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169.233 - Not filing financial statements/reporting after passing \$1,000 in spending and again by 10/28/22

Explain how those sections were violated:

Daniel Sherwood, Byron Center school board candidate, spent significantly more than \$1,000 on his campaign and did not submit required financial reports disclosing his expenditures and income sources. According to Kent County Clerk's Office, reports should have been filed once the \$1,000 limit was surpassed and again by 10/28/22 to fully disclose to voters where these campaign funds were coming from.

In addition to yard signs, which would have pushed the campaign past the \$1,000 reporting threshold by early October, this candidate's campaign materials included a two-sided full color fiver that was included in a bag of GOP flyers given out door to door in Byron Center and a two sided full color postcard that was mailed to every household in Byron Center, arriving in mailboxes 11/4/22. Additionally, many households in BC received campaign texts from this campaign on 11/7 and 11/8. I'm unsure of how much those cost or how they acquired that list.

- yard signs - 200x\$5-\$6/sign = \$1,000-\$1,200 per candidate

- postcards mailed to 20,000+ households = conservative guess of \$10,000 (cost shared among 3 candidates), cost of printing, preparing for bulk mail, postage

- postcards included in GOP bag for door to door = conservative guess of \$2,000-\$3,000, depending on quantity - texts to majority of BC voters = no idea how much this costs

Evidence that supports those allegations (attach copies of pertinent documents and other information):

Attached are screen captures of quantity of yard signs produced, images of full color flyer included in canvassing bag with other political party affiliates, the mass mailed flyer to all households in Byron Center, and a screen capture of the texts sent to a mjaority of Byron Center voters.



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



The Department of State (Department) has received a formal complaint filed against you by Christie Koester alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act). Specifically, the complaint alleges that you have not filed the appropriate financial statements after spending more than \$1,000 in expenditures on yard signs, two-sided full color postcards, and two-sided full color fliers. A copy of the complaint is included with this notice.

The MCFA requires committees file contributions and expenditures with the appropriate filing official by specific dates. MCL 169.233(1) - (3). The Act requires a committee that receives or expends more than \$1,000 during any election to file campaign finance reports in compliance with the act. MCL 16.233(6). A person who knowingly omits or underreports expenditures required to be disclosed by the Act is subject to a civil fine of not more than \$1,000 or the amount of the expenditures omitted or underreported, whichever is greater. MCL 169.233(1).

The Department has independently verified that, as of December 1, 2022, no campaign finance statements have been filed or posted on the Kent County campaign finance website.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true. The investigation and resolution of this complaint is governed by section 15 of the Act and the corresponding administrative rules, R 169.51 *et seq.* An explanation of the process is included in the enclosed guidebook.

If you wish to file a written response to this complaint, you are required to do so within 15 business days of the date of this letter. Your response may include any written statement or additional documentary evidence you wish to submit. Materials may be emailed to BOERegulatory@michigan.gov or mailed to the Department of State, Bureau of Elections, Richard H. Austin Building, 1st Floor, 430 West Allegan Street, Lansing, Michigan 48918. If you

fail to submit a response, the Department will render a decision based on the evidence furnished by the complainant.

A copy of your answer will be provided to Ms. Koester, who will have an opportunity to submit a rebuttal statement to the Department. After reviewing the statements and materials provided by the parties, the Department will determine whether "there may be reason to believe that a violation of [the MCFA] has occurred [.]" MCL 169.215(10). Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement of the penalty provided in section 33(11) of the Act.

The Department of State (Department) has received a formal complaint filed against you by Christie Koester alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act). Specifically, the complaint alleges that you have not filed the appropriate financial statements after spending more than \$1,000 in expenditures on yard signs, two-sided full color postcards, and two-sided full color fliers. A copy of the complaint is included with this notice.

