

Registering to vote

You can register to vote in Michigan if you are:

- A United States citizen
- Michigan resident for at least 30 days
- 17.5 years of age and 18 by Election Day to vote (eligible 16 and 17-year-olds can pre-register to vote)
- Not currently serving a sentence in jail or prison

Vote your way: Your options for casting a ballot in Michigan

- **Vote by mail:** Request an absentee ballot be mailed to your home for easy and convenient voting. Apply for an absentee ballot online at Michigan.gov/Vote or download a translated application at Michigan.gov/SOSLanguageForms.
- **Vote early in person:** Visit an early vote site near you to cast a ballot early and in-person. Early voting for November begins statewide October 26 through November 3.
- **Vote on Election Day:** Visit a polling place near you to cast your ballot on Election Day.

Your voting rights in Michigan

- **Interpretation at the polls:** You have the right to bring an interpreter to assist you when voting. Your interpreter cannot influence your vote, be your employer, an agent of your employer, or an officer or agent of your labor union.
- **No photo ID required:** If you do not have a picture ID with you, you can still cast a ballot.
- **Returning citizens:** In Michigan individuals with a past conviction are still eligible to register and vote, even if they are on parole or probation.
