

How to request an absentee ballot – Aug. 2

You can vote from home in the August 2nd primary election with an absentee ballot.

To apply, simply go to **Michigan.gov/Vote** and confirm your identity with some personal information including your driver's license or state ID number.

Hit the button to submit your application and wait for your ballot to arrive in the mail.

There are other ways you can apply as well.

You can print an application at **Michigan.gov/Vote**, fill it out and sign it, and then take a photo of it and email it to your clerk or mail or bring it to their office.

If you go to your clerk's office **between June 23rd and 4 p.m. on August 1st**, you can both apply and vote while you're there and be done in one trip.

You can find your clerk's address and phone number at **Michigan.gov/Vote**.

If you apply to have your ballot sent to you, you can track your ballot at **Michigan.gov/Vote** and see when the clerk has received your application and issued your ballot.

Whichever option you choose to submit your application, please do so at your earliest opportunity. The sooner voters let their clerks know they want to vote absentee, the smoother the election will go for everyone.
