169.233 - Not filing financial statements/reporting after passing \$1,000 in spending and again by 10/28/22

Explain how those sections were violated:

Thalia Tilma, Byron Center school board candidate, spent significantly more than \$1,000 on her campaign and did not submit required financial reports disclosing expenditures and income sources. According to Kent County Clerk's Office, reports should have been filed once the \$1,000 limit was surpassed and again by 10/28/22 to fully disclose to voters where these campaign funds were coming from.

In addition to yard signs, which would have pushed the campaign past the \$1,000 reporting threshold by early October, this candidate's campaign materials included a two-sided full color flyer that was included in a bag of GOP flyers given out door to door in Byron Center and a two sided full color postcard that was malled to every household in Byron Center, arriving in mailboxes 11/4/22. Additionally, many households in BC received campaign texts from this campaign on 11/7 and 11/8. I'm unsure of how much those cost or how they acquired that list.

- yard signs - 200x\$5-\$6/sign = \$1,000-\$1,200 per candidate

- postcards mailed to 20,000+ households = conservative guess of \$10,000 (cost shared among 3 candidates), cost of printing, preparing for bulk mail, postage

postcards included in GOP bag for door to door = conservative guess of \$2,000-\$3,000, depending on quantity
texts to majority of BC voters = no idea how much this costs

Evidence that supports those allegations (attach copies of pertinent documents and other information):

Attached are screen captures of quantity of yard signs produced, images of full color flyer included in canvassing bag with other political party affiliates, the mass mailed flyer to all households in Byron Center, and a screen capture of the texts sent to a mjaority of Byron Center voters.


Good day family, friends and fellow Byron Center neighbors.

#### Good morning.

I received the candidate's response and noted there were updated campaign finance documents submitted on 12/7/22. I am questioning the expense for the full color, large postcards mailed to every household in Byron Center, postage for those many thousands of postcards, additional postcards printed and included in GOP literature, and texts sent to every area number (listed as \$1,472.27). Another candidate also indicated that she and the two candidates creating these postcards together used an external graphic designer to design their postcards, and I am not seeing that expense or inkind donation listed, either.

As a voter, I expected to be able to see how much our candidates spent by election day on their campaigns, as is required by campaign finance law, and who contributed to each campaign. Unfortunately, this candidate did not make this possible, and I hope the Department of State considers this carefully when reviewing and considering appropriate fines.

Dear Ms. Tilma:

The Department of State (Department) has finished investigating the campaign finance complaint filed against you by Christie Koester alleging that you violated the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA or Act). This letter concerns the disposition of that complaint.

The complaint alleged that you did not file the appropriate financial statements after spending more than \$1,000 in expenditures on yard signs, two-sided full color postcards, and two-sided full color fliers in support of your candidacy.

You responded to the complaint by email on December 23, 2022. In your response, you stated that you filed the appropriate paperwork as of December 7, 2022. You indicated that you went in, presumably to the Kent County Clerk's office, on December 22, 2022 and that to the best of your knowledge it was done correctly

Ms. Koester provided a rebuttal to your response in an email dated January 9, 2023. In that statement, she noted that there were indeed updated campaign finance documents submitted on December 7, 2022. However, she questioned the expenses you disclosed in your reports. She argued that the \$1,472 you reported for the "full color, large postcards mailed to every household in Byron Center, postage for those many thousands of postcards, additional postcards printed and included in GOP literature, and texts sent to every area number" was too low.

Further, she stated that she expects to be able to assess how much candidates spend on their elections and she feels that you deprived her of that ability.

The MCFA requires committees file contributions and expenditures with the appropriate filing official by specific dates. MCL 169.233(1) - (3). The Act requires a committee that receives or expends more than \$1,000 during any election to file campaign finance reports in compliance with the act. MCL 16.233(6). A person who knowingly omits or underreports expenditures

required to be disclosed by the Act is subject to a civil fine of not more than \$1,000 or the amount of the expenditures omitted or underreported, whichever is greater. MCL 169.233(11).

The Department has independently reviewed the Kent County Campaign Finance website. When you filed your statement of organization on February 17, 2022, you indicated that you were applying for the reporting waiver, which means that you are not subject to reporting requirements as long as you do not spend or receive more than \$1,000 in the election. Because there is no indication that you spent or received more than \$1,000 during the pre-general reporting period, you were not required to file a pre-general statement. You filed your post-election statement on December 7, 2022, ahead of the December 8, 2022 due date. In that statement, you reported that you received contributions of \$500 and in-kind contributions from yourself of \$1,253.56, triggering the reporting requirement. You subsequently filed your annual statement on December 22, 2022, ahead of the January 31, 2023 due date.

Upon review of the evidence submitted, the Department and finds that insufficient evidence has been presented to support a finding of a potential violation of the MCFA. You have filed all required statements, and have disclosed the expenditures referenced in the complaint. Accordingly, the Department dismisses the complaint and will take no further enforcement action. If you have any questions concerning this matter, you may contact me at BOERegulatory@Michigan.gov.
