Sections of MCFA alleged to be violated and explanations of how those sections were violated:

Per MCL 169.245 et seq., unexpended funds of a candidate committee (that cannot be transferred to another committee) can only be disbursed to a political party committee, a tax-exempt organization (as long as the candidate does not become an officer or director or receive compensation directly from that organization), return funds to the contributor (including the candidate) that don't exceed the amount originally contributed by the person, give to an independent committee, or give to a ballot question.

This complaint alleges that now Judge Hartwell violated MCL 169.245(2) by not disbursing \$12,775.86 of unexpended candidate committee funds in accordance with the provisions of that statute.

Per MCL 169.206 et seq., an expenditure is defined as a payment for goods, materials, or services in assistance of, or in opposition to the nomination or election of a candidate.

This complaint alleges that Judge Hartwell violated MCL 169.206 et seq., as the *Committee to Elect Brian Hartwell for Mayor of Madison Heights* would not have been making expenditures to be elected as the next Mayor of Madison Heights. Specifically, 2020 is a non-election year. Also, in 2020, Judge Hartwell filed a candidate committee for the purpose of running for Judge of 43rd District Court.

Per MCL 169.209(1), an incidental expense is "an expenditure that is an ordinary and necessary expense, paid or incurred in the carrying out the business of an elective office." The statute defines a number of incidental expenses such as (but not limited to) constituent assistance and communications, supplies and equipment for the office of the public official, polling, marketing, etc. that is NOT for the purpose of campaign related activity.

This complaint alleges that the items purchased by the Committee to Elect Brian Hartwell for Mayor of Madison Heights from April 2, 2020 through June 9, 2020 **could not** be considered incidental expenses that were ordinary and necessary for carrying out the business of the office of Mayor. Particularly when one expense was made on the date that Mr. Hartwell was officially appointed to the Judge of the 43rd District Court, and would have known in advance of that date that he had been selected for that position by the Governor's Office to serve out the former Judge Goedert's term.

Timeline of events supporting the allegations of Campaign Finance violations:

Week of March 17, Judge Goedert resigned from the 43rd district court.

<u>March 27, 2020</u> - Candidate Committee Friends of Brian Hartwell for Judge of 43rd District Court (Committee ID 519571) formed. Per the Amended Pre-Primary report, some key transactions include:

- April 2, 2020 Friends of Brian Hartwell committee purchases \$914 in handwipes. No donations are listed until April 22 and the expense is not listed as an in-kind donation.
- April 22, 2020 Mr. Hartwell lists first contribution (loan) to Friends of Brian Hartwell committee of \$1,000.
- May 11, 2020, Friends of Brian Hartwell Committee purchases \$2,624 in masks from Formosa Group*.
- May 30, 2020, Friends of Brian Hartwell Committee purchases ads from Facebook for \$480.92.
- June 7, and June 8, 2020, Friends of Brian Hartwell Committee purchases ads from Facebook for \$74.77 and \$234.80 respectively.

<u>June 9, 2020</u> the <u>Committee to Elect Brian Hartwell for Mayor of Madison Heights</u> (Committee ID # 96303) was dissolved. The report, filed July 6, 2020 indicates the following transactions:

Ending balance from prior report = \$13,101.68 There were no debts or obligations listed (\$0)

Expenditures are noted as follows:

- 4/2/2020 Postage from United States Postal Service \$3,700
- 4/8/2020 Masks from Formosa Group LLC \$1,200*
- 4/15/2020 Printing EGT Printing Solutions \$6,073.87
- 6/9/2020 Laptop Computer HP, Inc. \$1,801.99
- This left a balance of \$325.82 which was distributed as refunds to donors (Kristen Hartwell, Ray Hartwell, Barbara Geralds, Lawrence Campbell).

The ending balance on this final report was \$0.

June 8, 2020 - Resigned as Mayor of Madison Heights. June 9, 2020 - Appointed Judge 43rd District June 9.

Additional items of concern

* <u>March 6, 2020</u> – Brian C. Harwell files articles of incorporation listing himself as resident agent and signing the document as the organizer of the LLC for Formosa Group, LLC. (ownership/membership unconfirmed).

