

Dear Ms. Vaughn:

The Department of State (Department) has received a formal complaint alleging you have violated MCL 169.247 of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA) by failing to include an identification statement on a campaign advertisement in the Rochester Post. A photo is included with the complaint; a copy of the complaint is enclosed.

The MCFA and corresponding administrative rules require a person who produces printed material that relates to an election include the phrase "Paid for by [name and address of the person who paid for the item]." MCL 169.247(1), R 169.36(2). A knowing violation constitutes a misdemeanor offense punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.00, imprisonment for up to 93 days, or both. MCL 169.247(6).

Upon review, the evidence submitted supports the conclusion that a potential violation of the Act has occurred. From the outset, the Department must consider whether the materials fall within the ambit of the MCFA. Because the materials explicitly advocate for the election or defeat of a candidate, or for the passage or defeat of a ballot proposal, the materials contain express advocacy as defined by the Act. MCL 169.206(2)(j). As explained above, such materials must contain a "paid for by" statement listing the name and address of the committee purchasing the materials. However, the evidence shows that the materials at issue here omit part or all of that required statement. That absence supports the conclusion that a potential violation of the MCFA has occurred.

After reaching this conclusion, the Act requires the Department to "endeavor to correct the violation or prevent a further violation by using informal methods" if it finds that "there may be reason to believe that a violation ... has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). The objective of an informal resolution is "to correct the violation or prevent a further violation." *Id*.

Given this, the Department concludes that a formal warning is a sufficient resolution to the complaint and is hereby advising you that MCL 169.247(1) and R 169.36(2) require you to print a complete and accurate identification statement on all campaign materials, consisting of the phrase "paid for by" followed by the full name and address of your committee.

Note that all printed materials referencing you or your candidacy produced in the future must include this identification statement. For all materials currently in circulation, the paid for by statement must be corrected. If this information has been included in your materials and you wish to rebut the Department's conclusion, you must respond in writing to the Department at the address below or <a href="mailto:BOERegulatory@michigan.gov">BOERegulatory@michigan.gov</a> within 15 business days of the date of this letter; otherwise the Department will treat the complaint as resolved.

Please be advised that this notice has served to remind you of your obligation under the Act to identify your printed matter and may be used in future proceedings as evidence that tends to establish a knowing violation of the Act. A knowing violation is a misdemeanor offense and may merit referral to the Attorney General for enforcement action. MCL 169.247(6), 215(10).

Mr. Fealk filed it under the wrong address. He used PO Box 70441 and Vote for Andrew Weaver is PO Box 70442. Dennis Talluto and Carol Beth Litkouhi both contacted me and told me that they had received this complaint. Please see his message below. I did not create or place the ad referenced - it is not part of my campaign. I learned that some supporters placed the ad, and the Rochester Post mistakenly cut off the "paid for" disclosure when they first ran the ad on October 6, 2022. Because they made a mistake, the Rochester Post agreed to re-run the ad for free on October 13, 2022, as a courtesy to the supporters. I'm sure the Rochester Post can provide more verification if needed. I have provided some pictures of the ads. Please let

me know if there is anything else I need to do to clear up this matter.

I have included, "Paid for by Vote 4 Andrew Weaver PO Box 70442 Rochester Hills, MI 48308" on all of my written campaign materials.
I am requesting the Warning that was issued be removed as there was no way for me to provide this information before the decision was made.

Dear Mr. Weaver:

The Department of State (Department) is in receipt of your January 5, 2023 email response regarding the complaint filed against you by Bruce Fealk, alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act).

The complaint alleged that you and two other candidates ran an advertisement without including the required disclosure of the name and address of the person paying for the advertisement. Initially, the Department determined that there was reason to believe that that a violation had occurred and issued a warning to all three on October 17, 2022.

Subsequently, the other two candidates responded claiming that they did not place or pay for the advertisement in question, and that it was instead paid for by their supporters. They went on to state that the disclosure was mistakenly cut off of the advertisement by the newspaper, the Rochester Post, and that the newspaper re-ran the advertisement—including the disclosure—free of charge to correct the mistake. Finally, they submitted copies of the advertisements that ran in the newspaper on October 6, 2022 and October 13, 2022. Accordingly, the Department retracted its warning to the other two candidates.

Because the Department did not receive a response from you, the Department's warning to you was posted to its website in accordance with the Act. MCL 169.215(10). However, in your January 5 email you explain that the address indicated on the complaint as the address for your campaign committee was incorrect, and that you did not receive the warning. You further state that, as was the case for the other two candidates, the advertisement was not placed by you and the disclosure was inadvertently cut off.

Unfortunately, your email was sent to the Department's junk mail folder and was only discovered on February 28, 2023.

Upon review of the evidence submitted in this matter, the Department finds that insufficient evidence has been presented to support a finding of a potential violation of the MCFA. The October 13, 2022 advertisement submitted by you does include a disclosure that the advertisement was paid for by Baggot and Fashho, PIC. While the advertisement does not show an address, that omission is not on your part.

Because the violation of the MCFA alleged in the complaint has not been substantiated by sufficient evidence, the Department dismisses the complaint and will take no further enforcement action. If you have any questions concerning this matter, you may contact me at BOERegulatory@michigan.gov.
