The Department of State (Department) has finished investigating the campaign finance complaint filed against you by Richard Briand on April 3, 2023. The complaint alleges you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act) by failing to report expenditures for fundraisers in furtherance of your campaign for Sheriff of Berrien County and the complaint cites a fundraiser conducted on or about June 24, 2022.

You responded to the complaint on April 25, 2023. In your response you indicated that you opened a campaign committee "Chuck Heit for Sheriff" on May 4, 2022. You also provided a copy of the signed and file stamped statement of organization form, dated May 4, 2022, with your response. In addition, you provided a copy of the campaign reports filed by the campaign committee with the Berrien County Clerk's Office in July 2022, October 2022, and January 2023.

Mr. Briand was notified of your response on May 1, 2023, but did not provide a rebuttal.

In Michigan the Act, Section 24 requires committees to file a statement of organization with the proper filing official within 10 days after the committee is formed. MCL 169.224(1). Section 24 details specific requirements for all statements of organization that must be filed. See MCL 169.224(2)-(3). Section 21 provides the requirements for formation of a candidate committee. MCL 169.221. A person who fails to file a timely statement is subject to a civil fine of up to \$1,000. MCL 169.221(13). A person who fails to file a statement of organization shall pay a late filing fee of \$10 per business day the report is not filed, not to exceed \$300. MCL 169.224(1). A person failing to file a statement of organization after 30 days is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000. *Id*.

By statutory definition, a candidate committee is designated in the candidate's filed statement of organization. An individual must form a candidate committee if the individual becomes a candidate. MCL 169.203(2). A committee must be formed if contributions received or expenditures made total \$500 or more in a calendar year.

The MCFA requires that candidates and committees record the full name, street address, amount contributed, and date of contribution for each individual from whom contributions are received. MCL 169.226(1)(e). Additionally, the following information regarding each fundraising event must be included in the report:

- The type of event, date held, address and name, if any, of the place where the activity was held, and approximate number of individuals participating or in attendance.
- The total amount of all contributions.
- The gross receipts of the fundraising event.
- The expenditures incident to the event.

MCL 169.226(1)(d).

The Department concludes that you have submitted sufficient evidence to rebut the possibility that you violated the MCFA by failing to report expenditures for fundraisers in furtherance of your campaign for Sheriff of Berrien County. Specifically, the Department finds that your campaign committee, Chuck Heit for Sheriff, filed a statement of organization Form on May 4, 2022, more than a month and a half before the fundraiser cited in the complaint. The Department also finds that the committee timely filed appropriate campaign reports detailing the contributions and expenditures made by the committee. Specifically, you submitted in your July 2022 quarterly report fundraiser schedule 1F for a golf outing fundraiser held on June 24, 2022, which is the fundraiser that was the subject of the complaint. Finally, Mr. Briand did not rebut your statement by providing any evidence indicating that your campaign received contributions or made expenditures in excess of \$500 prior to filing a statement of organization.

As such, the Department dismisses the Section 24 and Section 26 allegations contained in the complaint and considers this matter concluded.