If, Per MCL 169.245 et seq., unexpended funds of a candidate committee cannot be disbursed to a tax-exempt organization if the candidate is an officer or director or if they receive compensation directly from the organization, this would seem to indicate to pay candidate committee funds to any



organization of which a candidate is an officer or director or receives compensation directly from that organization to be prohibited.

Regarding purchases by both committees from Formosa Group, LLC, where now Judge Harwell is listed as resident agent and organizer; If Mr. Hartwell is a sole member or one of a group of members, is it permissible for a candidate to use campaign dollars to purchase goods or services from himself under the cover of an LLC?

Madison Heights mayor resigns, takes oath for Hazel Park judgeship

MADISON HEIGHTS/HAZEL PARK — Brian Hartwell is no longer the mayor of Madison Heights, following his resignation in order to become the new judge of Hazel Park 43rd District Court.

A licensed attorney, Hartwell was appointed by Gov. Gretchen Whitmer to fill a partial term ending Jan. 1, 2021, after Judge Charles Goedert stepped down due to health reasons in March. This required Hartwell to resign as mayor, which he officially did at the City Council meeting June 8. Hartwell has already indicated that he plans to run for the full six-year judicial term in this year's general election.

After he resigned as mayor, Hartwell was then sworn in for the judgeship the next day, June 9. Chief Judge Joseph Longo administered the oath of office in a court ceremony that was attended by Madison Heights 43rd District Court Judge Keith Hunt, as well as Hartwell's parents, his wife Lingyu Chen and the full court staff.

Roslyn Grafstein, the mayor pro tem of Madison Heights, is now the acting mayor, a role that she will serve until a permanent mayor is selected, which can occur in one of two ways. The six council members will first try to appoint one of the council members to serve as mayor for the remainder of Hartwell's term, which expires November 2021. This will require a majority vote. The council has 60 days from the date of Hartwell's resignation to decide on which council member will be mayor.

At press time June 17, the next earliest opportunity for the council to decide was at the council meeting scheduled for June 22.

If they are unable to agree on which council member should be mayor within the 60 days, the decision then falls on the residents in a special election in May. In either case, once a new mayor is selected, the resulting vacancy will be filled by automatically appointing the runner-up from the most recent council election.

"In this scenario, former Councilman Robert Gettings would return to the council, a veteran leader who would bring back a much-needed focus on recreation and public health," Hartwell said.

In his farewell address delivered June 8, Hartwell reminisced about his history on the council, starting in 2007 when he was elected to the council at 25 years old. He won the open seat left by the retirement of former City Councilwoman Toni Shad, and he said he owes her a debt of gratitude.

Hartwell recalled how he went into public service with rosy ambitions of implementing new initiatives but quickly found himself faced with the financial challenges of the Great Recession.

"My dreams of bringing new policies quickly were dashed by a focus on fiscal responsibility," Hartwell said. "Under the leadership of then City Manager Jon Austin, City Council saved this city from bankruptcy. The cuts we made were difficult but necessary at the time to preserve our institutions. We made mistakes, come to find out, but crisis demands assertive leadership."

Hartwell also took a moment to remember the people who helped him along the way.

"During my first year on council, Gary McGillivray, now our county commissioner, was my closest mentor. He was one of our finest councilmen and mayors because he spoke up for our residents and challenged old habits in City Hall," Hartwell said.

"It wasn't until Kyle Geralds was elected when I truly had a partner," he said. "Kyle brought a positive and constructive energy that made us get on board or out of his way. With Kyle, we proposed and adopted as many policies as we could: encouraging our police to work closer with the community, tackling blight, collaborating with the schools and of course, we co-authored the original domestic hen ordinance. Kyle knew he would serve one term, and he challenged me to serve with the same sense of urgency."

Hartwell's second term on council, which began in 2011, was defined by the lingering effects of the recession and the catastrophic flood of 2014.

"Aug. 11, 2014, changed everything for me and our city," Hartwell said. "Our city was too slow to respond to the emergency of the great rainstorm that year. We needed to declare a state of emergency sooner. We needed to be stronger against our neighbors who illegally dumped their waste in our backyard after the flood. That rain event galvanized my intention to seek the office of mayor a year later."

Hartwell's first term as mayor started in 2015 and saw the city recovering from the recession and enjoying a resurgence in property values. The council's first action once Hartwell became mayor was to reinstate the city's Special Investigations Unit to combat human trafficking in the city's hotels. Hartwell also called for an investigation into the electric company to stop the constant power outages.

