Dear Ms. Stone:

The Department of State (Department) received a formal complaint filed by Charlotte LaFeve against you, alleging that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on your campaign signs. A copy of Ms. LaFeve's complaint is provided as an enclosure with this letter.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(5).

In support of her complaint, Ms. LaFeve provided a copy of a card which states "Vote For Constance 'Connie' Stone For Treasurer [,]" and a flyer which states "Please vote on Aug 7th [.]" It appears that there is no paid for by statement on the card or flyer.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. <u>It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true.</u>

If you wish to file a written response to this complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Please include any evidence that reflects any corrective measures you have taken to bring your campaign material into compliance with the MCFA. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your reply will be provided to Ms. LaFeve, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's

enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 47(5) of the Act.

Dear Union Township Voters,

My name is **Constance (Connie) Stone** I am currently a Union Township Trustee and Deputy Clerk. You may have seen me sitting at the Election table when you have come into vote. I have worked every aspect in the elections when I haven't been on the ballot. You may also know me as Jerry the telephone mans wife.

We have lived in Union Township since 1993. We returned to the area after Jerry retired from the USMC. We bought our property on Grand Kal Rd in 1977. While Jerry was in the Marine Corp I worked in various jobs from daily sales entry, accounts receivable/payable at dealerships in California and Traverse City, I worked as teller for Marine Federal Credit Union in NC, customer service manager for Navy Federal Credit Union on Okinawa Japan and as vault teller on Okinawa for the National Bank of Fort Sam Houston where I was responsible for millions of dollars on military paydays. I also managed a Propane and Ice Company in Beaufort SC. All of these jobs required managing money, check books and balancing various accounts.

I am running for Union Township Treasurer this year. I see that there needs to be a change in this position. While sitting on the board I see things happening that should not be happening. The current Treasurer has had problems balancing the Tax Account. This has resulted in "1" NSF check in April 2011 where we were charged a \$20.00 NSF fee, the tax account had been zeroed out and there was still an outstanding check on this account. The Clerk had to transfer funds back into the tax account from the general fund. There was a problem with making a deposit on time and writing checks against the account resulting in "3" NSF checks. The deposit was made weeks later when trying to balance the tax account at the end of the month. This deposit was given to her daughter who is an employee at the financial institution and who is not bonded by Union Township.. The envelope was returned to the Treasurer unopened. She then laid it on her desk and did not bother to open it and look at the deposit slip. Which it did not contain a deposit slip instead it contained her checks that were suppose to be deposited. The Treasurer thought the NFS check was because a taxpayers check had bounced in the amount of \$24,814.35. Union Township does not have a taxpayer that pays that much in taxes. She should have know this. The financial institution did wave the fees but we felt that this was not the financial institutions fault and we paid the \$75.00 in fees. Then again this year the current Treasurer zeroed out the tax account and there was yet another outstanding check which had not cleared the account and bounced. The financial institution covered the check, charged us with yet another NSF fee of \$25.00 but they waived the fee. The Clerk transferred the funds from the General Fund into the Tax Account to cover this check.

There are **two** important jobs that the Treasurer is paid to preform and the current Treasurer is not doing either. One is balancing and printing the tax bills, this is being done by the assessor. Two is the general fund, this is being done by the Clerk. If the current Treasurer can not keep track of her tax account she surely could not work and balance the general fund.

I have attached our minutes of the meetings so you can read this for yourself. If you feel that there needs to be a change then I feel that I am your person. I have the experience in accounting and record keeping. But, as in any new job I will have to learn this job but I feel that I can do this with ease and the assistance of fellow Treasures in Grand Traverse County. I hope that I can count on your vote in the August 7th election.

No Sheriff Report

County Commissioner, Larry Inman gave a brief update.

Dean Bott, Candidate for County Treasurer was in attendance. Shared his background with the Board.

No Public Comment

Treasurer report. LaFeve provided the Board with a reconciliation report and a BS&A Report on how funds are distributed. She also submitted a letter to the Board to clear up any misunderstandings regarding some returned checks on March 8, 2012 written from the tax account. (Attached) At this time, Mansfield and Tillitson explained to the Board what they found out when they paid a visit to Forest Area Federal Credit Union and spoke to the CEO of the company, Merri Nixon. At that time, it was our clear understanding that our Treasurer was at fault for not making a deposit on time and we agreed to pay the 75.00 in (3) NSF fees. It was taken out of the General Fund Savings (due to the tax account had been zeroed out) and we were given a receipt for it at that time.

