Dear Senator Lucido:

The Department of State (Department) has received a formal complaint alleging violations of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169.201 et seq. A copy of the complaint and supporting documentation is enclosed with this letter.

The complaint was submitted to the Department by Cardi DeMonaco Jr. on July 21, 2020 and alleges that a billboard you purchased contains an improper paid for by statement because it was paid for by your state representative committee.

The MCFA prohibits candidate committees from making an expenditure or other disbursement except to further the nomination or election of the candidate for which the committee was formed. MCL 169.244(2). A person who knowingly violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment up to 90 days or a fine up to \$1,000, or both. MCL 169.244(5).

Additionally, section 47 and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true. The investigation and resolution of this complaint is governed by section 15 of the Act and the corresponding administrative rules, R 169.51 et seq. An explanation of the investigation process is enclosed with this letter and a copy is available on the Department's website.

If you wish to file a written response to this complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. All materials must be sent to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your answer will be provided to Mr. DeMonaco, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing all of the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the criminal penalty provided in section 44(5) of the Act.

Mr. Fracassi,

I am in receipt of the letter dated July 28th, 2020 in regards to the complaint received by the department made by Cardi DeMonaco Jr. on July 21, 2020. In response, we have prepared this answer along with four attachments. The first is the statement of Mr. Joe Oram, whose company 5 Star Outdoor, LLC, was responsible for the instillation of the billboard questioned in the complaint. The second is the bill and the first check written to 5 Star Outdoor for services preformed, from the CTE Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor. The third attachment is a letter from Mr. Craig Grzech, whose company G-Tek Professional Services was responsible for the production and application of decals to the signs for the campaign. Finally, the fourth attachment is a check to G-Tek Professional Services for the work performed, from the CTE Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor.

In response to the first allegation in the complaint, regarding the billboard placed at Common Road and Groesbeck Highway, 5 Star Outdoor was hired to place those advertisements. 5 Star Outdoor has previously worked for both the CTE Peter J. Lucido for State Representative, and the CTE Peter J. Lucido for State Senate. 5 Star Outdoor was sent the template for the new signs, including the line stating "Paid for by the CTE Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor". It appears that in a mistake by the graphics department, 5 Star Outdoor used a previous template for the billboard at Common Road and Groesbeck Highway. This mistake is not present on the other billboard advertisments installed by 5 Star Outdoor. As soon as this error was made known, 5 Star Outdoor was contacted to fix the erroneous billboard through the use of decals. The billboard will now also read "Paid for by the CTE Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor, 6303 26 Mile Rd., Ste 203, Washington Twp., MI 48094." The candidate and the committee were not aware of this mistake until we received the letter from the Buerau of Elections and Cardi DeMonaco Jr.'s complaint. As soon as the error was found, the campaign has made every effort to fix it immediately.

In response to the second allegation in the complaint, regarding the lawn signs missing the address of the CTE Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor, G-Tek Professional Services was hired to apply decals to the lawn signs in question. The decals were not to cover the part of any sign that contained the address 6303 26 Mile Road, Washington Twp., MI 48094. Upon inspection after receiving the complaint, it appears that some of the lawn sign decals did cover the address. The campaign has immediately contacted G-Tek Professional Services who are working on new decals that do not cover the address and new decals that also have the address to avoid this problem going forward. G-Tek Professional Services was also hired solely by the CTE Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor.

Both MCL § 169.244(5) and MCL § 169.247(6) state that "knowingly" is a requirement of the underlying offense. The attached letters and bills clearly demonstrate that both the allegations contained in the complaint are the byproduct of human error on the companies hired to produce these materials. At no point in time was this known by Candidate Lucido, and it was not done so at his direction. Further, the attached checks and bills show that all labor, billboards, signs, and decals mentioned in the complaint were paid for solely by the CTE Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor.

- 1. My name is Joe Oram, my address is 2187 Orchard Lake Road, West Bloomfield MI 48320.
- My company 5 Star Outdoor LLC was hired by the Committee to Elect Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor to
 oversee the instillation of billboards in Macomb County.
- 3. We have previously been contracted to do similar work for the Committee to Elect Peter J. Lucido for State Representative, as well as the CTE Peter J. Lucido for State Senate.
- 4. Although we were given a new template by the Committee to Elect Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor, the graphics department sent my company the wrong template to use on one of the billboards.
- 5. Upon learning of the incorrect billboard the company is now correcting the error on the billboard.
- 6. This billboard was not paid for by the state representative committee, the error rests solely on the installation of the previous template on accident after being sent the wrong template by the graphics department.

Dear Mr. Kole:

The Department of State (Department) has completed its investigation of the complaints filed against your client, Peter Lucido, by Cardi DeMonaco, Jr., which alleged that Mr. Lucido violated sections 44 and 47(1) of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act), 1976 PA 388, MCL 169. 244 and 169.247(1), by failing to include a complete and correct identification statement on certain campaign materials and paying for a billboard with Mr. Lucido's state representative committee funds. This letter concerns the disposition of Mr. DeMonaco's complaints.

The MCFA prohibits candidate committees from making an expenditure or other disbursement except to further the nomination or election of the candidate for which the committee was formed. MCL 169.244(2). A person who knowingly violates this section sis guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment up to 90 days or a fine up to \$1,000.00, or both. MCL 169.244(5)

Additionally, section 47 and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election to include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

The Act also requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods [,]" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation [.]" Id.

Mr. DeMonaco filed his complaints on July 24 and 28, 2020. You timely filed a written response.

Mr. DeMonaco alleged that one of Mr. Lucido's billboard campaign ads contained an improper paid for by statement, because it was paid for by his state representative committee. Mr. DeMonaco also alleged that the paid for by statement on Mr. Lucido's yard signs failed to include the committee's address.

In your response, you explained that 5 Star Outdoor (5 Star) was hired to place the billboard ad in question, and 5 Star had previously worked with Mr. Lucido's house and senate candidate committees. You indicated that the template sent to the company included the line "Paid for by the CTE Peter J. Lucido for Prosecutor." You asserted that a mistake was made by the graphics department at 5 Star, and as soon as the error was made known, 5 Star fixed the paid for by statement, and included the committee's address. In support of your explanation, you provided a signed statement from Joe Oram, owner of 5 Star. In his statement, Mr. Oram admitted that while they were given a new template to use, the graphics department did, indeed, send the company the wrong template to use on the billboard. He also stated that the billboard was not paid for by Mr. Lucido's state representative committee and that the billboard was being corrected. Additionally, you included a copy of the check from Mr. Lucido's prosecutor committee to 5 Star, showing that the billboard was paid for by the prosecutor committee.

You also explained that G-Tek Professional Services (G-Tek) was hired to apply decals to Mr. Lucido's lawn signs to update the candidate committee name. While the original paid for by statement on the signs included the address of Mr. Lucido's committee, the decals affixed to some of the signs did mistakenly cover up the address as well as the old committee name. You stated that the campaign immediately contacted G-Tek and that G-Tek was working on new decals that do not cover the address and new decals that also included the committee's address to avoid the problem moving forward. In support of your explanation, you provided a signed statement from Craig Grzeck, owner of G-Tek. Mr. Grzeck admitted that G-Tek did, indeed, err when placing the decals by covering up the address. He also stated that G-Tek was working on fixing the error.

Because the errors were outside of the Committee's control and were addressed immediately when he became aware of the situation, the Department dismisses the complaints.

The Department does take this opportunity to remind your client of his obligations under the Act. MCL 169.247(1) and R 169.36(2) requires candidates to print a complete and accurate identification statement on all campaign materials, consisting of the phrase "paid for by" followed by the full name and address of the committee.