"Remember, it wasn't too long ago when power would fail in our city every week," he said.

Hartwell said he is particularly proud of the city's work updating the plan for the downtown, adding that while the coronavirus has slowed the growth there, he is confident it will bounce back.

During his second term as mayor, which began in 2017, the council hired Melissa Marsh as the new city manager and adopted several commercial development plans, including Michigan's first BJ's Wholesale Club location, and two of the largest medical marijuana projects in state history. He also takes a point of pride in the city's ethnically diverse business

community.

"The secret formula to our success on City Council is that we take action when we see a problem. We are lifeguards who run towards the drowning victim. We aren't idle," Hartwell said. "I feel strongly that the people who run for City Council and mayor need three qualities: the awareness to identify problems in our society, the wisdom to understand the solution, and the courage and ability to execute the plan."

He also warned against cynicism — how fear of a new approach can stunt the city's progress.

"I beg my colleagues on council: Do not be distracted or delayed by cynics," Hartwell said. "This isn't to say disregard criticism. As a matter of fact, the best advice I received during my first year on City Council was to not be distracted by how someone from the public addresses City Council. They may yell, shout, use coarse language or seem ill prepared. Some people just aren't comfortable with public speaking or might be tired from a long day of work. A councilman ... Dean Eggert, told me: patiently listen to every speaker who comes before council, and don't be swayed by their emotions or appearance, but truly listen for the heart of their message."

On this note, he said the next mayor must demonstrate a commitment to community service, empathize with residents and be firm in their conviction to move council forward on thorny issues. They also must be trustworthy — a role model for children and someone seniors can count on, too.

"These principles have informed my career as an elected leader and will continue as I assume the bench as the next district court judge," Hartwell said. "Service. Empathy. Leadership. Trust. Fairness. When the governor called me to appoint me as judge, she said that she selected me over the other candidates for these simple values: humility and service to others."

Madison Heights City Councilman Mark Bliss wished Hartwell well on his judgeship.

"Back when I was elected seven years ago, Brian's was the first call I received," Bliss said. "He congratulated me and immediately asked how he could help me make ITAC (Information Technology Advisory Committee) a reality. Before I was even sworn in, he was helping me craft policy, and that continued up until his last meeting. That type of collaborative leadership is what made him

a great mayor and allowed us to accomplish all that we did as a council.

"It was an absolute honor to serve our city with Mayor Hartwell," he said. "I'm so proud of him for getting this appointment and serving us in a new way as district court judge."

The Department of State (Department) has received a formal complaint alleging violations of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 *et seq.* A copy of the complaint and supporting documentation is enclosed with this letter.

The complaint was submitted to the Department by Reese Scripture on August 4, 2020 and alleges that you have made improper expenditures from your Mayoral committee. Specifically, she alleges that the expenditures made do not qualify as incidental office expenses as that term is defined by the Act since they were dated after you had been appointed District Judge and that you improperly disbursed funds pursuant to section 45.

While still an expenditure, an incidental office expense is "an expenditure that is an ordinary and necessary expense, paid or incurred in carrying out the business of an elective office." MCL 169.209(1) (emphasis added). The MCFA does not allow a candidate committee to make disbursements for incidental office expenses unless the candidate actually holds elective office. MCL 169.221a(1). All incidental office expenses are expenditures, but not all expenditures are incidental office expenses. To qualify as an incidental office expense, the expenditure must be one of the 16 outlined categories.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true. The investigation and resolution of this complaint is governed by section 15 of the Act and the corresponding administrative rules, R 169.51 *et seq*. An explanation of the investigation process is enclosed with this letter and a copy is available on the Department's website.

If you wish to file a written response to this complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your answer will be provided to Ms. Scripture, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 33(11) of the Act.

RESPONSE OF BRIAN HARTWELL

On August 4, 2020, the Michigan Bureau of Elections received a Campaign Finance Complaint Form signed by Reese K. Scripture, 148 Park Drive, Clawson, MI 48017, alleging violations of section 45 of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act, MCL 169.245, by the Committee to Elect Brian Hartwell and, individually, Brian Hartwell, the former mayor of the City Madison Heights, and, currently, a judge of the 43rd District Court. Specifically, Ms. Scripture identifies five groups of expenditures as the basis of her complaint.

