**SUBJECT:** Adjustments per Section 46 of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCL 169.246)

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 46 of the Michigan Campaign Finance Act (MCFA), the following is provided:

1. An adjustment to the contribution limits specified in sections 52, 52a and 69(1). The adjustments are effective January 1, 2023, for a period of 4 years.
2. A review of the current threshold for reporting the occupation and employer information of a contributor. These figures are not legislative recommendations.

With this memo the results of that review and adjustments are announced in accordance with the provisions of Section 46.

**1. Contribution Limits**

**2. Occupation and Employer Threshold Review**

Current threshold for Reporting Occupation and Employer information	2020 CPI	Voters & 2020 CPI
\$100.00*	\$180.96	\$215.62

\*The threshold remains at \$100.00 per the MCFA. (MCL 169.226, 169.228, 169.242)

The first column of figures—Current threshold—is the dollar amount included in current law. The second column—2020 CPI—reflects the current amount adjusted by the consumer price index (CPI). The third column—Voters & 2020 CPI—reflects the current amount adjusted by the number of registered voters as well as the change in the CPI.
