Dear Ms. Chatten, Mr. Palmer, Mr. Potocki, and Mr. Sarna:

The Department of State (Department) received formal complaints filed by Buddy Moorehouse against each of you, alleging that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign material. A copy of the complaint is provided as an enclosure with this letter.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), Mich. Admin. R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

In support of his complaints, Mr. Moorehouse provided a copy of a business card which states, "Supervisor – Jim Sarna [,] Clerk – Bob Potocki [,] Trustee – Anna Chatten [,] Trustee – Mike Palmer [.]" The paid-for-by statement on this card appears to omit the words "paid for by" and your committees' addresses.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. <u>It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true.</u>

If you wish to file a written response to the complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. You may each submit an answer, or you may submit one answer signed by each of you. Please include any evidence that reflects any corrective measures you have taken to bring your campaign material into compliance with the MCFA. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your reply will be provided to Mr. Moorehouse, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 47(6) of the Act.

Any item not included in this list is <u>not</u> exempt from the Act's identification and disclaimer requirements, and must contain an identification statement, and il applicable, a disclaimer statement.

Committee Address Change

A committee that has filed an amendment to its Statement of Organization to show a change of committee address is not required to note the change of address on printed matter it previously purchased as long as the printed matter contains an identification statement that was correct at the time the printed matter was produced.

D. CAMPAIGN FINANCE REPORTS

Campaign finance reports are required by Michigan law to disclose all contributions and expenditures of a candidate committee.

1. When are campaign finance reports due?

Dear Mr. Everard:

This is in response to your three separate requests of May 2, 1978, concerning the applicability of the identification requirements of the Campaign Finance Act ("the Act"), P.A. 388 of 1976, as amended, to various advertising specialties.

The first inquiry concerns the necessity of an identification on plastic discs. commonly sold under the trade name of Frisbee. You state that copy is silk-screened on these discs and, therefore, small type sizes do not reproduce well. Further, imprint area is restricted to the center portion and ranges from 4" to 4 1/2" in diameter, depending on the size of the disc selected. According to the catalog sheet included in your request, three diameter sizes are offered - 7 1/4", 8 3/4", and 9 1/4". In addition, you mention an identification would force copy into curved lettering which increases the cost of the article.

Your second request involves cloth pot holders, 6" x 6" and 7" x 7", for which you state an identification would appear illegible because of the problem of printing on the rough surface of the cloth. You indicate in order for the identification to be readable, large size type would be necessary. Space limitations serve to make the use of large type impractical.

Your third request involves two samples of political advertising cards. One sample, which measures 3 3/4" x 2 1/4", has the picture of a candidate on the front side and the name and various campaign positions of the candidate printed on the reverse side. The second sample, similar in size, opens in the middle to display a monthly calendar of 1978.

Section 47 of the Act (MCLA § 169.247) requires printed matter having reference to a candidate to bear the name and address of the person paying for the matter. The provision states, however, that rules may be promulgated to exempt items from the required identification. Rule 169.36 of the General Rules, premulgated by the Secretary of State pursuant to authority conferred by Section 15 of the Act (MCLA § 169.215) and having the effect of law, exempts campaign items, the size of which makes it unreasonable to add an identification.


In its role as principal administrator of the Act, the Department determines it would be unreasonable to require printing of an identification on plastic discs of the type indicated in your request in instances where the orinting is done by a silk-screened process. Similarly, cloth pot holders of the type presented in your second inquiry are also exempted from the identification requirements for the same reason.

However, the political advertising cards described in your third query must bear the identification required by the Act. It is not unreasonable in this instance to require the printing of the identification.

Additional Information:

- We do not know Mr Moorehouse.
- 2. He does not live within the Brighton Township Voting District.
- 3. Biographical information indicates he is a long-time political veteran. A Pro.
- The business card at issue was the first piece of literature created by neighbors who are sick and tired of the many violations of our legal rights by our township.
- As citizens we decided to participate in the political process to try and make a difference.
- It was our first joint expenditure that totaled about \$25.
- At the time it was created, we believed the card legally disclosed sponsorship
 because it clearly listed the names of our committees and the names and addresses
 of the committees are on file with the county clerk.
- 8. We sincerely believe the intent of the law was met and that any reasonable person would have no trouble finding us.
- All remaining cards have been removed from circulation and destroyed. All future literature will be scrutinized for strict technical compliance.

Based on the above, we believe the complaint is frivolous and adds no value or integrity to the election process. In fact, it appears to be harassment and interference with the valid constitutional rights of citizens to participate in their government. Initiated by an experienced political actor.

We trust this will satisfy the Bureau of Elections concerns and will allow you to drop the complaint without prejudice.

Dear Ms. Chatten, Mr. Palmer, Mr. Potocki, and Mr. Sarna:

The Department of State (Department) has completed its investigation of the complaints filed against you by Buddy Moorehouse, which alleged that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign-related material. This letter concerns the disposition of Mr. Moorehouse's complaints.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

The Act also requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" Id.

Mr. Moorehouse filed his complaint on July 8, 2016. Mr. Palmer filed a response on July 23, 2016. Mr. Sarna filed a written response on July 28, 2016, and a supplemental response was filled by Mr. Sarna, Mr. Potocki, and Ms. Chatten on August 1, 2016. Mr. Moorehouse did not file a rebuttal statement with the Department.

Mr. Moorehouse alleged that you failed to include a complete paid-for-by statement on a business card. In support of his complaint, Mr. Moorehouse provided a copy of the business card which stated, "Supervisor – Jim Sarna [,] Clerk – Bob Potocki [,] Trustee – Anna Chatten [,] Trustee – Mike Palmer [.]" The paid-for-by statement on the business card appeared to omit your committees' addresses.

In your responses you admitted that your business cards were not in compliance with the Act at the time the complaint was filed, but once the omission was brought to your attention you destroyed the cards in question and printed new campaign material with the correct and complete paid-for-by statements on them. You provided a copy of the new campaign piece, and it appears that this new material contained complete and correct paid-for-by statements.

While the Department believes that the evidence tends to show that your campaign material failed to contain a complete paid-for-by statement, section 15(10) of the MCFA requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods such as a conference, conciliation, or persuasion [.]" The Department is satisfied that you took appropriate corrective measures to bring your campaign material into compliance with the MCFA.

Additionally, the Department is advising you that section 47(1) and R 169.36(2) require you to print a complete and accurate identification statement on all campaign materials, consisting of the phrase "paid for by" followed by the full name and address of your committee. Note that all printed materials that refer to an election or your candidacy produced in the future must include this identification statement.

Please be advised that this notice has served to remind you of your obligation under the Act to identify your printed matter, and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act. A knowing violation is a misdemeanor offense and may merit referral to the Attorney General for enforcement action. MCL 169.247(6), 215(10).

The Department now considers this matter closed and will take no further action against you at this time.
