Dear Mr. Cissell:

The Department of State (Department) received a formal complaint filed by Brandy Zink against you, alleging that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on your campaign signs. A copy of the complaint is provided as an enclosure with this letter.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), Mich. Admin. R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(5).

In support of her complaint, Ms. Zink provided a campaign card which states "ANDREW CISSELL Democrat for 27th District VOTE AUG. 5th [,]" and a copy of an ad or flyer which states "Vote Cissell Aug. 5th [.]" It appears that there is no paid-for-by statement on this material.

The Department notes that Ms. Zink's complaint also alleges that your campaign material lacks a "regulated funds" disclaimer and a "not authorized by any candidate committee" disclaimer. However, these disclaimers not required to be printed on material paid for by a candidate committee. MCL 169.247(1), (4).

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true.

If you wish to file a written response to the complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Please include any evidence that reflects any corrective measures you have taken to bring your campaign material into compliance with the MCFA. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan

48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your reply will be provided to Ms. Zink, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 47(5) of the Act.





Sorry for this confusion, but I did correct my mistakes, and none of them were made with my intent or consciousness of the mistakes. When I found them, I corrected them. Thank you for your help and understanding.

Dear Mr. Cissell:

The Department of State (Department) has completed its investigation of the complaint filed against you by Brandy Zink, which alleged that you violated section 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign-related material. This letter concerns the disposition of Ms. Zink's complaint.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(5).

The Act also requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" Id.

Ms. Zink filed her complaint on July 8, 2014, and you filed a written response on August 13, 2014. Ms. Zink did not file a rebuttal statement with the Department.

Ms. Zink alleged that some of your campaign material did not contain a complete and correct paid-for-by statement. In support of her complaint, Ms. Zink provided a campaign card which stated "ANDREW CISSELL Democrat for 27th District VOTE AUG 5th [,]" and copy of an which stated "Vote Cissell Aug. 5th [.]" It appears that there is no paid-for-by statement on this material.

In your response you stated that your February ad mistakenly did not include a paid-for-by statement, but it was corrected in the next issue. You also stated that the campaign card was missing its paid-for-by statement because of an omission by the printer. You further stated that once the error was found, it was corrected. Finally, you assert that while mistakes were made, you corrected them and none of the mistakes were made with intent.

While the Department believes that the evidence tends to show that your campaign material failed to contain a complete paid-for-by statement, section 15(10) of the MCFA requires the

Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods such as a conference, conciliation, or persuasion [.]"

Therefore, the Department issues this warning letter and is advising you that section 47(1) and R 169.36(2) require you to print a complete and accurate identification statement on all campaign materials, consisting of the phrase "paid for by" followed by the full name and address of your committee. Note that all printed materials that refer to an election or your candidacy produced in the future must include this identification statement.

Please be advised that this notice has served to remind you of your obligation under the Act to identify your printed matter, and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act. A knowing violation is a misdemeanor offense and may merit referral to the Attorney General for enforcement action. MCL 169.247(5), 215(10).

The Department now considers this matter closed and will take no further action against you at this time.
