closed and will take no further action against you at this time.
