



The Department of State (Department) has received a formal complaint filed against you by Jack Coleman. The complaint alleges that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or ACT) by making expenditures related to your campaign for state representative without reporting those expenditures to the Secretary of State. Specifically, Mr. Coleman claims that your purchase of a booth at the St. Joseph County fair, as well as the purchase of handouts, posters, and banners, are campaign-related expenses that you did not report on your 2021 October Quarterly report.

In Michigan, a candidate committee is required to include on a campaign finance statement "the total amount of expenditures made during the period covered by the campaign statement." MCL 169.226. An expenditure is "a payment, donation, loan, or promise of payment of money or anything of ascertainable monetary value for goods, materials, services, or facilities in assistance of, or in opposition to, the nomination or election of a candidate." MCL. 169.206(1). A knowing omission or under-reporting of an expenditure on a campaign finance statement is punishable by a civil fine of \$1,000 or the unreported or underreported sum, whichever is greater.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and of your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true. The investigation and resolution of this complaint are governed by section 15 of the Act and the corresponding administrative rules, R 169.51 *et seq*. An explanation of the investigation process is enclosed with this letter and a copy is available on the Department's website.

If you wish to file a written response to this complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit.

All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 420 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. Materials should also be sent via email to <u>Elections@Michigan.gov</u> given the ongoing pandemic. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your answers will be provided to Mr. Collins, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred." MCL 169.215(10).

The Department of State (Department) has received a formal complaint filed against you by Jack Coleman alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act). Specifically, the complaint alleges that you made expenditures related to your campaign for state representative without reporting those expenditures to the Secretary of State. Specifically, Mr. Coleman claims that your purchase of a booth at the St. Joseph County fair, as well as the purchase of handouts, posters, and banners, are campaign-related expenses that you did not report on your 2021 October quarterly report. A copy of the complaint is included with this notice.

The Department sent you notice of this complaint on February 9, 2022. That letter informed you that you had 15 business days from the date of the letter to provide a response to the complaint. **As a courtesy, the Department is extending you an opportunity to submit a response within 15 business days of the date of this second notice.** If you do not submit a response within 15 business days of the date of this notice, the Department will have no choice but to adjudicate the complaint based on the facts and allegations included in the complaint alone.

In Michigan, a candidate committee is required to include on a campaign finance statement "the total amount of expenditures made during the period covered by the campaign statement." MCL 169.226. An expenditure is "a payment, donation, loan, or promise of payment of money or anything of ascertainable monetary value for goods, materials, services, or facilities in assistance of, or in opposition to, the nomination or election of a candidate." MCL 169.206(1). A knowing omission or underreporting of an expenditure on a campaign finance statement is punishable by a civil fine of \$1,000 or the unreported or underreported sum, whichever is greater.

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If you wish to file a written response to this complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. Materials may be emailed to BOERegulatory@michigan.gov or mailed to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your answer will be provided to Mr. Coleman, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the penalty provided in section 33(11) of the Act.

Dear Mr. Fracassi:

Prior to filing to run as a candidate for Michigan State Representative, 59th District, I was a candidate for the U.S. House of Representatives, 6th District. The purchase of the fair booth in the amount of \$275 and booth materials in the amount of \$196.09 were reported on the finance statement to the Federal Elections Commission. I have amended my financial statement for the period ending 10/20/2021 to include those expenditures. That amended report has been uploaded and accepted by MERTS. To my knowledge, my campaign is in compliance with all financial statement reporting requirements.

Mr. Coleman's alleges that some of my banners do not have "disclaimers" as required by MCL 169.247; however, the picture he provided does not provide proof of this allegation. My campaign is aware of the identification requirement and endeavors to comply on every campaign item required include an identification statement. My campaign has undergone an inventory of all campaign banners to ensure that they comply with MCL 169.247.

I would respectfully request that the above-referenced complaint be dismissed.

The Department of State (Department) has finished investigating the campaign finance complaint filed against you by Jack Coleman alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act). This letter concerns the disposition of that complaint.

The complaint alleged that made expenditures related to your campaign for state representative without reporting those expenditures to the Secretary of State. Specifically, Mr. Coleman claims that your purchase of a booth at the St. Joseph County fair, as well as the purchase of handouts, posters, and banners, are campaign-related expenses that you did not report on your 2021 October quarterly report.

You responded to the complaint. In your response, you claimed that prior to filing to run as a candidate for state representative, you were a candidate for the United States House of Representatives. As a result, the expenditures in question were reported on a campaign finance statement to the FEC. You then stated that you amended your 2021 October quarterly report filed with the Michigan Secretary of State to reflect those expenditures and included a confirmation of both a MERTS filing and the payment of a late filing fee.

Mr. Coleman did not provide a rebuttal statement.

In Michigan, a candidate committee is required to include on a campaign finance statement "the total amount of expenditures made during the period covered by the campaign statement." MCL 169.226. An expenditure is "a payment, donation, loan, or promise of payment of money or anything of ascertainable monetary value for goods, materials, services, or facilities in assistance of, or in opposition to, the nomination or election of a candidate." MCL 169.206(1). A knowing omission or underreporting of an expenditure on a campaign finance statement is punishable by a civil fine of \$1,000 or the unreported or underreported sum, whichever is greater.

The Department has reviewed the evidence submitted in this matter and finds that the matter has already been resolved through an amended filing and the payment of a late filing fee, the evidence of which is pictured below.