Clerk reports that General Funds are in balance with the bank. Year End written checks:#'s 6527&6528 Total \$406.12
Bills to be paid: Ck#'s 6529-6534. Record Eagle (legal notice Annual meeting and Budget Hearing)63.50, Ace communications 35.47, Forest Area Services 59.55, Wilderness Outdoor Services 160.00, Consumers 33.84 and G.T Rural Fire Dept. 2707.25 (2nd Quarter) Payroll for March Ck.# 6517-6526 (2) Direct Deposit TOTAL:\$4676.50. 941 taxes paid \$344.09, State Withholding paid \$154.03 and Michigan UI Tax paid electronically on 3/27/2012-6.42. Wieland motioned to pay bills as presented, LaFeve seconded. Roll Call Vote: All Yeas. Carried.

Tillitson reported she will be attending the Clerk's meeting on April 12, 2012, at Garfield Town Hall. This meeting will be 3-4 hours long due to putting together the training classes needed for the Election Inspector training that is coming up in July for 2 weeks. Stone and Tillitson will also be attending a class on April 17, 2012 at East Bay. It is a mandatory class by the State Of Michigan Election Bureau for all Clerks and Deputy Clerks.

We received a contract from American Waste for Clean up. We as a Board already passed a motion not to have the Clean up Day every year. Set a letter to Mark stating so.

Tillitson reported that some budget line items needed to be amended before the budget can be balanced. Stone motioned to take \$1252.16 from Township Contractual services and put \$1060.59 into the Supervisor account, \$61.97 into the Clerks account and \$129.60 into the Treasurer account. LaFeve seconded. Roll Call Vote. Yeas: Mansfield, Stone, Wieland, LaFeve and Tillitson. Carried.

Mansfield reported on attending the following meetings: Fire Board April 18th, Supervisor's April 11th, County Chapter April 5th. Mansfield also presented to the Board His interest in going to the MTA Spring 2012 Regional Meeting being held in Thompsonville. Stone motioned to pay the registration fee. Wieland seconded. Carried

Treasurer report. LaFeve provided the Board with a Bank Statement for the tax account and stated that there is no activity at this time. Mansfield asked if Clerk accepts the report. Tillitson stated that there was activity with this account. LaFeve called me on May 1, 2012 telling me that a check written from the tax account in the amount of \$262.35 was returned for NSF due to the tax account being cleared out at year end. Apparently, the check was written to Verizon Wireless on January 22nd and was not cashed until May 1st. LaFeve asked to have the 262.35 transferred back into the tax account. On March 15, 2012, LaFeve gave the Clerk two receipts for deposits made that day. #3721 in the amount of 262.35 (1ml from special assess). # 3722 in the amount of 97.65 (1ml from special assess). Tillitson stated that the outstanding check should have showed on her reconciliation report. This same thing happened last year at year end. The tax account was closed out before all checks cleared. \$17.31 had to be put back into the tax account on April 14, 2011 and an overdraft fee of \$20.00 was charged to the Township. LaFeve's explanation, "chalk it up to another screw up of mine".

Clerk reports that General Funds are in balance with the bank.

They also gave us a ballpark figure to fix the windows in the main room of the Hall. They offered to do one window at cost to see what it is going to entail. The Department of State (Department) has completed its investigation of a complaint filed against you by Charlotte LaFeve, which alleged that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete identification statement on your campaign material. This letter concerns the disposition of Ms. LaFeve's complaint.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(5).

The Act also requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" Id.

The complaint was filed by Ms. LaFeve on August 8, 2012, and you filed a written response on August 23, 2012. Ms. LaFeve did not file a rebuttal statement.

Ms. LaFeve alleged that neither your campaign card nor campaign flyer contained a paid-for-by statement. Ms. LaFeve provided as evidence one of your campaign cards which states "vote For Constance 'Connie' Stone For Treasurer [,]" and a copy of a campaign flyer which states "Please vote on Aug 7th [.]" It appears that there is no paid-for-by statement on the card or flyer.

In response, you filed a letter which stated that you produced your campaign material yourself, and that you did not know that "if [you] printed this material [yourself] in [your] home that [you] had to put 'Paid For By'" on the material. You also stated that you did not solicit or receive funds, and that you would take any steps necessary to correct the violation. You indicated in a telephone conversation that although you will appear on the November ballot, you will not be producing any campaign materials.

While the Department believes that the evidence tends to show that your campaign material failed to contain a proper paid-for-by statement, section 15(10) of the MCFA requires the

Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods such as a conference, conciliation, or persuasion [.]"

In order to comply with the Act, any literature that you distribute that relates to a future election and has already been printed must be remedied by affixing a sticker to it with the appropriate paid-for-by identification statement.

Additionally, the Department is advising you that section 47(1) and R 169.36(2) require you to print a complete and accurate identification statement on all campaign materials, consisting of the phrase "paid for by" followed by the full name and address of your committee. Note that all printed materials that refer to an election or your candidacy produced in the future must include this identification statement.

Please be advised that this notice has served to remind you of your obligation under the Act to identify your printed matter, and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act. A knowing violation is a misdemeanor offense and may merit referral to the Attorney General for enforcement action. MCL 169.247(5), 215(10).

The Department now considers this matter closed and will take no further action against you at this time.