- 1. April 2, 2020: postage stamps, \$3,700
- 2. April 8, 2020; face masks, \$1,200
- 3. April 15, 2020: printing of envelopes and postcards, \$6,073.87
- 4. June 9, 2020: laptop, \$1,801.99
- 5. Various refunds to past contributors

Expenditures (1) through (4) were ordinary and necessary expenses made while Brian Hartwell was the acting mayor of the City of Madison Heights while carrying out the business of mayor in compliance with the provisions of MCL 169.209. Expenditures (5) were authorized refunds of unexpended funds and were returned to contributors in compliance with MCL 169.245.

Brian Hartwell served as the mayor from 7:35PM November 9, 2015 until 12:20PM on June 9, 2020, when, at that time, he took the oath of office to serve as judge of the 43rd District Court for a governor-appointed term expiring January 1, 2021. Brian Hartwell was the mayor until the moment he accepted the oath of office for judge. There was no lapse in service between the two offices (see attached copy of resignation letter). As an aside, if Brian Hartwell fails to win the 2020 general election to hold his incumbent seat as district court judge, he intends on running for re-election as mayor in a special election or general election in 2021.

(1)

Under MCL 169.209(1)(a), postage stamps are an allowable incidental expense because they are ordinary and necessary to communicate with constituents. The stamps were purchased while Brian Hartwell was the acting mayor to deliver two messages to constituents.

The first message was about public health during the pandemic. The public health message included a stamped envelope from the mayor, a note card signed by the mayor, and a face mask (see attached copies). The health packages were sent to households with vulnerable senior citizens and children.

The second message was about the government's response to the industrial contamination disaster at a private business on the 10 Mile Road border of the Cities of Madison Heights and Hazel Park. This public safety message assured residents that the contamination was under

control and that government was working effectively to manage the site. This message was printed on a stamped postcard from the mayor (see attached copies).

(2)

Under MCL 169.209(1)(a), face masks during a global coronavirus pandemic and local state of emergency are allowable incidental expenditures because they are ordinary and necessary to assist and serve constituents, especially vulnerable senior citizens and young children. The face masks were purchased from an organization called Formosa Group. The complainant raises questions about Brian Hartwell's connection to this company. Brian Hartwell, a former solo practice attorney in the area of business and nonprofit planning, was hired as a private attorney to draft and file this organization's formation paperwork. Aside from being the attorney hired for a limited purpose of drafting documents, Brian Hartwell is not an owner or operator of this organization.

(3)

Under MCL 169.209(1)(a), printing of envelopes and postcards is an allowable incidental expense because printing is ordinary and necessary to communicate with constituents (see the above responses and attached copies).

(4)

Under MCL 169.209(1)(b), a laptop computer is an allowable incidental expense because it is an expenditure for equipment, furnishings, or supplies for the office of the public official. During the pandemic, Brian Hartwell was working from home. Neither his city-issued computer (failed in April 2020) nor personal laptop (failed in January 2020) worked for extended periods of time during 2020. Brian Hartwell sometimes used his telephone to participate in city meetings including a meeting of regional mayors where Ms. Scripture participated, other times borrowing computers. This was unsustainable. During the morning of June 9, 2020, while Brian Hartwell was the acting Mayor of Madison Heights, he purchased a laptop computer in fulfillment of his remaining mayoral duties including communicating with constituents.

(5)

Under MCL 169.245(2)(c), unexpended funds of a candidate committee may be returned to the contributors of those funds. The Committee to Elect Brian Hartwell returned funds to a handful of contributors.

Summary

The Committee to Elect Brian Hartwell made various expenditures during 2020. All expenditures in question were authorized under the Michigan Campaign Finance Act as either MCL 169.209 incidental expenses or MCL 169.245 refunds to contributors. Based on the foregoing and the attachments, there is no violation of the Act as alleged by Ms. Scripture. This response satisfies Brian Hartwell's obligations to fully and accurately respond to the allegations. Therefore, Brian Hartwell requests that the Secretary of State issue a notice dismissing the complaint for no violation of the Act and take no further enforcement action.

Dear Judge Hartwell:

The Department of State (Department) has concluded its investigation of the complaint filed by Reese Scripture against you, which alleged that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 *et seq*. This letter concerns the disposition of Ms. Scripture's complaint.

