Registering to vote on Election Day

Michigan law allows same-day voter registration. You can register to vote and vote in person at any time up to 8 p.m. on Election Day at your city or township clerk's office.

You'll need to bring your proof of eligibility and residency:

Proof of eligibility:

To be eligible to register to vote you must be:

- A Michigan resident (at the time you register) and a resident of your city or township for at least 30 days (when you vote)
- A United States citizen
- At least 18 years of age (when you vote)
- Not currently serving a sentence in jail or prison

Proof of residency:

You must show proof of where you live. Documents must have your name and current address. You can show a digital copy of documents. Acceptable documents include:

- Michigan driver's license or state ID
- Current utility bill
- Bank statement
- Paycheck or government check
- Other government document