The Department sent you notice of this complaint on December 14, 2022. That letter informed you that you had 15 business days from that date to provide a response to the complaint. As a courtesy, the Department is extending you an opportunity to submit a response within 15 business days of the date of this second notice. If you do not submit a response within 15 business days of the date of this notice, the Department will have no choice but to adjudicate the complaint based on the facts and allegations included in the complaint alone.

The MCFA requires committees file contributions and expenditures with the appropriate filing official by specific dates. MCL 169.233(1) - (3). The Act requires a committee that receives or expends more than \$1,000 during any election to file campaign finance reports in compliance with the act. MCL 16.233(6). A person who knowingly omits or underreports expenditures required to be disclosed by the Act is subject to a civil fine of not more than \$1,000 or the amount of the expenditures omitted or underreported, whichever is greater. MCL 169.233(1).

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of the Department's examination of these matters and your right to respond to the allegations before the Department proceeds further. It is important to understand that the Department is neither making this complaint nor accepting the allegations as true. Note that the Department's enforcement powers include the possibility of entering a conciliation agreement, conducting an administrative hearing, or referring this matter to the Attorney General for enforcement.

Dear Mr. Sherwood:

The Department of State (Department) has finished investigating the campaign finance complaint filed against you by Christie Koester alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act). This letter concerns the disposition of that complaint.

The complaint alleged that you did not file the appropriate financial statements after spending more than \$1,000 in expenditures on yard signs, two-sided full color postcards, and two-sided full color fliers in support of your candidacy.

You were sent a notice of the complaint on December 14, 2022. A second notice was sent to you via certified mail on January 25, 2023. To date, no response has been received. In the absence of a response to the allegations, the Department proceeds to the determination stage with only the evidence provided by the complainant.

The MCFA requires committees to file reports of contributions and expenditures with the appropriate filing official by specific dates. MCL 169.233(1) - (3). The Act requires a committee that receives or expends more than \$1,000 during any election to file campaign finance reports in compliance with the act. MCL 16.233(6). A person who knowingly omits or underreports expenditures required to be disclosed by the Act is subject to a civil fine of not more than \$1,000 or the amount of the expenditures omitted or underreported, whichever is greater. MCL 169.233(11).

The Department has independently reviewed the Kent County Campaign Finance website. When you filed your statement of organization on July 26, 2022, you indicated that you were applying for the reporting waiver, which means that you are not subject to reporting requirements as long as you do not spend or receive more than \$1,000 in the election. You have not subsequently submitted any campaign finance statements.

In her complaint, Ms. Koester indicated that you and two other candidates collaborated on a twosided full-color flyer that was given out door-to-door in Byron Center, a two-sided full-color postcard that was mailed to every household in Byron Center, and yard signs. She included pictures of these items in her complaint. Ms. Koester alleged that these expenditures would have amounted to more than the \$1,000 amount that you indicated that you would not exceed. Indeed, the other two candidates, Amber Swift and Thalia Tilma, each indicated that they spent \$1472.27 on these items.

The Department has reviewed the evidence submitted in this matter and finds that sufficient evidence has been presented to support a finding of a potential violation of the MCFA. Because your expenditures likely exceeded the \$1,000 waiver threshold, you were required to submit campaign finance statements from the time you exceeded the threshold. You have not done so. You are instructed to submit required statements to your filing official, the Kent County Clerk, and to pay any attendant late filing fees.

This letter serves to notify you that the Department has determined there may be reason to believe that you have violated the Act and to notify you that the Department is beginning the informal resolution process. "If, after 90 business days, the secretary of state is unable to correct or prevent further violation by these informal methods, the secretary of state shall do either of the following:

(a) Refer the matter to the attorney general for the enforcement of any criminal penalty provided by this act.

(b) Commence a hearing as provided in subsection (11) for enforcement of any civil violation."

MCL 169.215(11).

Upon submission of evidence that you have submitted your reports and paid any late fees, the Department will consider this matter concluded. If you have not done so before July 6, 2023, the Department will have no choice but to refer the matter to the Department of Attorney General for enforcement.