The complaint was filed on August 4, 2020 and alleged that the Committee to Elect Brian Hartwell for Mayor of Madison Heights (Committee) improperly used candidate committee funds to make incidental office expenses. Ms. Scripture alleged that you made improper expenditures from your mayoral committee. Specifically, she alleged that expenditures made between April 2, 2020 and June 9, 2020 do not qualify as incidental office expenses as that term is defined by the Act since they were dated after you had formed a candidate committee for the 43rd District Court Judge office, and that you improperly disbursed funds pursuant to section 45. The expenditures in question include:

- 1. \$3,700.00 for postage stamps on April 2, 2020
- 2. \$1,200.00 for face masks on April 8, 2020
- 3. \$6,073.87 for the printing of envelopes and postcards on April 15, 2020
- 4. \$1,801.99 for a laptop on June 9, 2020
- 5. \$325.82 in reimbursements to various contributors on June 9, 2020

Finally, Ms. Scripture alleged that you may have improperly expended funds to the Formosa Group LLC (Formosa), because you were listed as the resident agent of Formosa at the time the expenditure was made.

In your response you asserted that the first four expenditures were ordinary and necessary expenses made while carrying out your business as the acting mayor of the City of Madison Heights. You also stated that the refunds of contributions were allowed under MCL 169.245. Finally, you explained that while you were hired to draft and file Formosa's formation paperwork, you are not an owner or operator of the organization.

You explained that the postage and printing services (expenditures 1 & 3 above) were purchased while you were the acting mayor of Madison Heights to deliver two messages to your constituents. You provided copies of the mailers with your answer. The first appears to contain a face mask as a gift, along with a note to constituents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The second appears to be a postcard containing information regarding the city's response to an industrial disaster. You further explained that the payment for masks included with the first mailer was allowable under MCL 169.209(1)(a) "because they are ordinary and necessary to assist and serve constituents, especially vulnerable senior citizen and young children." Next, you argued that expenditure 4, the purchase of a laptop, was an incidental office expense because it was an expenditure for equipment, furnishings, or office supplies for a public official. Finally, you state that the refund of contributions (expenditure 5) was a lawful disbursement because it represents the refund of contributions.

The MCFA limits the way unexpended funds may be dispersed when a committee is winding down. MCL 169.245. Funds may be transferred from one candidate committee to another under certain circumstances, given to certain types of committees, given to certain tax-exempt charitable organizations, or returned to contributors. Additionally, while holding office, candidates may use committee funds to pay for incidental office expenses. MCL 169.209(1).

While still an expenditure, an incidental office expense is "an expenditure that is an ordinary and necessary expense, paid or incurred in carrying out the business of an elective office." MCL 169.209(1). The MCFA does not allow a candidate committee to make disbursements for incidental office expenses unless the candidate holds an elective office. MCL 169.221a(1). All incidental office expenses are expenditures, but not all expenditures are incidental office expenses. To qualify as an incidental office expense, the expenditure must fall into one of the 16 outlined categories. The Department takes each of the listed expenditures above in turn.

Regarding expenditures 1 & 3, expenditure for postage and printing services, the Department determines the evidence is insufficient to conclude that a violation of the Act has occurred as these purchases qualify as incidental office expenses. MCL 169.209(1)(a) specifically includes "[a] disbursement necessary to . . . communicate with a constituent []" in the definition of an "incidental expense." Because the postage and mailers were sent to constituents while you were still the acting mayor, payment of costs associated with the mailers were proper expenditures under the Act.

Regarding expenditure 2, the Department concludes that the purchase of facemasks qualifies as an incidental office expense. The Act specifically includes "[a] disbursement necessary to assist [or] serve . . .a constituent []" in the definition of an "incidental expense." MCL 169.209(1)(a). Recently, the Department has concluded in a preliminary response to the request for an interpretive statement, that the purchase of facemasks *may* constitute an incidental office expense where it is shown that the purchase is not a personal expense. In determining whether an expenditure is personal in nature, the Department applies the "but-for" test: if the disbursement would not otherwise have occurred but for the status as an officeholder, committee funds may be used.

As applied here, you have indicated that the facemasks were purchased a disbursement to assist and serve a constituent and were not purchased for your own use. The evidence submitted with your response, and the complaint, both support this conclusion. Because the masks were purchased and sent to constituents while you were still the acting mayor, payment of costs associated with the masks were proper expenditures under the Act. ¹

Turning to the fifth expenditure, you have indicated that this disbursement represents refunds of contributions allowed under section 45 of the Act. Upon dissolution, the Act authorizes unexpended funds to be disbursed by returning the funds to the contributors. MCL 169.245(2)(c). You were appointed to District Court Judge for the 43rd District on June 3, 2020 by the Governor. As such, the Act requires you to begin the dissolution process for your mayoral candidate committee. According to the records you supplied in response to the complaint, you issued refunds to five donors totaling \$325.82 on June 9, 2020 and reported the refund as part of the July Quarterly campaign finance statement. Because the refund was issued after your appointment as District Court Judge and while you were in the process of dissolving the committee, the Department concludes that the reimbursement of contributions received are allowable disbursements under section 45 of the Act, and there is no evidence that a potential violation has occurred.

The final allegation surrounds the Committee's purchase of a laptop. While the Department agrees with your assertion that the purchase of a laptop is also an allowable incidental expense under MCL 169.209(1)(b) ("A disbursement for equipment, furnishings, or supplies for the office of the public official []"), any purchase of consumable supplies or permanent assets by the committee remains subject to the Department's rules on asset disposition upon the committee's dissolution. See *Interpretive Statement issued to Christopher L. Rose*, Issued November 2, 1978 ("The Act does not expressly permit usage or retention of these assets and moneys by the candidate for his personal benefit.") Consumable supplies are assets or goods that are intended to be "used up" or discarded. *See Marriam-Webster Dictionary*, https://www.merriam-webster.com/dictionary/consumed; *FTC v. Staples*, 970 F. Supp. 1066, 1073 (D.D.C. 1997). Comparatively, permanent assets are those that are not intended to be discarded. *Id.* The Department considers laptops and computers as permanent assets.

For the purchase of permanent assets, the committee must maintain records of the purchase. Upon dissolution, the items may be sold at fair market value and the funds deposited into the committee's account or donated to a qualifying charity. R. 169.65² Items may also be transferred from a dissolving committee to an eligible committee under § 45 of the Act.

¹ While Ms. Scripture raises questions as to your connections to the company from which the masks were purchased (Formosa), the Department takes you at your word that you were hired as an attorney to draft and file initial documents and that you are not an owner or operator of the organization. No evidence has been provided to the contrary.

² Rule 65 specifically governs the dissolution of assets purchased using Officeholder Expense Funds (OEF). In 1994, the MCFA was amended to eliminate OEFs and replace them with incidental office expenses under one candidate committee. 1994 PA 411.

The Department takes you at your word that you purchased the laptop with your mayoral committee funds to fulfill your remaining mayoral duties the morning of June 9, 2020. However, once you ceased to be the acting mayor and dissolved your committee, the monetary value of the laptop computer should have been disgorged from your mayoral committee. The evidence does not show that you have properly disposed of the laptop under section 45, therefore a potential violation has occurred.

After reaching this conclusion, the Act requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" *Id.* In a separate letter, the Department will send you its offer to informally resolve this complaint.

Please be advised that if the Department is unable to resolve the matter through informal methods, the Department must either conduct an administrative hearing or refer the matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the penalty provided. in MCL 169.215(15). MCL 169.215(10)(a).

This letter concerns the campaign finance complaint filed against you by Reese Scripture, which alleged certain violations of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 et seq.

In her complaint, Ms. Scripture alleged that you dissolved your committee but failed to properly dispose of certain assets (laptop) upon dissolution.

By letter dated March 31, 2021, the Department found that the evidence provided supported a reason to believe that a violation had occurred. As previously indicated, upon reaching this conclusion, the Department is required to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" *Id*.

As part of the informal resolution, the Department asked you to donate the laptop to a 501(c)(3) and provide a receipt to the Department. The requested information was provided to the Department on April 8, 2021.

The Department has reviewed the materials submitted and is satisfied that you complied with the Department's request. Therefore, the Department determines that this formal warning is a sufficient resolution to the complaint. The Department now considers this matter closed and will take no further action against you at this time.

Please be advised that this notice has served to remind you of your obligations under the Act and the Department's administrative rules to dispose of assets upon your committees dissolution, and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act.
